THIS IS IT!



OTTO GRAHAM

TODAY is the battle for first place in the American Conference of the National Football League and a defeat by either team would make future going tough. This is the game where a victory counts double—move up yourself and drop your closest rival back a notch.

The Giants last Sunday used the T formation all the way against the Washington Redskins and despite the tossing of Sammy Baugh won comfortably. The Browns had to come from behind on the wings of Otto Graham's passing and the toe of Lou Groza to beat the Eagles.

Although the Giants won, for the second week in a row they lost an operative with a cracked transverse process in the back, this time Travis Tidwell. But, as long as Charlie Conerly stays hale and hearty, that shouldn't be too much of a blow.

The Giants, however, should be stronger this week. Al DeRogatis and Fritz Barzilauskas should be ready for full-time duty in the line and the New Yorkers, having placed Bill Stribling on the inactive list while his back heals, have picked up help in the backfield in the person of Bosh Pritchard, a fine back released by the Philadelphia Eagles.

If the pattern of former games holds true it should develop into a battle of Graham's passing against the ground game of the Giants. But, Conerly has been improving weekly and his passing is more than an average threat.

Graham, with 90 completions in 154 attempts for 1,261 yards, is third in the league ranking of

passers. Conerly is only tenth as the average gain per pass is the standard by which the pitchers are rated. He has completed 56 of 119 for 871 yards. Each has thrown for seven touchdowns and Graham's percentage of completions is 58.4 as against a good 54.6 for Conerly.

This is the **MUST** game for each of the teams and it brings to mind an incident which occurred in Cleveland when the Giants played there on October 28.

The door keeper at the Browns' dressing room told every Brownie as he entered the park, "This is the must game, this is the big one. You've got to win this one." And almost to a man every Brownie answered, some with a shake of the fist, "We know it. We'll get it."

The Brownies did win that one, 14 to 13, but they needed a bad center pass on an extra point attempt by Ray Poole to do it. Today, however, no one needs tell any one. Everyone knows that "This is it."

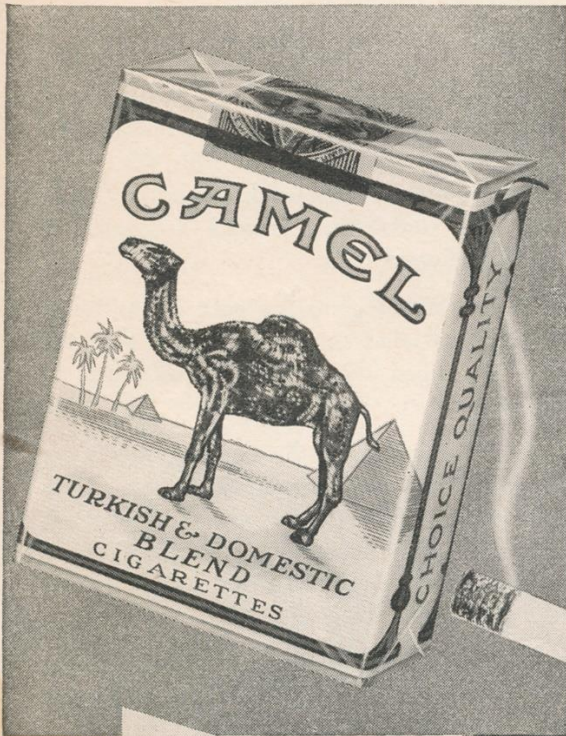
This is the fifth game the two teams have played in two seasons. The Giants won both regular season games last year and then lost to an offside penalty and Groza's toe in the divisional play-off. The Browns evened the series earlier this year and this is the rubber match.

Neither Steve Owen or Paul Brown, coach of the Brownies, likes to lose. Both are winning coaches. So, get up on the edge of your seat and watch for the fireworks.

