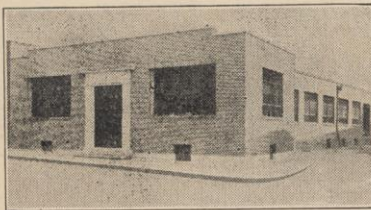

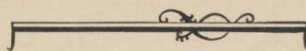

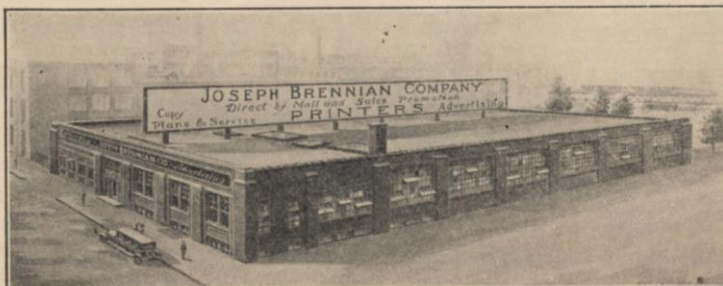

## Eskimos Thaw Under Fire of Jackets

FRANKFORD'S GOAL LINE STAND FEATURE OF THE GAME

Ernie Nevers is a fullback among fullbacks, a star of the first magnitude. But he can be and was stopped. The Frankford Yellow Jackets proved that point last Saturday to the delight of 6000 fans at the Frankford Stadium.

Nevers treated the forward wall of the Northeast eleven as harshly as any pro team he has faced this year. But in the end, the team play of the Jackets dominated. It produced a 10-0 victory—the eighth league conquest of the campaign and the third in succession.

Nevers bucked his way through the winner's line for considerable yardage. But when a yard meant a touchdown, he was spilled twice from the goal line.

This brilliant stand was made late in the second quarter. Very late, indeed, as the umpire's horn sounding the ending of the half came after Nevers' second attempt—and Duluth still had two more downs to negotiate the scanty distance.

This remarkable stonewall defense, due to its importance and the time in which it was

made, was the real high light of a rather colorless game. Colorless because the usual thrills were missing.

Frankford met a real foe in the Western aggregation. As far as ground gaining was concerned, it held a slight edge on the gayly decorated Eskimos. But its lone touchdown was due to one of the breaks of the game.

"Swede" Youngstrom, Dartmouth star of several years ago, was the hero in its manufacture. The blond guard leaped into the ozone in the first quarter, plucked out an aerial tossed by Nevers and dashed to the goal line, 18 yards away.

The the reliable right toe of Johnny Budd, his running mate at guard, booted the pigskin over the bars for the seventh point.

Not satisfied with that point, Budd, who is out for scoring honors among the Frankford players, kicked a field goal from the 28-yard line in the third period, bringing his total for the day to four, and for the season to twenty-six. This is one less than the number held by Hap Moran, the pace-setter.

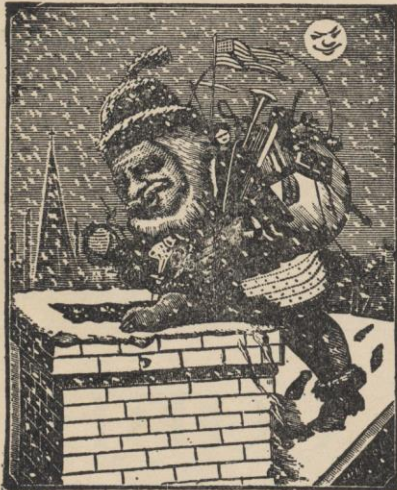

## The Old Timers' Reunion

Saturday was another gala day. The game was — well everybody knows what it was. Every game gets better apparently, if such a thing is possible, although it will take some game to beat the Eskimo contest.

Every week the fans have something of interest presented to them and the crowd seems to enjoy this feature. Saturday showed something unique in football, in the appearance of an old team on the field.

