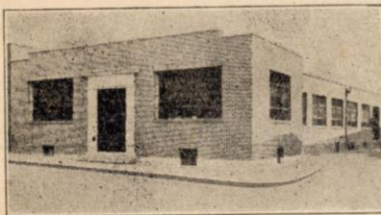

Canton, With Indian Stars, Here to Battle Yellow Jackets

One of the most colorful teams in football will oppose the Frankford Yellow Jackets here this Saturday. The Canton eleven, with such stars as Pete Calac, Jim Thorpe and Harry Robb, will be here to do their stuff against the Jackets and then will travel to the West, where the both teams will engage in a Sunday game.

The game will resolve itself into a battle of former team mates. In 1923 when Canton won its fourth straight championship, the Westerners beat the Yellow Jackets. The following year, the team was transferred to Cleveland, where again it captured the highest honors.

Of the eleven that went through that string of successive victories two members of the present Canton team and four who now wear the colors of the Yellow Jackets stood out prominently. Guy Chamberlin, Ben Jones, Wolcott Roberts



and Rudy Comstock are the quartette that wear the Frankford regalia, while Pete Henry and Harry Robb are with Canton.

Add to this pair those famous Indians, Thorpe and Pete Calac, together with Russ Stein, who for several years sported Frankford regalia, and it is evident that local fans will witness the best game of the local season thus far.

Calac, the Canton fullback, is regarded as the greatest Indian line plunger ever developed and he hits the line with all the force and vigor that characterized his playing in the good old Indian days at Carlisle. Reports of the games in which the Bulldogs have played this year say that the veteran Thorpe is as good as ever.

Pete Henry, one of the greatest tackles ever developed at Washington and Jefferson, tips the scales at near the 300 mark. In his college days Pete was chosen for All-American honors. In addition he is a deadly placement kicker, a field goal from his toe having beaten Frankford out for the title in 1923.

Harry Robb, the Canton quarterback, hails from Penn State and is one of the best field generals in pro football ranks besides being a fine ball carrier and passer. Another of the Canton tackles is Art Deibel of Lafayette, who tips the scales at 230

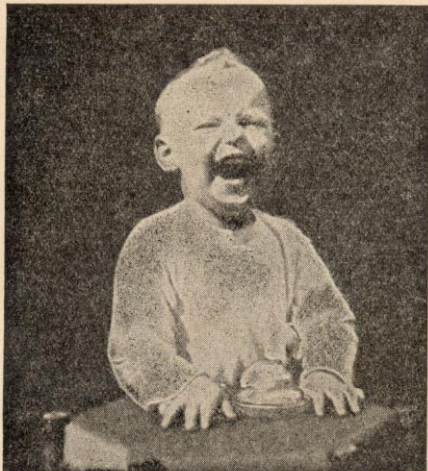

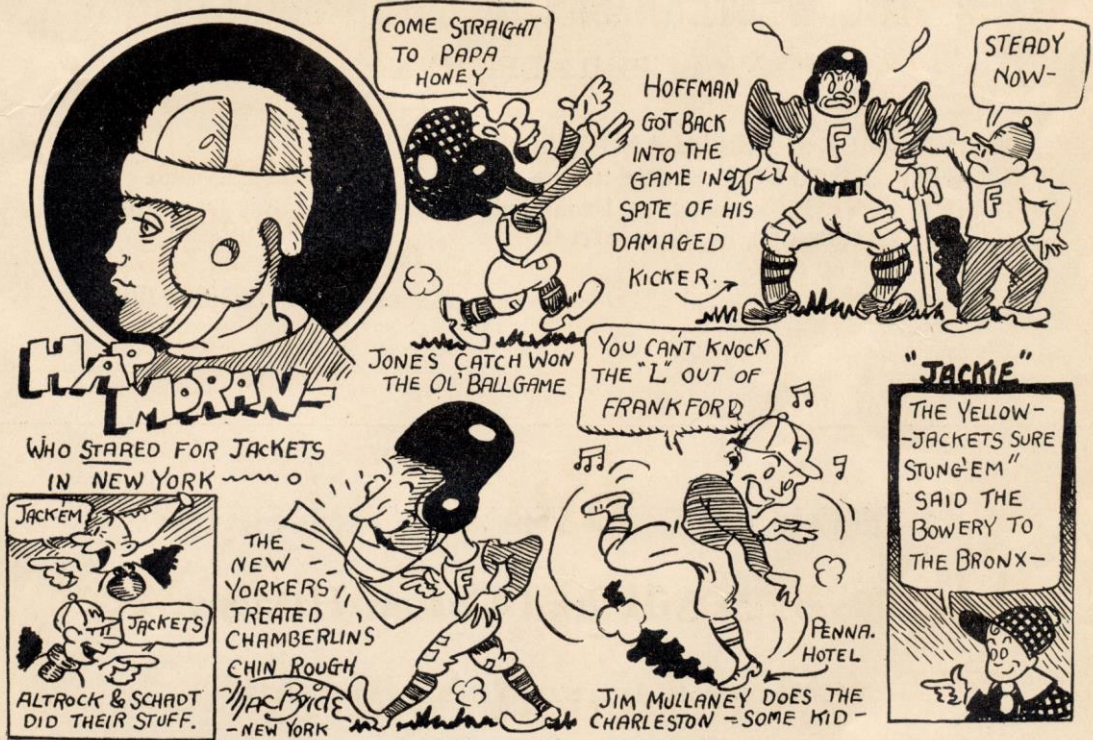

The National Football League

Our Pledge

The National Football League assembled in Annual meeting at Detroit, Michigan, the 6th day of February, 1926, places itself on record as unalterably opposed to any encroachment upon college football, and hereby pledges its hearty support to college authorities in maintaining and advancing the interest in college football and in preserving the amateur standing of all college athletes.