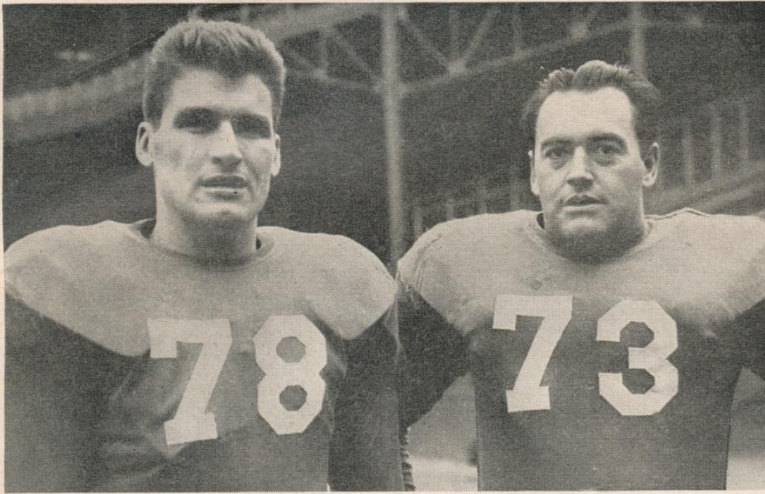

THE average football fan looks at a game and observes the backs running and passing, the ends making spectacular catches and occasionally someone making a bone-jarring tackle out in the open for all to see. But, what so many miss is the head-to-head battle in the line—the place where it is decided if the play does or does not succeed.

The Giants have such a line unit, one which tries to make certain the play does not succeed. The base of this defensive unit is made up of the unsung heroes, but the guys who jam up the middle for the Giants are beginning to make the fans and experts look their way.

The nucleus consists of four holdovers from last year's squad. Arnie Weinmeister, all-league, and Al DeRogatis hold down the vital tackle slots. Jon Baker is the middle guard, the keystone of a wall which would crumble if he didn't do his job. John Cannady is the line backer, one of the best in the league, who must diagnose the play and go to meet it, either in the line or back into secondary if needed on a pass.

With the presence of the Cleveland Browns today, the importance of this unit is emphasized. The Browns always have been a terrific passing team with Otto Graham throwing, but one of the reasons for their aerial success was the fact that they could run the ball too. Last year they gained 2,089 yards rushing for an average per carry of 4.6 yards as against the league average of 4.1 yards per carry.

But, in two regular league games with the Giants and one play-off game, they gained only 359 yards rushing against the Giant forward wall in 111 carries for an average gain of 3.24 yards.

Last season also, Marion Motley, the Browns' big fullback, was the league's leading ground gainer with 810 yards for an average gain of 5.8 yards per carry. Against the

Giants' line in three games he gained only 86 yards in 29 attempts for an average of only 2.9 yards.

These linemen are nobly assisted by two top-flight defensive ends in Ray Poole and Jim Duncan. Sometimes they rush the passer, sometimes hold back to help pass defense or stop wide running plays. But they work as a unit and without the middle men they'd be lost.

So take a good look at those linemen today. They're worth looking at. Last year they held the opposition to 1,387 yards rushing and the league average of yards gained rushing per team was 1,851.9.

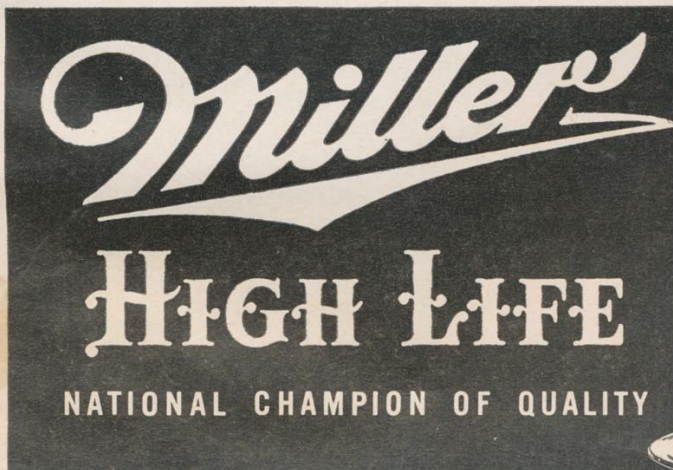

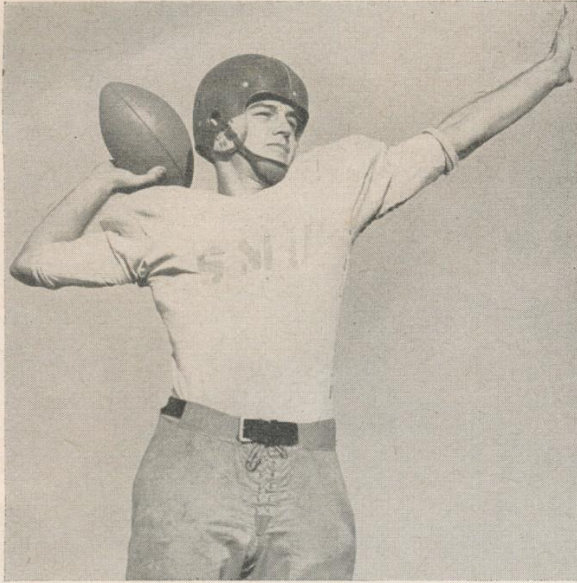

GIANT STARS ON THE HORIZON



FRED BENNERS

WHILE Steve Owen and his 1951 Giant squad naturally are concentrating on winning this year, the Giant front office is looking ahead. The work that has been done already has assured Giant fans of seeing some scintillating new stars at the Polo Grounds next year.

