DANVILLE, KY.—The "Praying Colonels" of Centre College have but one game standing between them and their annual struggle with Harvard at the Harvard Stadium. Those fighting lads from Kentucky headed by "Bo" McMillin tasted of the sweet cup last season by beating Harvard by a single touchdown. Centre held a clean record through-out the '21 season and lost but one game in their post-season games, and that with the Texas A. & M.

Coach Charlie Moran's charges scored 154 points to their opponents' 6 last season. This year they have accumulated 148 points to their opponents' 0. Next Saturday the "Colonels" play Virginia Poly Tech. and Capt. "Red" Roberts, the All-American '21 end, of Centre, is counting on their scoring to justify the phrase "point-a-minute Centre." "Hit 'em hard, hit 'em low; beat Harvard, let's go."

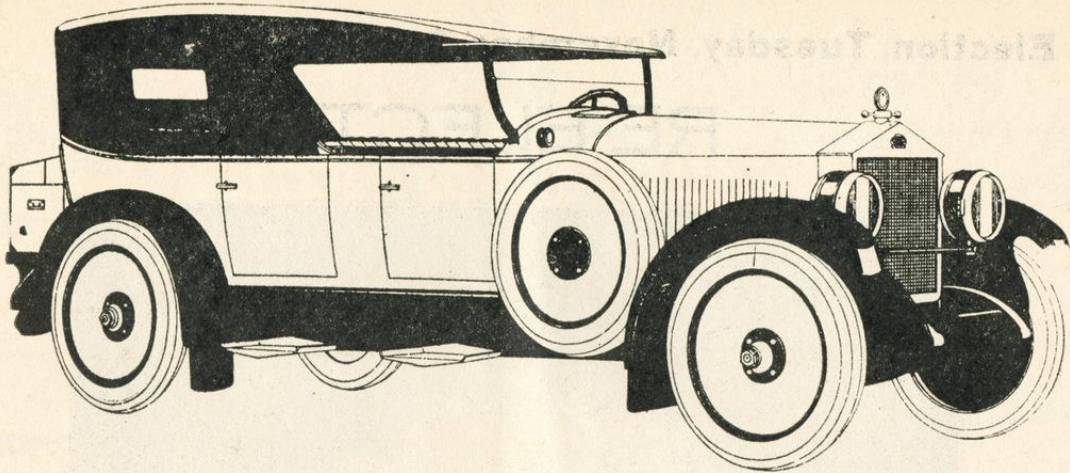

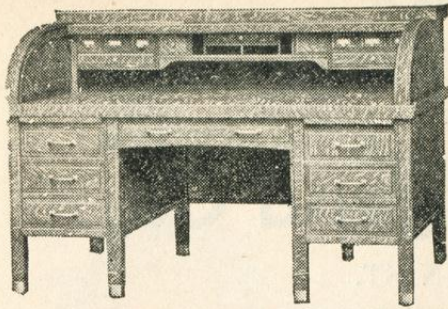

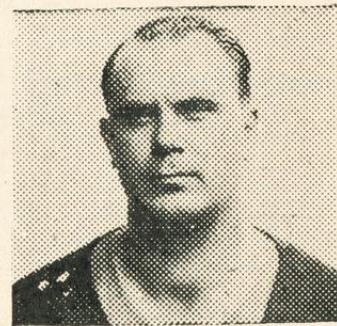

1922 RULES THAT STAND CORRECTED OVER 1921

Relating to substitution, a player taken out in one half cannot return in the same half, but a player who has been taken out in the first half may return to the game in the second half, not necessarily at the beginning of a period.

The Referee is permitted by a change in the rule to shorten the playing time at intermission, should he decide that darkness is likely to interfere with the completion of the game.

YOU SEE, IT'S THIS WAY—

(A few questions about the game answered briefly.)

DUTIES OF OFFICIALS

The Referee has general oversight and control of the game. He starts the game, and is the man who sees that the ball is properly put into play every time that time is taken out. He is the authority for the score. It is his duty to see that the men keep their positions, and to be on the watch for unfair play.

The Umpire stands behind the defending line. He signals fouls, authorizes substitutions, and watches for any unfair interference with play. Rulings as to off-side come within his province.

The Linesman, on the side-lines, with his two assistants, marks distances gained or lost in the progress of play. He designates the position of the ball on each down.

The Field Judge is an assistant to the other officials. He keeps time, and notifies the captains as to the amount of time left for play.

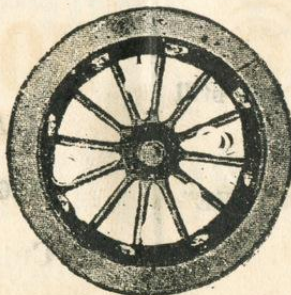

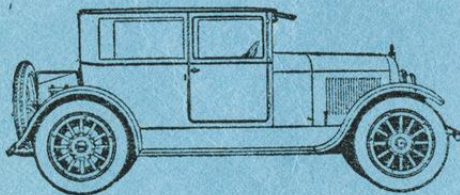
