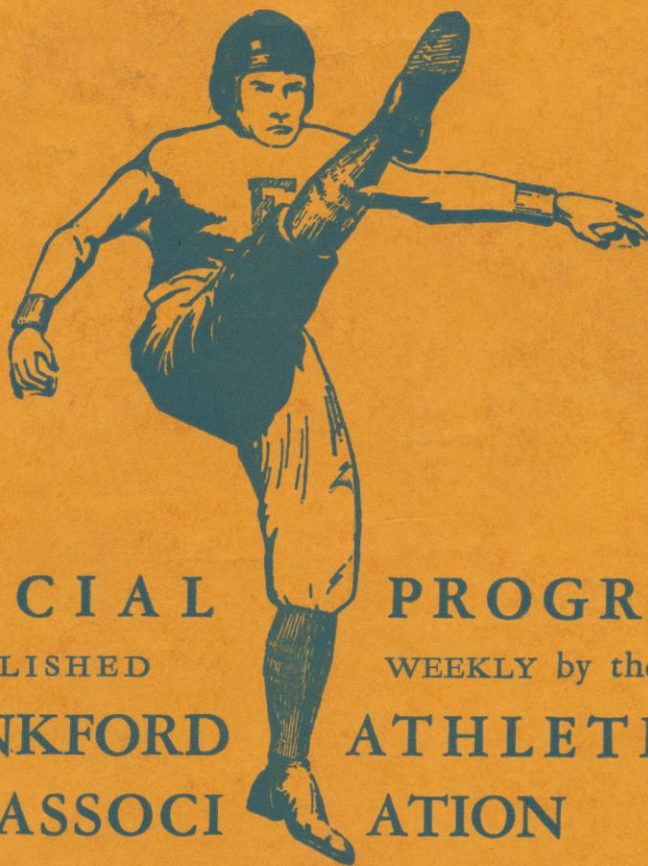

## Today's Game Real Test For Jackets

*Dayton Accepts Challenge for Return Tilt. Surprise Planned for Jinx.*

We think the scheduling of Dayton for today's game was a good move on the part of the association. We are sure that you were not at all satisfied with the outcome of the opening game, and today's game should be a good test for the Yellow Jackets. Gary, who it was thought, would enter the league was originally scheduled for today, but when they did not go in the league the game was cancelled. This left an open date. Red Grange and his New York Yankees were taken in the league after all schedules were completed. Our Schedule Committee immediately offered him this date and the same was approved by President Carr.

At the Special Meeting of the league called in Cleveland for the express purpose of arrang-

ing Red's schedule, Mr. Pyle objected to this early date stating frankly that it was too early in the season and he did not want to take a chance with such a powerful club as the Yellow Jackets. Naturally this still left October 8 open and we think in bringing back the Dayton Jinx it will give you an opportunity of seeing a wonderful comeback by the Jackets.

Dayton, intent on scoring another victory, will start with the same line as in the opening game, but the backfield will be different.

Tays will start at quarter in place of Mahr, Partlow and Sillin at halfback instead of Cabrina and Achui, and Britton will again be seen at fullback.

The Frankford Yellow Jackets have initiated a broadcasting period known as the "Yellow-Jacket Huddle," through station WFI, Strawbridge and Clothier, Philadelphia. The Jackets go on the air every Friday night, 7.15.

The Duluth Eskimos had little trouble beating the Virginia, Minn. Miners, 24 to 0, in a non-league game. The northerners played without Nevers, who was finishing his baseball season. The Rooney brothers starred for Duluth.

Pottsville bumped into a rude surprise when the Chicago Cardinals trimmed them 19 to 7. The Maroons scored in the opening minute of play but after that they only made three first downs during the argument.

A field goal and safety was the margin by which the Providence Steamrollers took Buffalo into camp. The Bisons looked much better than at Pottsville the week before but at that the Rhode Islanders held a slight edge.

### Jackets Hit Stride Downing New Britain Last Saturday--21-0

*"Hap" Moran Stars in Comeback.*

Aching with the sting of defeat administered the local eleven by the Dayton jinx in the opening game, the Yellow Jackets entered the battle last Saturday with victory the goal. Hitting the championship stride, they sure staged a comeback, beating New Britain 21-0. "Hap" Moran, one of last year's mainstays, was the individual star of the fray.

