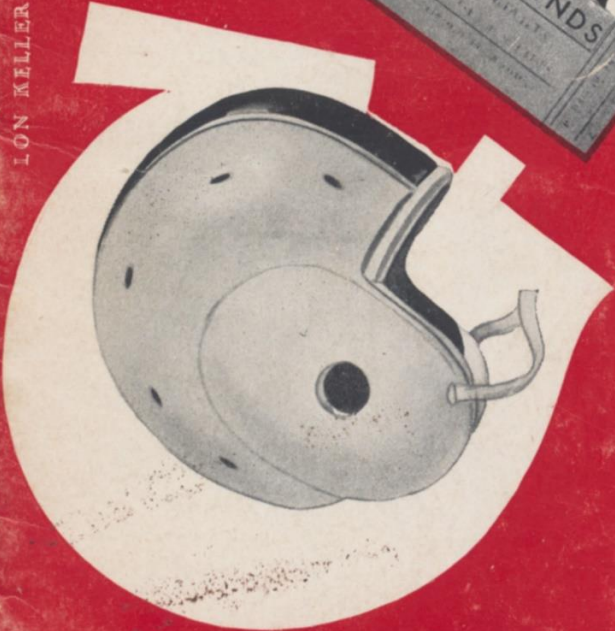

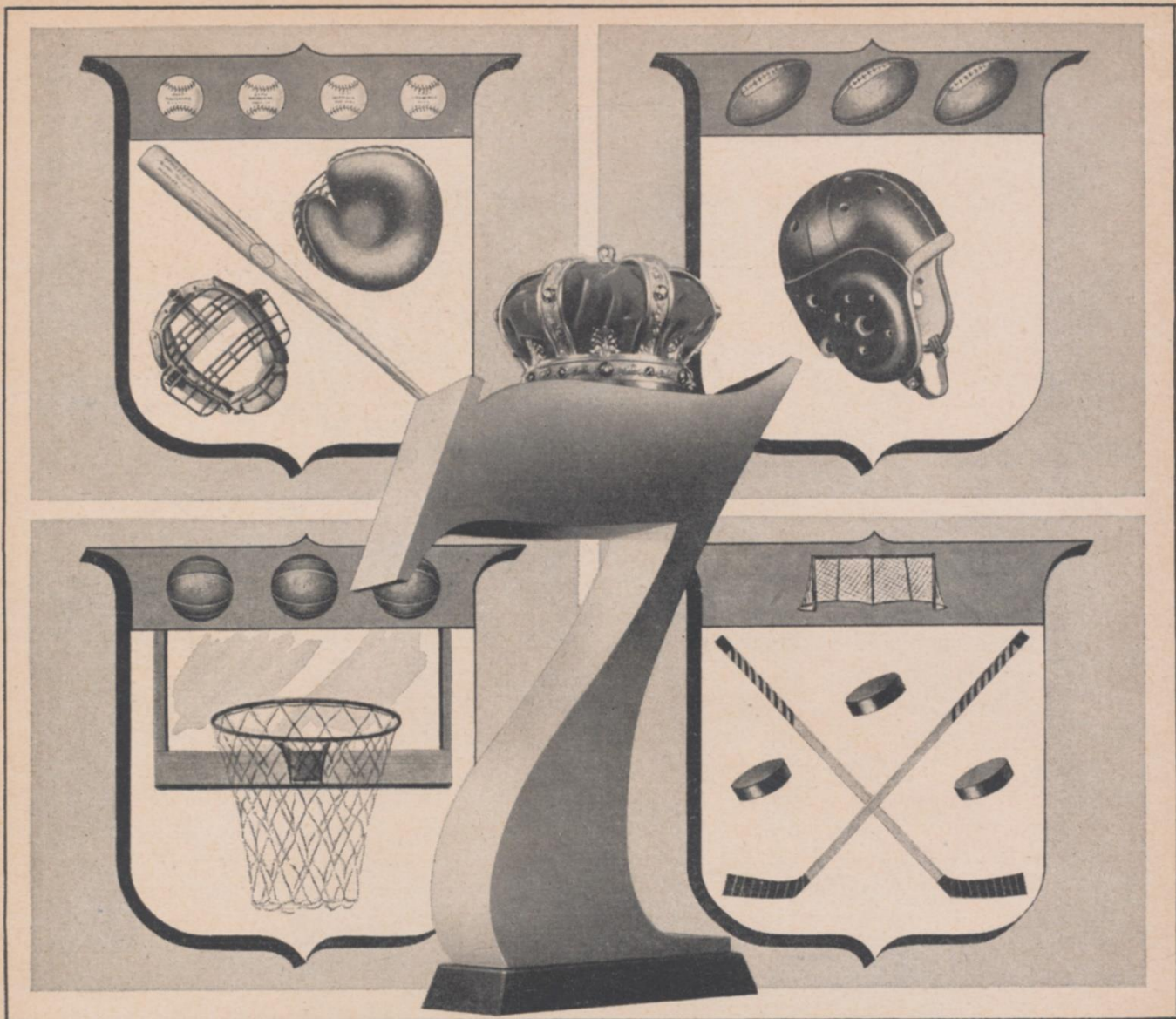

A big hand for Owen, even in this season of so few smiles from fickle old Lady Luck, a jade if ever there was one!

