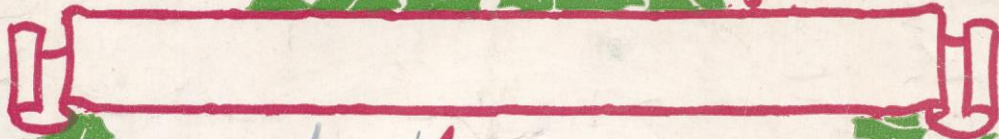

Here is Procedure in Obtaining 1946 Season Tickets

THE Redskins' management wishes to outline the procedure to be followed by persons wishing to purchase 1946 tickets.

All 1945 season ticket holders will have until February 1 to renew their present seats. Notices will be sent out after the first of January to these patrons. They will be asked to fill out a form with their address, seat numbers, etc., and return to the Redskins' office before

February 1. The period between February 15 and March 1 will be needed to get our files in order and to make any such improvements in seats as can be made for the present season ticket holders.

Beginning March 1, new applicants will be assigned their seat locations. An application blank is on page 6. New subscribers may fill in the application and mail it to the

Redskins' Office, 739 9th Street, N.W., Washington 1, D. C. Applications will be filed in the order received and will be notified when to come in and make their seat selections. All seats in the Stadium will be

open for sale as season tickets: Upper boxes, Field boxes, Sideline boxes, Lower boxes, Upper and Lower grandstand, Field stand and East Field stand.

As is customary, a partial payment plan for season

tickets will be in effect.

A deposit will be due on all tickets by April 1 with the final payment due on July 15.

Tickets will be ready for distribution about June 1.

The price of tickets and schedule of games will not be determined until after the National League meeting in January.

Recently Returned Redskins Helping in Pennant Chase

Above are pictured three members of the 1942 championship eleven whose return to the grid wars has bolstered the 1945 Redskin squad. All three served from the end of the '42 season until October in the U. S. Navy. Their defensive ability—Aldrich and Hare in backing up the line—and Todd as a halfback has been of immeasurable aid. Today for the first time Todd should be given offensive opportunities

with the ball and should flash some of the form which made him one of the most feared ball carriers in the business. Last week Todd made two pass interceptions that set up Redskin scores. Aldrich, an All-America center at Texas Christian, is still considered to be among the top performers at that position. Hare, besides his line backing and pass defending prowess, is an excellent ball carrier and vicious blocker.

OO—STEVE BAGARUS

Back—171 lbs., 6 ft. Former Notre Dame halfback, Steve figures to be one of the brightest stars in the National Football League with a season of play under his belt. Shifty, he is among the league's best punt and kick-off returners. His speed and ability to reverse field, plus the ease with which he catches passes makes him one of the most feared backs in the business. Keep your eye on "Double Oh".

* * *

18—FRANK AKINS

Back—215 lbs., 5 ft. 10 in.—Playing his third year of pro football. Akins figures to be one of the great stars in the coming campaigns. Formerly of Washington State, he is a speedster whose weight makes him an ideal fullback in the T-formation. He was shelved with a mastoid condition in the early part of the 1943 season, but returned in the latter games to aid the Redskins in their final games. Next to Baugh, he is squad's best punter.

* * *

19—JOE AGUIRRE

End—223 lbs., 6 ft. 3 in.—Star of St. Mary's (Calif.) now playing fourth season with Redskins. Two years All-League end, he is not only a great defensive player, but excels at pass catching, blocking, and field goal and extra point kicking. Spent 1942 season in Merchant Marine.

* * *

20—BOB SEYMOUR

Back—208 lbs., 6 ft. 1 in.—One of the biggest stars ever to play at Oklahoma University, he is beginning his sixth year of pro football. At fullback, he has been on the league's leading scorers and ground gainers for several seasons. Best story teller on the squad, he constantly keeps the team in good spirits with his clever dialogue and mimicking.

* * *

22—DOUG TURLEY

End—210 lbs., 6 ft. 2 in.—Turley came to Redskins last season after having played with Wilmington Clippers. His size and strength make him one of most promising ends in the league. Playing his second year with the Redskins.

26—AL LOLOTAI

Guard—213 lbs., 5 ft. 11 in.—One of the prize rookies of the year, Lolotai starred for the past three years in Hawaii. Part Samoan, Lolotai played at Weber College in Ogden, Utah, before returning to his native Islands. A vicious blocker and tackler, he is making the middle of the Redskin line tougher each week.

* * *

28—FRANK FILCHOCK

Back—190 lbs., 5 ft. 11 in.—Next to Baugh, Filchock is probably the best passer in the business. Also a quarterback, Filchock can operate from fullback or halfback. Although not a punter, he is one of the team's best runners. Missed 1942 and 1943 seasons while in U. S. Navy. He and Baugh team to give the Redskins one of the most feared offensive teams in the league.