Shortly after the first period began, New Britain was fighting with her back to the wall. Instead of punting out of danger, they chose to run the ball, and a fumble resulted; Frankford recovered it. On the first play Moran took it over and added the extra point. Again in the fourth period it was "Hap" who provided the most sensational feature of the game. Grabbing Moynihan's long pass, Moran, aided by splendid interference, raced 40 yards through New Britain's team for another six pointer, again adding the extra point.

The other touchdown came in the second period. Frankford was in possession of the ball on her own 20-yard line. They immediately opened up with an offensive, consisting of aeriels and line crashes which completely swept the New Englanders off their feet. Moynihan, Wilcox and Donohoe passed stripe after stripe, until Donohoe crossed the final chalk mark, Ed. Weir kicking the goal.

All during the game, Assistant Coach Moran made numerous substitutions, in order to find out his best men before cutting down his squad. But in spite of this, the smooth Jacket machine rolled on.

Kendrick was the star of the Connecticut eleven, his punts many times driving the Jackets back and his passes several times menacing the Frankford goal lines.

## Jackets Again Trim New Britain in Sunday Tilt---22-0

*Entire Team Displayed Wonderful Teamwork and Held Upper Hand at All Times.*

Last Sunday the Yellow Jackets traveled to New Britain, Conn.,—"The Hardware City of the World"—to play a return game, which resulted in another victory—22-0.

A crowd of about 3,500 were present and the Frankford team was given a rousing cheer when they came on the field, the greatest ever received on a foreign gridiron.

The first score came 3 minutes after start of play, the result of a beautiful aerial attack which carried the ball to the 5-yard line, from where "Hap" Moran took it over. "Hap" missed the try for point.

Homan scored the second six-pointer on a pass, Moran kicking the goal.

The third touchdown was again the result of an overhead offensive—Moynihan scoring, Moran again missing the goal.

Just before the end of the half, Rogers, who had replaced Wilcox, received a pass and dashed 30 yards for a touchdown—only to be re-called because the officials ruled he stepped out of bounds.

In the second half the team slowed up owing

to the excessive heat, but "Hap" Moran managed to kick a placement goal from the 46-yard line.

The entire backfield played a bang-up game. Molinet showed lots of stuff hitting the line and receiving passes. The line also did its share, in fact the entire squad displayed wonderful spirit and teamwork.

At no time during the entire game was New Britain within Frankford's 30-yard line.

About the middle of the first half the entire backfield was changed. Quarterback, Moynihan; Halfbacks, Molinet and Mercer; Fullback, Wilcox. Later Rogers replaced Wilcox. On the line Montgomery for Ed. Weir; Davis for Filak and Youngstrom for Connaughton.

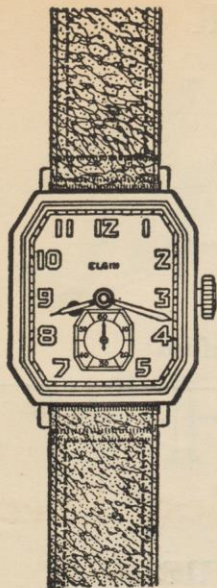

### New Britain Not Cheap Team

*Costs as Much as League Team.*

No doubt many of you have wondered why last week's game wasn't with a league team. You, no doubt, know that this year the League was cut to twelve clubs and with Frankford playing thirteen home games it was necessary to schedule one outside team. The Association's aim is to give their fans the best football possible and New Britain was reported to be the best professional football team outside of the League, and so they were scheduled. Incidentally it cost just as much and we are not sure, but we think maybe a little bit more to bring New Britain here, as it would a member of the League. So you see it was with the idea of putting on a good football game and not the saving of any money that the game was scheduled.

A large crowd was on hand in Cleveland to see Benny Friedman's Bulldogs and the New York Giants battle to a 0-0 tie game. Despite the lack of scoring, the gridders uncorked plenty of thrills for the spectators.

Failure to kick the goal after touchdown forced the Green Bay Packers to stub their toe before the Chicago Bears, 7 to 6. This was a grudge battle and the officials earned their money trying to keep peace in the family.