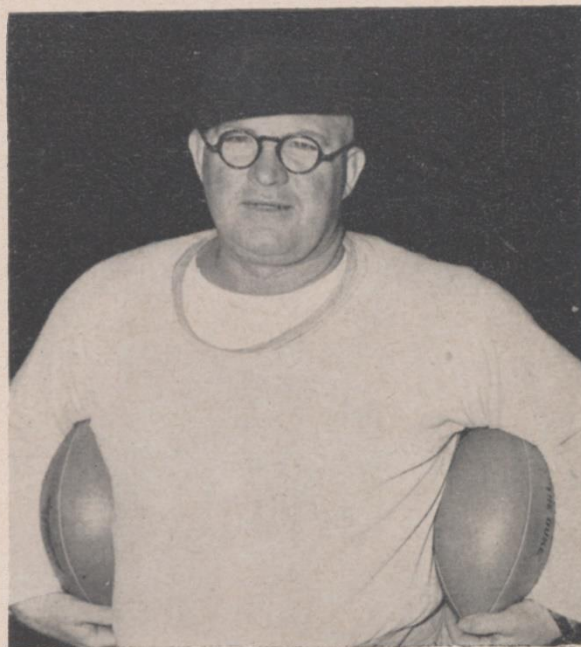

great. Perhaps the Cardinals will represent the West in the National League play-off, perhaps they will go on to the world championship. But how many times did Jimmy have to take some sharp lashes from the whip of Fortune? Right here at the Polo Grounds, too.

This is Conzelman's fifth year as coach of the Cardinals. He brings them into the Polo Grounds with 7 won and only 2 lost. His club has scored 200 points and allowed only 154.

Conzelman first gained football prominence at Washington University in St. Louis. After a fine career on that campus he coached the eleven to three Missouri Valley titles.

In pro football, Jimmy was coach of the Providence Steam Rollers when they took the National League title in 1928.

Conzelman is rated one of the greatest after dinner speaking wits in the United States. Actor, song writer, piano virtuoso, now football coaching tycoon, this Conzelman is a man of many facets, and many accomplishments.

GIANT OF WEEK LAURELS ACHIEVED BY RAY POOLE IN DRAWN BATTLE

OUR Giant of the Week is Ray Poole, the right end, who stood out so stridently in the 24-24 deadlock with the Green Bay Packers.

Poole scored one touchdown and had a lot to do with the setting up of another. He was a fine football player on attack and defense all afternoon, and lived up to the standards of the gridiron Pooles generously.

It was Poole's catch of a Paul Governali pass which gave the New York club its third touchdown, in the third period, and saw it take a 24-10 lead. It was a Poole reception from Pitching Paul which made possible the second Giant touchdown, in the opening quarter. Jim Blumenstock went over and the Polo Grounders had a 14-7 lead.

This drawn battle with the Packers brought back memories of the Giants' 21 to 21 draw with Curly Lambeau's outfit in 1942.

Four times the Giants hit that Packer line from the two-yard mark last Sunday and four times the Giants failed to put over what would have been the crusher, and one of the most satisfying triumphs in the long history of the New York club.

However, it was a vastly improved Giant team, and a New York machine which at long last could look to the peculiar Fates of the gridiron for an occasional smile.

Paul Governali, being honored with a "day," did a great job against the Packers. Governali has been improving steadily as a member of the New York club, and Steve Owen looks forward with keen avidity to the role which the Columbia alumnus will play with the revamped Giants of 1948.

Governali pitched two touchdown passes against the Green Bays. One went to Tex Coulter. In addition to the three touchdowns, the Giants got three extra points and a field goal from placement by Ken Strong. However, the Packers matched the Giants touchdown for touchdown, conversion for conversion, field goal for field goal, in a thriller typical of Giant-Packer history.

Ray Poole landed the Giant of the Week designation for the first time in his pro career. This is his first season with the New York club, to which he came from the University of Mississippi.

Ray is upholding the reputation of the Pooles in a spectacular way. It will be recollected that

Jim was an end for the Giants for six years, with great distinction, and that Barney was a great end for the West Pointers through two seasons of the Blanchard-Davis glory and currently leads the nation's pass receivers for ole Miss.

