Jackets Spring Surprise Walloping Cleveland Bulldogs---22-0

Rogers and Mercer Star in Greatest Victory of Season. Kassel Makes 88-Yard Run.

Benny Friedman and his Cleveland Bull-dogs entered the hive of the Jackets last Saturday and were stung to the tune of 22 to 0.

Cleveland entered the game a 2 to 1 favorite but it turned out to be Frankford's day—all the king's horses and all the king's men could not have stopped that Jacket horde last Saturday. Any team in the league would have fallen before their terrific onslaught. Through the air, around the ends, and through the line they thundered, the overhead offensive being the finest ever displayed by a local eleven. Fried-man came here noted for being the greatest passer of all time, but was beaten at his own game. He also fumbled twice, one of which netted a touchdown for Frankford, after an 88-yard run by Kassel in the final period.

Benny threw a scare into the local fans when two of his passes carried the ball nearly the whole length of the field right at the start. But at the 8-yard line the Jackets held; a punting duel followed.

At the opening of the second period, Frankford launched an aerial attack, carrying the ball to the 11-yard line. Here they were stopped so Mercer booted a field goal. Again

Frankford had Cleveland to the wall and a bad pass resulted in a safety by Maxwell. other aerial attack with Rogers on the receiving other aerial attack with Rogers on the receiving end carried the ball to the 10-yard line. Held again, Mercer made the point total 8 by boot-ing another 3-pointer. Following the kick-off, 2 passes, Mercer to Rogers, scored a touch-down, after a beautiful run of 15 yards by Rogers in which he reversed his field and reached the last chalk mark. Mercer added the extra point the extra point.

Interference was fine when Kassel made his long run and he was entirely protected. In-terference by Ford allowed Charlie Rogers to start on many a run and he ran wild. Mercer's toe seemed to be inspired; even when he kicked against the wind he kicked accurately. Wilcox and Fitzgibbons were both in the game and made substantial gains, while the line held when the home goal was menaced or kicking was made necessary

The old Yellow Jacket spirit was in evidence; players, cheer leaders, band, spectators—the entire crowd was on its feet many times during the game.

Cleveland Bulldogs Snap Back at Jackets in Sunday Tilt---37-0

Friedman's Avalanche of Passes Proves Disastrous for Locals.
(By "CHARLIE" ROGERS)

The Frankford Yellow Jackets fell beneath an avalanche of forward passes last Sunday at Cleveland and returned home on the short end of a

37 to 0 score. Many who witnessed the game of last Saturday could not understand how our team could have such a reversal of form on Sunday. Those who witnessed the Sabbath Day contest could under-stand the result far better. The reason was that every break in the Sungame went against the Jackets Benny and that became Friedman uncanny aerial tosses.

Despite the fact that the eligible receivers were covered closely, most of the time Friedman managed to throw the pigskin with such remarkable accuracy that the local boys could not possibly knock them down.

Scarcely a minute of the game had elapsed before Cleveland scored. This first tally was the result of the particle of the property of the pro

Scarcely a minute of the game had elapsed before Cleveland scored. This first tally was the result of a peculiar circumstance. Frankford had the ball on its own two-yard line after stopping four successive Bulldog line thrusts. Mercer dropped back to punt but did not notice that the end zone was only five yards wide instead of the regulation ten. Thus he was only about seven yards from the line of scrimmage when he kicked. The result was that the kick was blocked and Cleveland scored a safety. The Bulldogs have a ground rule which permits ball to be moved out five yards from the goal line under such a condition but the locals were not informed of this rule.

The two points changed the entire aspect of the game. It forced Frankford to assume the offense in an effort to wipe out the small lead by scoring a touchdown. The first local aerial that was attempted, however, was intercepted by a Cleveland back and the latter ran to the Frankford twenty-yard line before finally being downed. Friedman then uncorked an aerial





Britton, Grange's Running Mate, Signs with Jackets

Will Start at Fullback Against Cardinals Today.

Was Here with Dayton.

Earl Britton, the running mate of Red Grange, at the University of Illinois, has joined the Yellow Jacket squad.

Red Grange received tremendous publicity for his exceptional showing at Illinois. The fans knew him only because the points scored were by him.

Without taking away his honors, nevertheless, this was made possible by perfect interference on the part of the other Illinois backs and a style of play built around and suitable to Grange. Britton was one of the stars of the backfield, and playing in the fullback position was an important cog in the machine. He not only was part of the interference in advancing the ball, but also was called upon to do the kicking when points were needed or his own goal threatened.

Frankford first saw Britton in action at Shibe Park, when Grange and Britton came here with the Bears. This year he was one of the mainstays of the Dayton Club in both their appearances at the local stadium. Time and again his long punts drove the Jackets back when Dayton's goal line was threatened. He plays a bang-up game on the defensive.

Britton feels right at home with the Jackets because two other members of that famous Illinois team, Daugherty, a halfback, and Kassell, an end, have recently joined the local squad.

Three Illinois Stars Now with Jackets Helped Grange Beat Penn in 1925

Britton, Daugherty and Kassel Also Stars in Great Victory.

(The following item is taken from an article appearing in this week's issue of "Liberty" by Walter Eckersall)

Many will remember, in fact never forget, that great game between Illinois and Penn in 1925, when "Red" Grange, as the papers stated, beat Penn single-handed, but they overlooked one fact as most football fans do—the men who form the interference for great ball-toters. Walter Eckersall in *Liberty*, this week brings to light the work of Grange's "Knock-down" men—these same men who today wear the Frankford colors—Kassel, Daugherty and Britton.

The following is a synopsis of the story: "Illinois won the toss and elected to receive the first kick-off. This placed Pennsylvania on the defensive immediately, and then Zuppke saw for himself the defensive methods of the team coached by Lou Young, a former Penn player.

player.

"After receiving the initial kick-off, Britton and Daugherty, the Illinois backs, made short gains through the Penn line, and then Britton punted to Pennsylvania's fifteen-yard line.

"Penn returned the punt.

"Then came the play which, as far as the spectators were concerned, was the break of the game and sent Illinois on its way to a one-sided and unexpected victory.

"Illinois went back into its customary huddle. The ball was snapped to Grange. He hesitated a moment while Daugherty and Britton

did some perfect blocking that got Grange past the scrimmage line.

"After passing the scrimmage line, Grange cut back, eluded the secondary Penn defensive players, and planted the ball under the crossbar of the goal posts. His run covered fiftyeight yards.

"That touchdown paved the way for other

Illinois scores.

"Grange caught the next kick-off and nearly ran through the entire Penn team before being stopped on the Easterners' twenty-six-yard line. From this point Daugherty and Britton took the ball to Pennsylvania's six-inch line, and on the next play Britton crashed through center for a touchdown.

for a touchdown.

"In the second period Grange swept Penn's right end for a touchdown, and in the third quarter Illinois executed a thrilling play. The Western eleven worked its way deep enough into Penn's territory to call for a place-kick formation. The ball was passed to Captain Grange, who was on one knee to hold it for Britton.

"Grange tossed it to Britton. The latter made a perfect forward pass to Kassel, the Illinois end. Meantime, Grange had sprinted to one side of the field, where he took a lateral pass from Kassel and ran nineteen yards for Illinois' final touchdown."