Two of the outstanding collegians this season, Southern Methodist's Fred Benners and Frank Smith, a Tuckahoe, N. Y., boy at Miami (Fla.) U., are prospective Giants. The New York club has obtained the right to deal with these, and other great collegians, when they finish their college year. They were eligible to be drafted when their original college classes graduated and the Giants gambled draft selections with an eye to the future.

Benners probably is one of the most widely

known college football players of the year. A former teammate of the Giants' Kyle Rote, Flinging Fred captured the fancy of fandom when his devastating passing beat Notre Dame—for the edification of television viewers, too.

Smith is rated by the experts as one of the greatest outside runners in the country.

The Giants also have other boys on their reserve list who were college heroes last season and who now are in service but will be available when their tours of duty are completed.

Among these are Francis (Reds) Bagnell, Penn's record-breaking back and Maxwell Trophy winner; Everett Grandelius, All-America runner from Michigan State; Paul Douglass, sixty-minute back from Illinois; Holland Donan, outstanding tackle of Princeton's unbeaten 1950 team, and Jack Stroud, tackle, and Bud Sherrod, end, two of the best linemen in Tennessee history.

The reserve list covers even more ground. Also on it are such players as Don McAuliffe, of Michigan State; Quincy Armstrong, of North Texas State; Ray Wietecha, of Northwestern; Dick Yelvington, of Georgia, and Pat Flanagan, of Marquette.

Fans certainly remember three aces of the Giants' 1950 team who now are in service. They, too, are expected back when their tours of duty are over. They are Bill Austin and Bill Milner, guards, and Randy Clay, a top-flight running back.

So, the prospects are good. With the youth of the present team, replacements from the reserve list and the new draft picks still to be made for 1952 the Giants seem assured of a parade of the finest football talent in the land for years to come.

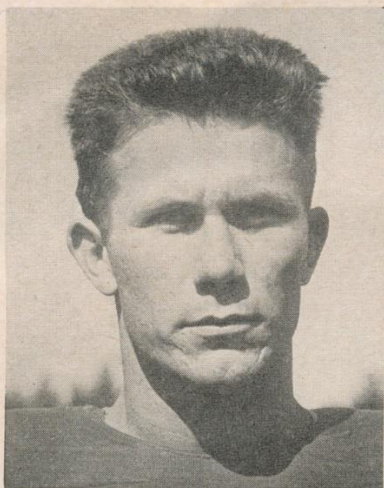

Meet the Giants



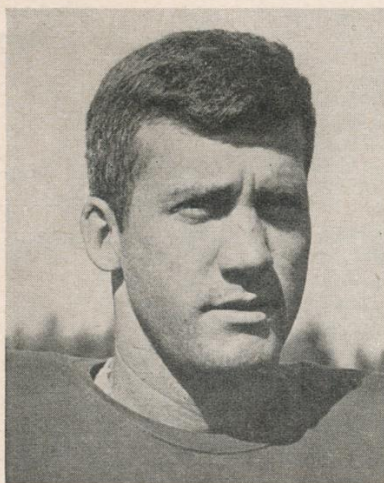
Bob McChesney

Bob McChesney (88), acquired from the Eagles in a waiver deal at the start of the 1950 season, was the Giants' most effective pass-receiver last year. He snagged 19 aerials for 380 yards and six touchdowns. The slim Hardin-Simmons graduate figures to top that performance this year, the way he is going. Fast and nifty, he has the knack of getting loose and runs well after getting the ball.

Bob Wilkinson (87), a two-year All-America at UCLA, has been a valuable all-around workman for the Giants in this, his rookie pro season. In addition to playing end on both offense and defense, the big Californian has filled in at defensive halfback and has been drilled to step in at offensive halfback on short notice.

