

TD pass to Carphin, completed 4 of 13 and rushed 8 times for 39 yards. Amazed everybody throwing completed pass with left hand. Piloted club to 31-21 win at Regina. Completed 4 passes, two of them for TDs by Fleming and Carphin.

GEORGE GRANT, T-Kicker. 28, 6-4, 225. Canadian. 1st year with Lions. Taking over for the injured Vic Kristopaitis the former Colorado College ace made his debut in the WIFU an auspicious one at Regina last Monday. He scored 7 points, converting all three Lion touchdowns, kicked a 23-yard field goal and one single when one of his kick-offs bounced off a 'Rider player and went into touch. In '57 led Colorado College to conference title with 40-yd. FG.





FRANK GILLIAM, End. 26, 6-2, 201. American. 1st year with Lions. Joined club Aug. 30 and played his first game as a Leo in Regina last Monday. Born in Steubenville, Ohio, he was a 3-letter man at lowa and was selected All Big Ten and NEA All American. Played in the Hula and Rose Bowl games of '57. Started '57 season with Green Bay, then to Winnipeg through '59, playing in three Grey Cup games. Came to Lions from Ottawa.

DON VASSOS, HB. 22, 5-10, 175. Canadian. 2nd year with Lions. A star back at UBC he broke all existing records for yards gained. Has good speed and in '59 the Lions' coaching staff converted him into a competent defensive halfback. In his freshman season Don intercepted three passes and ran one back for a TD. He is not expected to play tonight with Bob Jeter being used as a defensive halfback. Don is currently completing his B. Comm. at UBC.



Against the Stamps he scored his first WIFU TD and in 9 carries rushed for 87 yards. He scored his second teedee at Winnipeg and led the club in rushing with 46 yards. Although he did not score at Regina he again led in total yards gained rushing and picked up key yardage on crucial downs.



LONNIE DENNIS, G-T. 21, 6-1, 230. American. 1st year with Lions. He has seen at lot of action at offensive and defensive tackle. Played well at Winnipeg. He captained the Brigham Young "Cougars" in '59, was selected by his teammates for the Most Inspirational Award, and he was All Skyline guard '59. He was voted outstanding lineman of the Copper Bowl game and was 3rd draft choice of Pittsburgh (NFL) Steelers and Denver (AFL) Broncos.



JOHN LANDS, E. 24, 6-4, 205. American. 1st year with Lions. This three-sport letterman from Montana U. played his first WIFU league game last Monday at Regina. He replaced the injured Bill Herron at offensive left end. All Skyline Conference pass receiver '58-'59, 5th draft choice of LA (NFL) Rams '59 while still a junior, John gives Leos a fine target for long passes. Remember the 56-yard pass-and-run TD from Walden to Lands against Ottawa!



NEIL BEAUMONT, HB. 19, 6-1, 209. Canadian. 1st year with Lions. Only 19 years old, he has unlimited potential, and if he continues to improve and impress he could become the first Lion to win the WIFU rookie-of-the-year award. Developing into a top safety man. All-star with the Meralomas of the Vancouver Jr. Big 4 last year. Led league in scoring with 41 points on 6 TDs, 3 converts and 2 singles.



MIKE CACIC, T-Middle Guard. 23, 6-5, 252. Canadian. 3rd year with club. Sitting out '59 season hasn't hampered his play to date. "Big Mike" has been a bearcat at Middle Guard, literally eating up the opposition. Ask Calgary's Kurt Burris and Winnipeg's Charley Shepard. A product of the Vancouver Jr. football development program he is rapidly becoming one of the top Canadian linemen in the WIFU. He is big, strong and fast, and has the potential.



VERN LOFSTROM, FB. 25, 6-1, 205. Canadian. 3rd season with Lions. One of the delightful surprises of Coach Robinson's first Canadian camp ('59) was the play of this Vancouver Jr. product, who wasn't good enough in '58. An injury sidelined him for the year after he had carried 19 times for 94 yards, 4.8 average, and scored a TD. His best game offensively this season was at Calgary where he carried 10 times for 50 yards, including a TD.

LEO'S DEN

TS there any advantage in playing at home? Not I if the results of the first 16 WIFU league games are to be used as a measuring stick. Saturday's Calgary at Edmonton game is not included.

The visiting team has won eight, lost seven and tied once in the first month of play. Over the Labor Day weekend the fans in Edmonton, Regina and Calgary saw their gridiron heroes lose to Winnipeg. Lions and Edmonton, respectively.

Bud Grant's powerful Grey Cup champs from Winnipeg lead the way with a victory on the home field of each of the other four teams in the Western Conference. Edmonton has won at Calgary and at Empire Stadium. The Lions are 2-2 on the road, winning in Regina and Calgary and losing at Edmonton and Winnipeg. Calgary has a tie (at Regina) in two road games, while Saskatchewan is still looking for its first win after six games, including three foreign field defeats.

