

VICTOR LEROY (Dick) BALTZELL-Fullback

Selected as All-Central Conference and All-Kansas fullback in 1933, Dick Baltzell again covered himself with glory for Southwestern College in 1934, then upon graduation in 1935 with A.B. degree, signed for backfield duty with the Boston Redskins. He was born June 22, 1912, in Soda Springs Idaho, and is 5 feet 111/2 inches tall, weighing 210. Baltzell is of German-Irish descent with blue eyes and brown hair; single, and lives at Hallam, Neb. He saw action as a backfield player for the Hebron, Neb., high school eleven in 1927-28-29, then enrolled at Southwestern, where he was tutored during 1931-'32-'33-'34 by Wm, Monypeny, During the 1934 campaign he turned in numerous classy feats of kicking, on one occasion



standing four yards behind his own line to boot the oval out of bounds on the College of Emporia's 10 yard stripe. Dick likewise, has taken a fling at baseball, basketball, track swimming and golf. His hobby is travel, physical culture and taking motion pictures.

BRYON (Red) STICKLES-Guard



Bryon Stickles was born, March 18, 1910 in Groton, N.Y., and is 6 feet 2 inches tall weighing 205. He is of Holland descent, with red hair and blue eyes; single, and lives in Groton, N. Y. Stickles played with Groton High School in '23-'24-'25-'26 and was All-State Guard 3 years. He entered St. Lawrence U. in 1927 and saw action as a center, and won recognition as one of the best roving centers in the East during his stay 1927 to 1931. Upon graduating, was signed to play with Rochester Pros. in 1932. Starred with Paterson Giants in 1933, and played with Panthers last year, this being his second year with the Panthers. A favorite with the local fans, a rough and tumble guard, known for his daring play. His hobby is traveling and hunting,