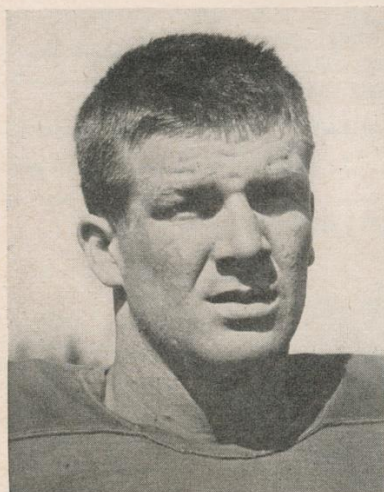
Kelley Mote

Kelley Mote (80), one of the South's greatest ends while at Duke, came to the Giants last year in a trade with Detroit. He is a steady, capable two-way performer who is serviceable on offense and defense on either flank. He was one of the heroes of the Giants' victory over the Yanks two weeks ago, coming up with two key catches on the touchdown march that won for the Polo Grounds squad.

Bill Stribling (81) was the Giants' top pass-catcher until he suffered a back injury against the Yanks two weeks ago. This big, good-looking end hails from Mississippi, the school that also sent Charley Conerly and the Pooles on to Polo Ground glory. Fast, strong and sure-handed, he has made the grade impressively in his rookie season.



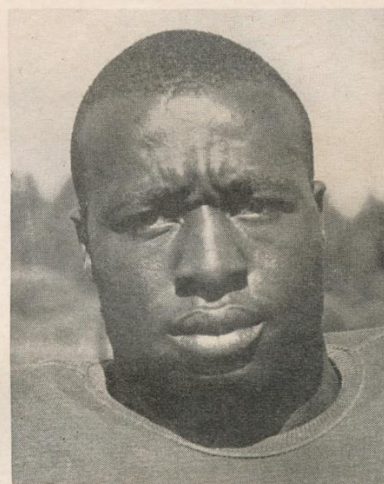

Bob Hudson (89), a stalwart two-way performer for Clemson's Orange Bowl victors of last January 1, is another of the talented rookie ends who are lending added punch to the Giant attack. He is a sure-handed pass-grabber with the speed to go all the way after getting the ball. He does a fine job of blocking too and also is serviceable on defense.

Bob Jackson (34) is called Stonewall with good reason. He's about as rugged an athlete as you can find. Blocking and tackling are his specialties in his utility role as a defensive handyman and key member of the crack Giant kick-off unit. Stonewall hasn't done much running this season, but as a freshman in 1950 he showed he also can really gallop with the ball, averaging 9.4 yards on 12 rushing attempts and breaking loose on two long touchdown runs.

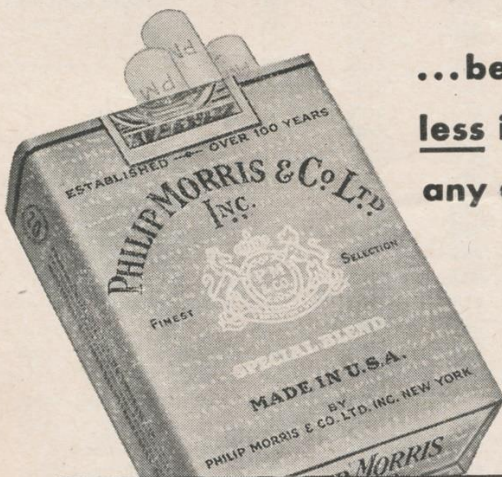

LOOKING OVER THE BROWNS

COACHING STAFF—**Paul Brown**, one of football's foremost personalities, is boss of the Browns. Winning football and Brown have been synonymous ever since 1930, when he launched his coaching career at Severn Prep. There, at Massillon High, at Ohio State, at Great Lakes during the war years, and now at Cleveland, this master teacher and organizer has built teams that excelled in their ascending class. Going into the current season, Brown's all-time record showed 194 wins, 27 losses and nine ties. The professional gridiron never has known a more dominant force than his Browns. As members of the All-America Conference, they won four straight titles, losing only four games over that span. Last year, in their first National League season, they won that championship, too. This year again, the dynamic little one-time Miami University quarterback has a title contender. General manager as well as head coach of the Cleveland club, which is owned by Arthur McBride, Brown's hand-picked staff of aides includes **Blanton Collier**, **Wilbur Ewbank**, **Fritz Heisler** and **Tim Temerario**.

