Going to Illinois he held an end job on Zuppke's teams in 1915, 1916 and 1917. In 1918 Halas was a member of the famous Great Lakes eleven, which traveled from coast to coast, beating such teams as Annapolis, Rutgers and Mare Island. In 1919 he was with the Hammond, Ind., team, and went to the Staleys in 1920, remaining with them since their name has been changed to the Chicago Bears. Halas plays right end and is one of the coaches of the team.

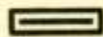

Milt is a new man with the Bears, coming to us from the Racine team, where he played quarter and captained the team. Prior to this he coached the University of Texas in 1922 and 1923, where he had considerable success. Milt's first experience in football was with East Salt Lake High School, where he played from 1914 to 1918, being captain in 1917 and 1918. He then captained and played quarter for the University of Utah in 1919, the year they won the Rocky Mountain championship. In 1920 he played on the freshman varsity at Chicago, and the next year on the varsity. He was elected captain for the 1922 team but was declared ineligible because of a three year ruling. Romney is a student of football and can play the backfield positions with ease.

PENALTIES

Five Yards—Offside by defense or offense (from line of scrimmage or from kick off). After distance penalty is enforced down and point to be gained remains the same.

Fifteen Yards—Holding by offense—down does not change.

Five Yards—Running into kicker.

Fifteen Yards—Roughing the kicker.

Twenty-five Yards—Clipping (throwing the body from behind across the legs of a player. Penalty enforced from spot of foul).

Loss of Down—Incomplete pass; any illegal pass.

Loss of 15 Yards and a Down—For the side making forward pass interfering with an opponent who is attempting to intercept the pass.

Interference by Defensive Player with an eligible player about to receive a pass results in giving the ball to the offensive at the point of foul.

Loss of Ball—Illegal offensive player touching forward pass before it hits the ground or is touched by defensive player. Ball goes to opponents at spot of previous down. If occurring inside of 10 yard line, it may be touchback, and is given to defensive team on its 20 yard line.

Five Yards—For more than four time-outs per half. (The first four time-outs to count regardless of cause of suspension of playing time, or any

unnecessary delay of game).

Fifteen Yards—For interfering with a player who has chance to make a "Fair Catch"; or for tackling the player after he has made Fair Catch; (Fair Catch also allowed).

Five Yards—If player making Fair Catch takes more than two steps and scrimmage is to follow.

Disqualifications—Plus half distance from spot of foul to goal line. For slugging, kicking, kneeling or any other similar conduct.

Fifteen Yards—Pushing, pulling, pile up, tripping, or unsportsmanlike conduct.

Five Yards—For player of offensive in motion before ball is snapped—except one man, who can be in motion but not toward opponent's goal, and he must be five yards back of line of scrimmage when ball is snapped. (Offense must have at least seven men on line of scrimmage when ball is snapped).

Loss of Ball—If foul committed when neither side is in possession of ball, it goes to offended side at spot of foul.

If Offense Commits a Foul during try for point after touch down—goal disallowed; if foul is committed by defense—point awarded.

Five Yards—Substitute not reporting.

Fifteen Yards—Substitute talking after having reported before ball is put in play.

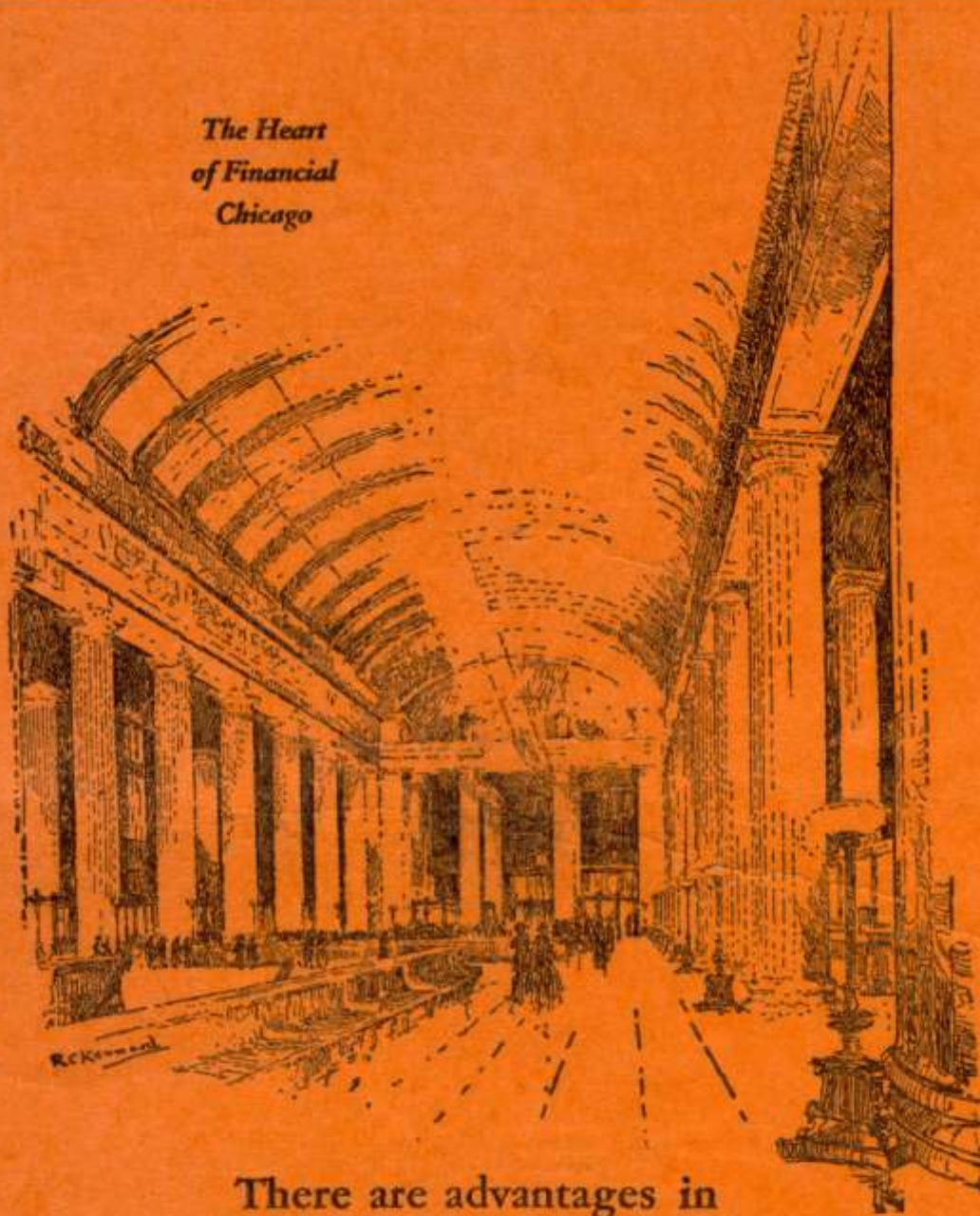