There have been two shutouts. Winnipeg 27-0 over Saskatchewan at Regina and the Esks blanked the Lions 26-0 here two weeks ago. Two games have been decided by one point with the winning team scoring the deciding point with less than 30 seconds left to play. Less than one touchdown has separated the teams in two other games, and Calgary fans have seen three third period Stampeder leads disappear in the fourth period!

The Blue Bombers are all alone on top and one of many reasons for their unbeaten streak has been their ability to come from behind. Winnipeg has rebounded in championship form from four halftime deficits to go on to victory.

At this writing Edmonton has the inside track for second, thanks to Jackie Parker, who has never played better. The injury-riddled Lions are third and a victory tonight would consolidate the Leos hold on the third and last playoff spot and also move them closer to the Esks.

In the past Calgary has started with a rush, only to fall apart mid-way through the season. Canadian Schenley Awards

An Annual Tribute to Outstanding Football Players in Canada

Inaugurated in 1953 to honor the Outstanding Player in Canada, the Canadian Schenley Award has developed into three separate categories. Recognition now is given also to the Outstanding Canadian and to the Lineman of the Year.

The players are selected by voting of sports writers and sportscasters from the Canadian Pro Football League consisting of the Western (W.I.F.U.) and Eastern (Big Four) Divisions. The balloting gives equal voting strength to each

In 1953 four American imports headed the poll for Conada's Outstanding Player. The Canadian Schenley Board of Trustees, made up of football men from Western and Eastern Canada, then changed the terms in 1954 to include a special award for the Outstanding Canadian Player. In 1955 they decided to honor the Lineman of the Year.

The winners receive cash and plaques—\$1,000 Canada Savings Bond to the Outstanding Player, and \$500 Canada Savings Bond each to the Outstanding Canadian and Lineman of the Year. Their teams are given plaques and momentoes are awarded to their teammates.

Charles D. Pollard of Montreal is director of the Canadian Schenley Football Awards.

THERE is an abundance of excellent football reading in the following publications . . . October issue of SPORT features Montreal's Sam Etcheverry and Mel Allen's All-America Preview . . . LOOK asks if Jim Owen's Washington Huskies can win the Rose Bowl again? . . . September issue of PLAYBOY presents its annual Pigskin Preview and All-America team.

FORECASTS: Jim Hunt of the TORONTO STAR picks Winnipeg and Toronto for the Grey Cup... Tom Alderman of LIBERTY says Hamilton will defeat the B.C. Lions in the '60 Grey Cup game... Trent Frayne in MACLEANS likes Winnipeg over Ottawa for the Bombers third straight Grey Cup win, and he picks the Lions to finish third.

Edmonton coach Eagle Keys' approach to coaching is typically void of histrionics. "It isn't so much what plays you have, or how many, that counts. It's the way you execute them that's all important," he has been heard to say.

Do coaches have a sense of humor? We think so. Here are two good examples.

Paul Dietzel of LSU and coach of All-American Billy Cannon, summed up the whole muscular merrygo-round when he said, "The most important part of an athlete is the seven inches right between the ears."

The late Jim Tatum, U. of North Carolina coach, speaking in praise of second guessers: "When I come home at night after losing a game and go to bed and lie there wondering why I didn't pass or kick or run under such and such a situation, why, I know that 20,000 other people are in their beds wondering just that very thing, too. I tell you, it's a great feeling of fellowship."

Last year Calgary selected Joe Kapp as its Most Outstanding Player, Tony Pajackowski as its Top Canadian and Opie Bandy as its No. One Lineman. All three are expected to be in the Stampeders' starting lineup tonight . . . Tom Hinton was the Lions' Most Outstanding Player and Lineman of the Year in '59 with Don Lord, who retired this spring, as the No. One Canadian Player.

PENALTIES

Are assessed with the loss of a down or yardage rather than both (at the option of the team not being penalized).



1. Rough Play (Deliberate)—Loss of 25 yards.

Player disqualified from game.

2. Unnecessary Roughness (scragging, tripping, blocking from the rear, tackling out-of-bounds, roughing the kicker, grasping an opponent's face guard)—Loss of 15 yards.

3. **Piling On** is when an opponent runs into, throws his body against, or falls upon a ball-carrier whose progress has, to all intents and purposes, been stopped. Penalty—15 yards.

4. Offside

- (a) On Kick-of by kickers' side Loss of 10 yards with kick repeated or option. In the event of a second offense the opposing side will scrimmage (first down) at the point from which the first kick-off was made.
- (b) On scrimmage by offence during first or second down—Loss of five yards. On third down on a kick—re-scrimmage with the loss of 10 yards, option to non-offending side. On third down on a Ball Carrying or Forward Pass Play where yards are gained or goal-line reached re-scrimmage with loss of 10 yards, no option of choice by non-offending side. On third down on a Ball Carrying or Forward Pass Play where yards are not gained —loss of ball at point of last scrimmage.
- (c) On a scrimmage by defense—Loss of five yards and down repeated by attacking side unless first down has been gained, or such option provided.
- (d) On a scrimmage by defense on their own one yard line—Penalty: Down shall be repeated by the Attacking Side or they may take the option of any ground gained or score made.