STYLE OF PLAY—The Browns operate from T formation, with liberal use of flankers and backs-in-motion. Because Brown figured from the start that the basic ingredient of success in the pro game was a good aerial attack, they stress passing. They pack a sting on the ground, too, but it is their overhead game that opponents have found the greatest reason to fear. Another feature of Cleveland's play is a defense of exceptional efficiency. The Browns are as hard to score on as they are to stop. Few teams are as well drilled or have as much fighting spirit, for Brown is a perfectionist and also an unflagging devotee of the "old college try."

OUTSTANDING BACKS—**Otto Graham (60)** directs Cleveland's T-attack from quarterback. One of football's top passers, he completed 729 of 1314 aerials for 12,028 yards and 100 touchdowns in over five seasons for the Browns and is up with the leaders again this year... **Marion Motley (76)**, 238-pound fullback, led the NFL ground-gainers last year with 810 yards. Injuries have slowed him up a bit this season but he's still a fearsome fullback... **Emerson Cole (70)**, who has been alternating with Motley in the bucking slot, is just as powerful and, right now, much faster... **Dub Jones (86)** is a tall, free-wheeling halfback much respected as a breakaway pass-receiver... **Ken Carpenter (84)**, No. 1 draft choice of the Browns in 1950, has come into his own this year year as regular left halfback. He's a fine all-around performer... **Rex Bumgardner (90)** came to the Browns from the Buffalo Bills in 1950. He's a fleet and shifty runner... **Cliff Lewis (62)** understudies Graham at quarterback and quarterbacks the defense... **Warren Lahr (80)** and

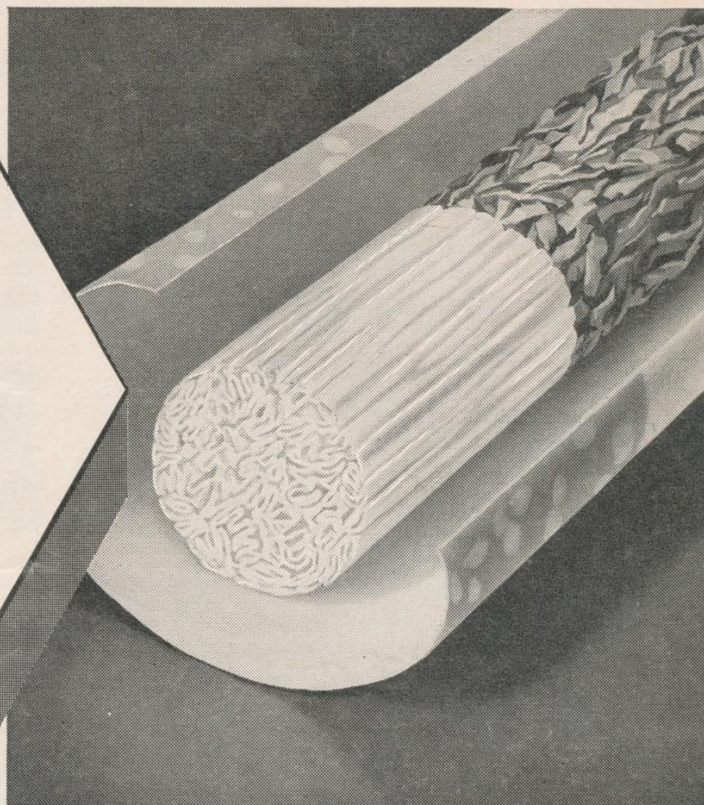
Tom James (82) are far-ranging defensive halfbacks... **Tony Adamle (74)** is a rugged line-backer.

LEADING LINEMEN—**Dante Lavelli (56)** and **Mac Speedie (58)**, coupled as an entry for the sixth year, are two of the best pass-catching ends in the business. Going into this season, Lavelli had scored 34 touchdowns and Speedie 25 on pitches from Graham. They're both fast, nifty, sure-handed fellows with an uncanny knack for getting clear... **Horace Gillom (59)** not only is a capable two-way end but the NFL's best punter... **Len Ford (53)** and **George Young (52)** are big, strong defensive wingmen... **Lou Groza (76)**, known as "The Toe," is a seldom-miss place-kicker and a good defensive tackle... **Lou Rymkus (44)** is rated one of the best blocking tackles in the business... **Chubby Grigg (48)** makes his 280 pounds felt on defense at tackle... **Bill Willis (30)** is one of football's rarities: a guard who catches the eye... **Lin Houston (32)** and **Bob Gaudio (38)** also catches the eye—when the Browns have the ball they run a never-ending relay between the bench and the huddle with signal suggestions for Graham... **Frank (Gunner) Gatski (22)** is a hard-blocking veteran center.