There was something more than just an interesting item of publicity or entertainment for spectators. It was an actual reunion of these men who had not been together in a body for years. It was a real demonstration of what this community does in the way of sport. It originates, produces, carries on and it is always worth while.

This aggregation was not only the original professional team in Frankford, but it was the practical commencement of professional football. The old 1899 team of the Frankford Athletic Association of that time was of the calibre of the present Yellow Jacket team of the present Association.

A picture of the team was taken and another picture was taken Saturday of the same team on the Yellow Jacket field.

A surprising feature was that of the sixteen men in the original picture, fifteen were present, and looked capable of holding their end up despite some gray hairs. The absentee was Harry McCormick, who was detained by the Army-Notre Dame game.

Lew Hornberger came from Toronto, Canada; Phil Griffith, from National Park,

New Jersey; Bob Latimer, from Wildwood; Frank King, from Glenside; Frank Lippincott, from Medford, New Jersey; Charlie Heard, from Holmesburg; Clarence Swope and Bill Riddell from West Philadelphia, and Billy Castor from Germantown. The others, Ed Gilmour, George Gilmore, Bill Bratton, Harry Schumacker, Bill Mason and Bert Conn are all living in Frankford and are rooters for the present team.

It also marked his sixth field goal in nine league frays, which stamped him as the outstanding kicker in the National League ranks. The victory keeps the Jackets right at the heels of the Chicago Bears, the lone league team still unbeaten.

While Nevers was the center for all Frankford eyes, another Duluthian backfield luminary gave the real exhibition of ball-toting. He was Fitz-gibbons, the agile halfback, whose squirming and dodging tactics in eluding tacklers was as brilliant as has been seen on the Frankford field this season.

Fitz-gibbons gained more ground than did his celebrated teammate. But the two failed to work consistently. And the long aerial game which Duluth employed when stopped proved of no avail.

## Green Bay Packers Thanksgiving Day Attraction

LIKE FRANKFORD, HAVE COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION PROFITS FOR  
BENEFIT OF AMERICAN LEGION POST OF GREEN BAY

The Green Bay Packers, who come here Thanksgiving Day, have been in the National Football League since 1921. In that time the Badger State champions have won 34 games, lost fifteen and tied eight games. In twenty of the games the big Bay Blues held their opponents scoreless. The Packers have never finished lower than seventh position in the percentage table.

The Big Bay Blues have been champions of Wisconsin since 1918 and in '21 laid claim to titular honors in the Northwest, which they have held ever since.

The Packers are shown as "The pro team with the college spirit." Every member of the team either lives in Green Bay or within motoring distance. The Packer management aims to get "all year" jobs for the football players. Captain Lambeau, Mathys, McAuliffe, Lewellen, O'Donnell, Woodin, Harris, Earp and Jean reside in Green Bay, Kotal and Basing hang their hat in Appleton, only 30 miles away, while permanent positions have been found for the majority of the newcomers, including Liberg, Cyre, Cahoon, Enright and Carlson.

The Big Bay Blues of 1926 have new faces in the lineup. These players are Flaherty, Cyre, Cahoon, Lidberg, Purdy,

Weslyn, McAuliffe, Enright and Carlson.

Captain Lambeau has been with the team since 1919. Mathys, Woodin, Gardner and Earpe donned the blue jersey in 1922. Basing made his debut in 1923 while Lewellen, O'Donnell and Rossatti were additions in 1924. Kotal and Jean were added to the battle front in 1925 along with Harris and Abramson.

The Packers practice every morning in the week and a fine is imposed upon the players who fail to report for the daily drill. Blackboard talks are held two nights a week.

Although Green Bay is the smallest city in the Pro League, Community support enables the Packer management to keep its head up with the big fellows. Green Bay takes its Packers as Princeton its Tigers and from September until December the natives do little else but talk, eat and sleep football.

The Green Bay Corporation owners of the Packers is an organization composed of leading business men, Stockholders include nearly every football fan in the city.

The Corporation is a non-profit organization and any profits made during the football season are turned over to the American Legion Post of Green Bay.