* * *

31—LARRY WELDON

Back — 197 lbs., 6 ft. — A general all-around athlete, Weldon pitches baseball in the summer and plays football in the fall. Former Presbyterian College star, he came to Redskins from Portsmouth in Dixie League. Offensively this season he plays end, defensively he backs up the line. Can be called upon to quarterback team or play fullback when the occasion demands.

* * *

35—WILBUR MOORE

Back—181 lbs., 5 ft. 11 in.—One of the truly great stars of professional football. He has everything that goes into the making of a standout player—heart, ability, temperament. Always near the top in scoring, he is probably the best defensive halfback in the National Football League. Former Minnesota player, he began pro career in 1939.

* * *

38—LES DYE

End—180 lbs., 6 ft. 1 in.—Syracuse. A great pair of hands enable him to catch passes with considerable ease and finesse. Two touchdowns last year, one enabled Redskins to defeat Cleveland, the other to tie Philadelphia. Although nearly completely gray, he is only 27.

41—DICK TODD

Back—182 lbs., 5 ft. 11 in.—Return of Todd to the backfield promises to add yardage to the ground attack of the Redskins. A member of the Redskins from 1939 through 1942, Todd played in 1943 with Iowa Pre-Flight. A good defensive back, he is also a shifty open field runner and exceptional pass catcher.

* * *

44—MERLYN CONDIT

Back—188 lbs., 5 ft. 11 3-4 in.—Much will be heard from No. 44 before the season gets older. Condit was acquired by the Redskins in 1944 in a six-player deal that also brought Joe Ungerer to the team. A triple-threatener at Brooklyn and Carnegie Tech, where he was All-America, he adds considerable class to the backfield.

* * *

45—MARVIN WHITED

Guard—205 lbs., 5 ft. 11 in.—Former backfield star at Oklahoma University, he is just returned from U. S. Navy. Played backfield on 1942 championship team. Always a blocking back, was shifted to guard in the T-formation to take advantage of his speed and blocking ability. Second year player.

* * *

46—JOE UNGERER

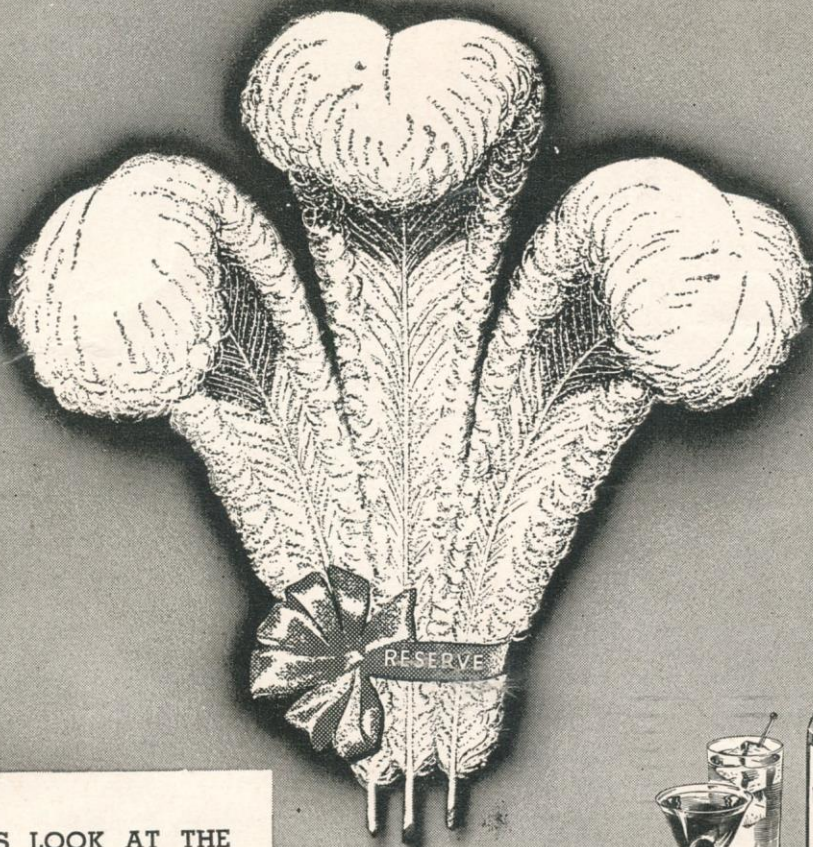
Tackle—261 lbs., 5 ft. 11 in.—Acquired in trade with Brooklyn last year, he is expected to be one of league's standout tackles this year.