THE Giants will be in Chicago playing the Cardinals next Sunday but will return to the Polo Grounds two weeks from today to wind up their home season. The Pittsburgh Steelers will furnish the opposition.

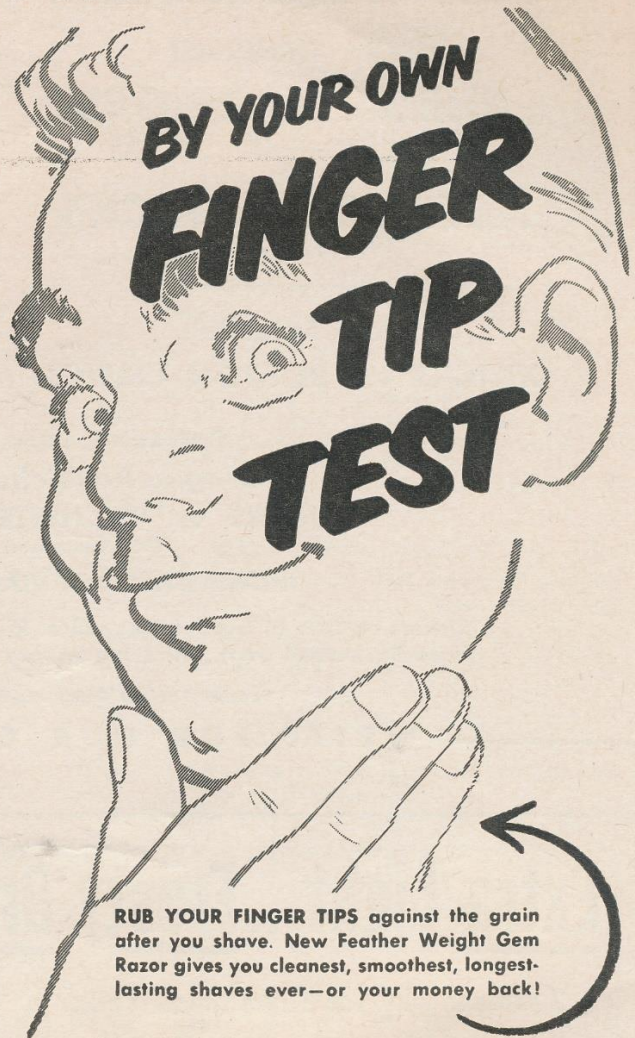
The Steelers, a battering-ram team which operates from single wing formation, held the Giants to a tie in the opening game of the season. Always tough for the Giants, and anyone else, for that matter, it was the Steelers who scored one of the two victories over the Giants last year that forced them into a divisional play-off with the Cleveland Browns. So, Steve Owen is taking nothing for granted.

Joe Geri, all-league halfback last season, still is the most potent weapon of the Steeler offense. He is an old-fashioned triple threat who can run, pass and kick from his tailback position in Johnny Michelosen's single wing.

This year Geri has a couple of very valuable assistants in the backfield in Lynn Chandnois, the former Michigan State star who plays wingback, and Chuck Ortman, of Michigan, who also plays tailback. Chandnois is one of the leading ground gainers in the league and one of the top men returning kick-offs. And, like all of the Pittsburgh backs, he can pass too.

Michelosen gets plenty of razzle-dazzle into his single wing. When a play starts and looks like an end run it may wind up in a pass no matter who carries. In the tie-game opener the Steelers threw 22 passes against the Giants and five men threw them.

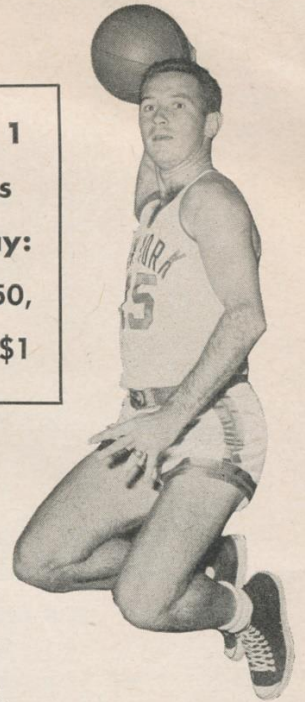