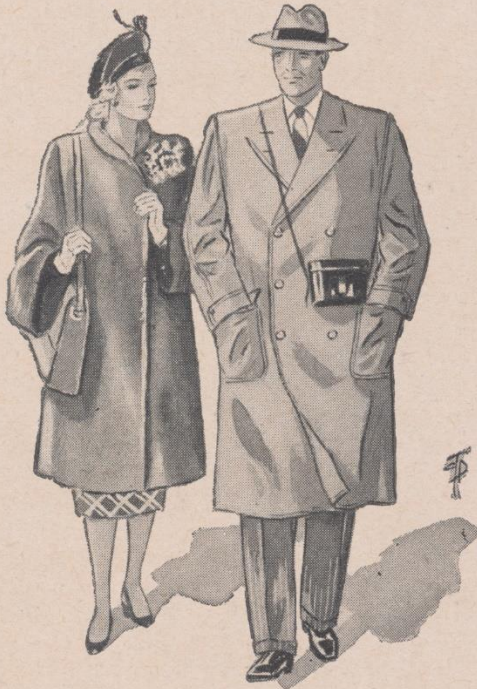
Ray is 25 years of age, weighs 215, and stands 6 feet 3 inches in height. He is one of those rare athletes who aspires to professional baseball glory as well as football success.

Poole was a great college pitcher at Mississippi and is slated to report to Cholly Grimm of the Chicago Cubs at Catalina Island next March. Ray makes his home in Oxford, Miss., near the university campus.

Jim Blumenstock, who scored one of those New York touchdowns against the Packers, is a familiar figure on local gridirons, as he starred for Fordham before he became a pro.

Tex Coulter, another touchdown scorer of last week, is one of the few West Pointers in pro football. Coulter started this season at his normal tackle position. When Steve Owen converted him into an end, Tex proceeded to attend to his new chores with all the elan and effectiveness which had marked his performances at tackle.

Slingin' Sammy Baugh, Great As Ever, Comes To Polo Grounds Next Sunday

WE WILL have with us at the Polo Grounds next Sunday one of the greatest football players of all time, Sammy Baugh, hero of the Washington Redskins, possibly the most remarkable passer the gridiron has seen, perennially spectacular, the sparkplug of the Washington Redskins.

No callow youth is this Samuel person. He was born on March 17, 1914, at Temple, Texas. That makes Samuel 33 years of age.

After having gained intercollegiate renown at Texas Christian, Baugh decided to go in for pro football.

It was in 1937 that Baugh came to the Redskins. George Marshall gave the Texan a bonus of \$500. This was considered opulent lagniappe at the time.

This is Baugh's eleventh season in the National League. And he is as great as ever.

Just examine what Baugh did only last Sunday, when Washington pulled one of the major upsets of the season with a smashing victory over the Chicago Cardinals, 45 to 21.

Baugh pitched only six touchdown passes. This against a team which went into action with the label, "defensive marvels of pro football."

In throwing those half dozen touchdowns, Slingin' Sam came within one of the record set by Sid Luckman of the Bears, November 14, 1943, against the Giants. Baugh pitched six touchdowns against Brooklyn on October 31, 1943.

In nine contests this season, Baugh has thrown 250 passes for 151 completions.

This means a new professional record. The old mark was made by Baugh in 1943 when he completed 149 out of 260, play-off included.

In completing 151 passes this year, Baugh has lifted his career total to 1145. With 250 throws this season, Samuel shows a grand total of 1989.

Next Sunday's game will come close to marking the eleventh anniversary of Baugh's first appearance in the Polo Grounds. This first invasion of Harlem by Sam came on December 5, 1937. It was a sad day for the Giants. With Baugh pitching 11 completions in 15 tries and Cliff Battles running 75 and then 76 yards for touchdowns, the Redskins won by 49 to 14.

Baugh went from that game into the play-off with the Bears in Chicago, and made two spectacular throws to Wayne Milner in a 28 to 21 triumph which gave the title to Washington in its first season in the National League.

Season after season, against the toughest competition football affords, Baugh has stood out brilliantly, the never-dimming star.

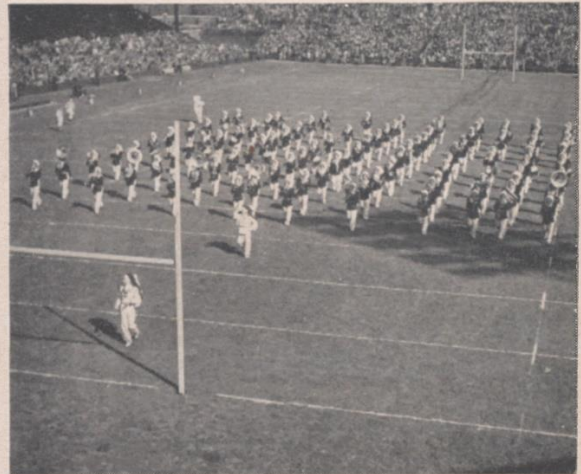

GIANTS FACE REDSKINS HERE NEXT SUNDAY



Redskin Marching Band

Next Sunday the Giants close their home season at the Polo Grounds against the Washington Redskins. This annual December clash is professional football's equivalent of such climactic Eastern college rivalries as Yale-Harvard and Army-Navy.

