

Guy Chamberlin Makes Debut Here After Compiling Excellent Record

NEW FRANKFORD COACH PLAYS GREAT GAME AND HAS PILOTED FIVE CLUBS TO NATIONAL LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Chamberlain, Guy the new coach of the Yellow Jackets, will make his bow to Frankford sports-lovers today after compiling the greatest record ever hung together by a coach in the National, League of Professional Football Clubs.

Chamberlain has coached National League teams during five previous seasons and each year he piloted his aggregation of

gridiron workers to the top of the league standing and the recognized professional football

championship of the United States.

For four years the Canton Bulldogs were subject to Chamberlain. The first year he achieved the ambition of all Cantonese—or

whatever they call the residents of Cantonby breaking the grip of the arch-rival, Akron, on the pre-grid title. Canton vanquished the Tigers in the final game of the season and Chamberlain and Canton boasted its first championship eleven.

For three more years the coach continued his championship reign at Canton. Last year he changed his affiliations to the Cleveland Panthers. All Chamberlain did in 1924 was to pilot the baby member of the league to the top and continue in Cleveland the pace he set at Canton.

Not only has the new Frankford mentor proven his ability as a coach and director, but he is also recognized as one of the greatest ends who ever broke into the league. Frankford fans who witnessed his playing here against the Yellow Jackets the past two years certainly will agree with that statement.

Koppisch Confident his team Will Vanquish Yellowjackets

FORMER COLUMBIA ALL-AMERICAN HAS ASSEMBLED POWERFUL ARRAY TO CARRY COLORS OF BUFFALO IN NATIONAL LEAGUE

Walter Koppisch, the former Columbia University captain and All-American back threatens to mar the opening home game of the season for the Yellow Jackets by leading his invading Buffalo club to a victory over the home squad.

Koppisch has rounded up a formidable array for his Bison optfit. The men have been practicing twice daily since the first of September and Koppisch and his players hit Philadelphia late last night full of fight and confidence

The former Columbia star will call signals for the visitors and he has shown his field generalship on numerous occasions. The visiting coach is rated as a wonder in a broken field, can pass, kick and play a fine defensive game.

Koppisch gave his squad a workout against the Frantiers of Tonawanda last Sunday and when the home club recovered from the shock the Buffalo team was well on its way to the Bison city with the initial scalp of the season tucked in its belt.

The invaders have real championship aspirations. Fans up Buffalo way figure that Koppisch has assembled a team that will be there or thereabouts when the curtain is run down for the season. In the backfield with Koppisch will be Christian, University of Missouri; Kennedy, Holy Cross; Feist, Canisus, and Walyl Foster, Bucknell.

"Swede" Youngstrom, who gained All-American rating as a lineman while playing at Dartmouth, will hold down one of the guard posts. Youngstrom is rated as the greatest lineman at blocking kicks who ever played intercollegiate football and has carried his knack of breaking through and blocking punts into the pro game. Youngstrom has acted as line coach for the visitors.

The remaining linemen include Jim Noble, Syracuse; Charley Barber, V. M. I; Eddie Fischer, Columbiaffi Reed, Bucknell; Chester Gay, Minnesota, and Milo Gwosden, Minnesota.

Professional Football Occupies

Gridiron activity holds same relative position organ-

GRIDIRON ACTIVITY HOLDS SAME RELATIVE POSITION ORGANIZED BASEBALL RETAINED ON DIAMOND ABOUT
FORTY YEARS AGO

Thousands of followers of professional football who grasped the opportunity of watching collegiate grid luminaries of former seasons do their stuff last season at the Frankford Yellow Jacket stadium, will see the game played at the height of its evolution up to this time this fall.

Professional football, up to this time, has been struggling for a foot hold and last season it entrenched itself with a good deal of thoroughness. There were many fans who believed, and some few still believe, that collegiate and scholastic football alone typify the great American gridiron game.

Perhaps a few years ago such was the case in many districts, formerly professional football was a slam bang affair that was nought but rough stuff and a couple of struggling mobs. There was nothing of the real spirit of the game about such clashes, only a bitter feud. But that day is past. Graduated stars of collegiate teams are now signing up with professional outfits and the squads are larger than the average college squad. To be good enough to sign a professional football contract, the player must stand head over shoulders as a real football player, he must have a reputa-

tion that is actually known nationally.

There is no reason why the football player shouldn't make the gridiron sport a commercial proposition, if he is of mind to, just as does his brother in baseball who possesses superiority in that line.

The professional football field that is showing such vast progress in the shape of National professional foot ball league now being represented in all the big cities of this country is now in a position to offer monitary inducements to attract the college coach and graduate player who is now going into collegiate and scholastic football coaching.

Plans for the Frankford Yellow Jackets for the 1925 season cause one to think of evolution and the future professional football and the point of all the former college stars entering the pro game is brought out in the survey of all the Yellow Jackets material.

Professional football today stands virtually at the same place professional baseball occupied forty years ago. And like baseball then, professional football now is making such gigantic strides that it is assuming more and more each year the aspects of the leading figure on the football gridiron.