We believe there is a public demand for professional football as has been clearly demonstrated by the wide interest manifested and, to the end that this League may not jeopardize the amateur standing of any college player, it is the unanimous decision of this meeting that every member of

the National Football League be positively prohibited from inducing or attempting to induce any college player to engage in professional football until his class at college shall have graduated, and any member violating this rule shall be fined not less than One Thousand Dollars, or loss of its franchise or both.

The Imlay-Muller combination, which gained fame on the Pacific Coast in collegiate football circles, paved the way for Los Angeles to whip Milwaukee, 6 to 0. Muller caught a pass from Imlay and raced for a touchdown.

Paddy Driscoll is proving a good investment for the Bears. Two weeks ago he ran for a touchdown to tie the score with the Packers and Sunday a week ago, it was Driscoll's drop-kick that whipped the Detroit Panthers, 10 to 7.

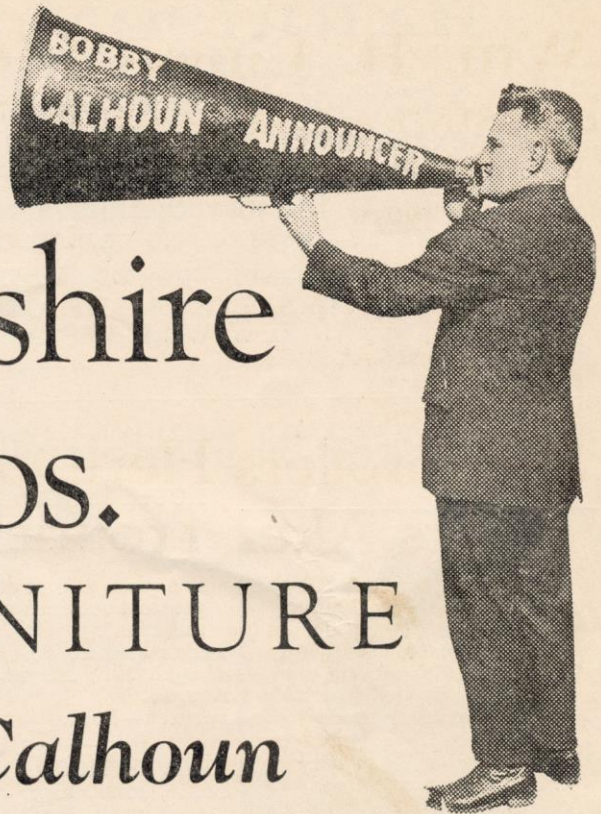

Yellow Jackets Sting Giants Twice, 6 - 0, 6 - 0

MORAN, BRUDER, JONES AND BUDD STAR IN HARD
FOUGHT BATTLES

Last Saturday the biggest crowd that has attended the games at the Yellow Jacket Stadium was on hand to see the Jackets humble the New York Giants, 6-0. The score was the result of two field goals by Budd in the second period—one from the 30-yard line and the other from the 42-yard marker. All throughout the game the Jackets held the upper hand with the exception of the last period when the Gothamites twice were on the 10-yard line only to be turned back by the stone wall forwards of the local squad—Reed, Hoffman, Potts, Youngstrum, Comstock and Budd.

Doc Brudder ran wild for Frankford until injuries forced him from the game, when Moran replacing Brudder kept up the good work. Hamer and Stockton also played fine ball.

The fans on edge after the exciting battle on Saturday, boarded a special train, 900 strong, and accompanied the Yellow Jacket Band and Bugle Corps to New York to witness the Frankford-New York game at the Polo Grounds. This was the opening game for the Giants on the home grounds and about 20,000 were in attendance. When the Band and Bugle Corps marched on the field they were given a rousing reception by the

Frankford contingent. The home team, too, were given a rousing welcome.

In this game the Giants started with a rush, getting three first downs in a row, but when in dangerous territory the Jackets braced and took the ball on downs, retaliating by making three first downs. The scoring in this game was also made in the second period. After vicious line smashes by Moran, Stockton and Hamer the ball was carried deep into New York's territory where a pass—Stockton to Jones—resulted in a touchdown. Budd failed in trying for the extra point.

Between the halves the Band and Bugle Corps serenaded the New York rooters, and led by Mayor Walker of New York, marched to the Frankford section where he was heartily cheered.

After the game the fans, led by the Bugle Corps, forming a parade over a square long, marched from 42nd and Broadway to the Pennsylvania Hotel, at 34th St. and 7th Ave., the headquarters of the Frankfurters for the day. Here a dinner was served in the main dining room and selections were rendered by the Band and Bugle Corps in the lobby of the hotel.