It is something new and different for the Giants and the Redskins to be meeting with little or nothing at stake. Ever since 1933, when the National League first was split into Eastern and Western divisions, one or the other of these teams has led its section, with the final decision as often as not resting on the result of this big battle at the Polo Grounds.

This year, for the first time, neither New York or Washington is in the championship fight. However, this turn of fortune's wheel does not detract one whit from the keenness of their rivalry. As far as both teams are concerned, this is the "make or break" game of the season and the sweetness of a victory will wash out of the bitter taste of other defeats.

An idea of the importance that Washington attaches to the contest is supplied by the fact that George Preston Marshall is bringing his celebrated Redskin Marching Band to New York for the game for the first time since 1941. This 100-piece band puts on one of the greatest shows in football. Also on hand to keep things stirred up, will be Washington's fanatical red-feathered followers, guaranteed to outdo the decibel output of any other cheering section in football.

With Sammy Baugh, the man who invented the forward pass, matching his talents against Paul Governali of the Giants, who is likely to improve on the patent before his throwing days are over, and both teams geared for a peak effort, the fastest action of the season is in prospect next Sunday at the Polo Grounds. For football thrills, you can't beat a game between the Giants and the Redskins!

CLOSE RACES IN BOTH DIVISIONS LEAVE PLAY-OFF CLUBS IN DOUBT

THE way things shape up in the National Football League right now it would take the seventh son of a seventh son of a prophesying genius to dope out the set-up for the East vs. West playoff which is set for December 21.

The Pittsburgh Steelers took a severe shellacking from the Chicago Bears last week, 49 to 7, but still hold the top spot in the Eastern half, with 7 won and 3 lost. The Philadelphia Eagles have a chance to move up over the Steelers today.

In the Western section it appears likely that the winner will not be decided until the Chicago Cardinals and the Chicago Bears meet on December 14.

The defeat of the Cardinals last week, 45 to 21, by the Washington Redskins, was caused by one of the biggest days in the brilliant career of Mr. Samuel Baugh.

In so far as offense is concerned, the Chicago Bears are the kings of the entire league. They had accumulated no fewer than 294 points when they encountered the Lions in Detroit on Thanksgiving Day. Sid Luckman still is the old Sid when it comes to throwing touchdown passes.

In so far as defensive effectiveness is concerned, the class of the National League is encompassed in the Chicago Cardinals, who have allowed only 154 points in nine contests. They have scored 200.

The fight for the defense laurels is close. Green Bay has allowed only 158 points, and Los Angeles 160.

CARDINALS TRAIL GIANTS IN ALL-TIME SERIES

The Chicago Cardinals, with one of the best teams in their history, will rate an edge over the Giants today but, even if they should happen to justify their status as pre-game favorites, they will be a long way from matching the Giants in their all-time rivalry.

Since 1926, the Giants have met the Cardinals thirteen times and the records show that the Polo Grounds club has won the decision on eleven occasions. The two Cardinal victories were registered in 1935, when the Redbirds squeezed through by a 14-13 count and in 1941, when their margin was 10-7.

The Giants won the first five times the teams met, lost once, won three times in a row, lost again and then compiled another string of three victories. They will be seeking to extend this streak today.

However, this year the representative of Chicago's South Side has avoided the pitfalls that have tripped up many another Cardinal eleven that has started the season with high hopes. As matters now stand, Jimmy Conzelman's team is very likely to make the grade for the first time as the National League's Western Division champion.

With three-fourths of the "dream backfield" that now is the talk of professional football, the Cardinals came mighty close to upsetting the Giants last year. They went down only by 28-24.

Now they have the sensational Charlie Trippi to work with Paul Christman, Marshall Goldberg and Pat Harder and they are confident that this combination will bring them their third triumph over the Giants.

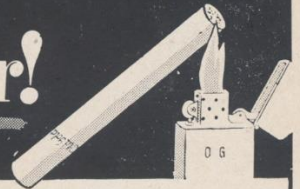

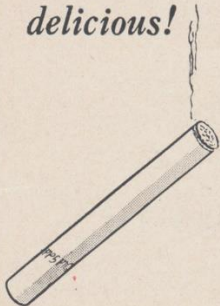

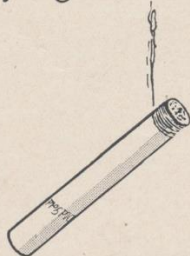