### Officials Appointed By League

A most unusual occurrence Saturday was Referee Hughitt's reversal of Umpire Harmon's decision that a forward pass, intercepted by a New Britain player, had been trapped and grounded.

Hughitt overruled Harmon, although the umpire is supposed to make decisions of the kind. New Britain was allowed the huge gain and the incident goes down as one of the first of its kind here in many years.

We know there are a great many fans who do not like Tommy Hughitt's refereeing. They contend he always favors Frankford's opponent. Before officiating Hughitt was a player and a good one at that. For a great many years he was the mainstay of Buffalo's backfield and appeared with them against Frankford when he was in his prime. Incidentally the clubs do not have anything to do with the officials. They are selected by President Carr and oftentimes it is the Friday before the game before the clubs know who will officiate. It is President Carr's ambition to secure the best officials possible in order to keep the game beyond reproach and every one officiating is supposed to be absolutely neutral.

Red Grange and his New York Yankees, got off on the right foot in the National League pennant chase by defeating the fast going Dayton Triangles 7 to 3. It was a battle all the way with both teams showing good football.

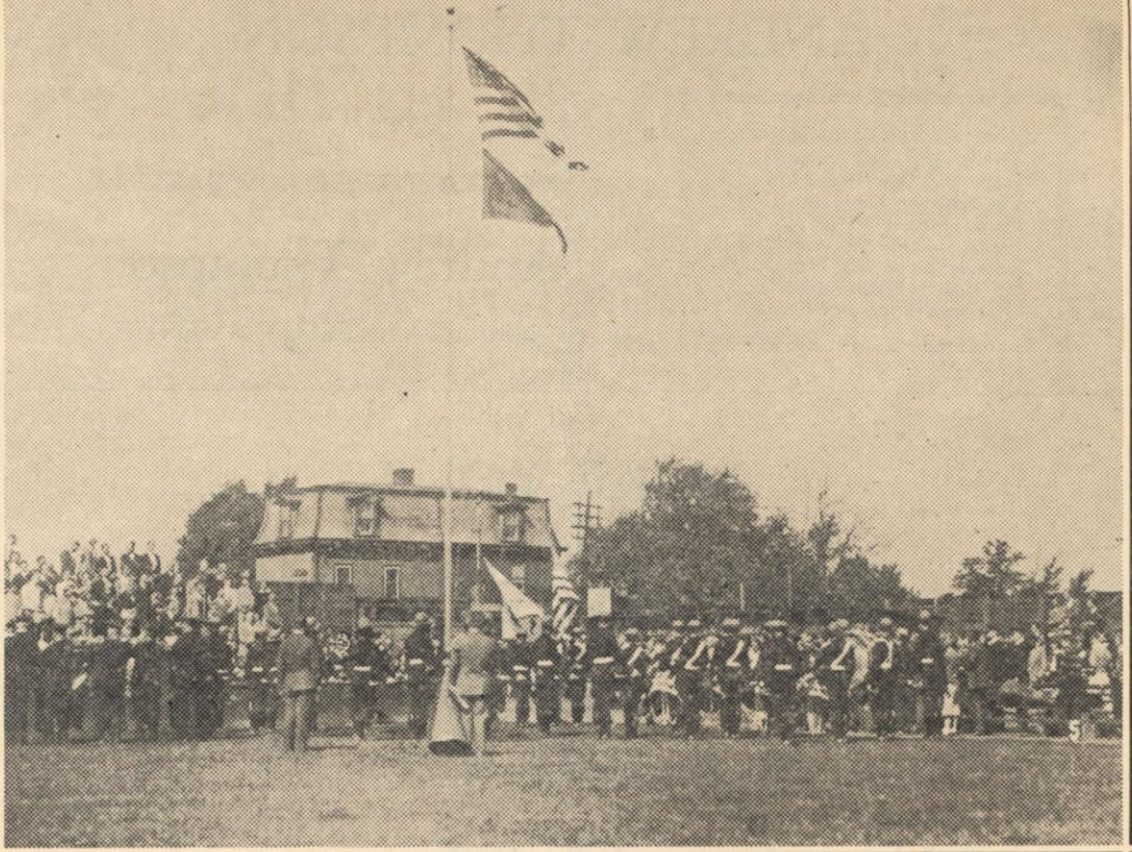

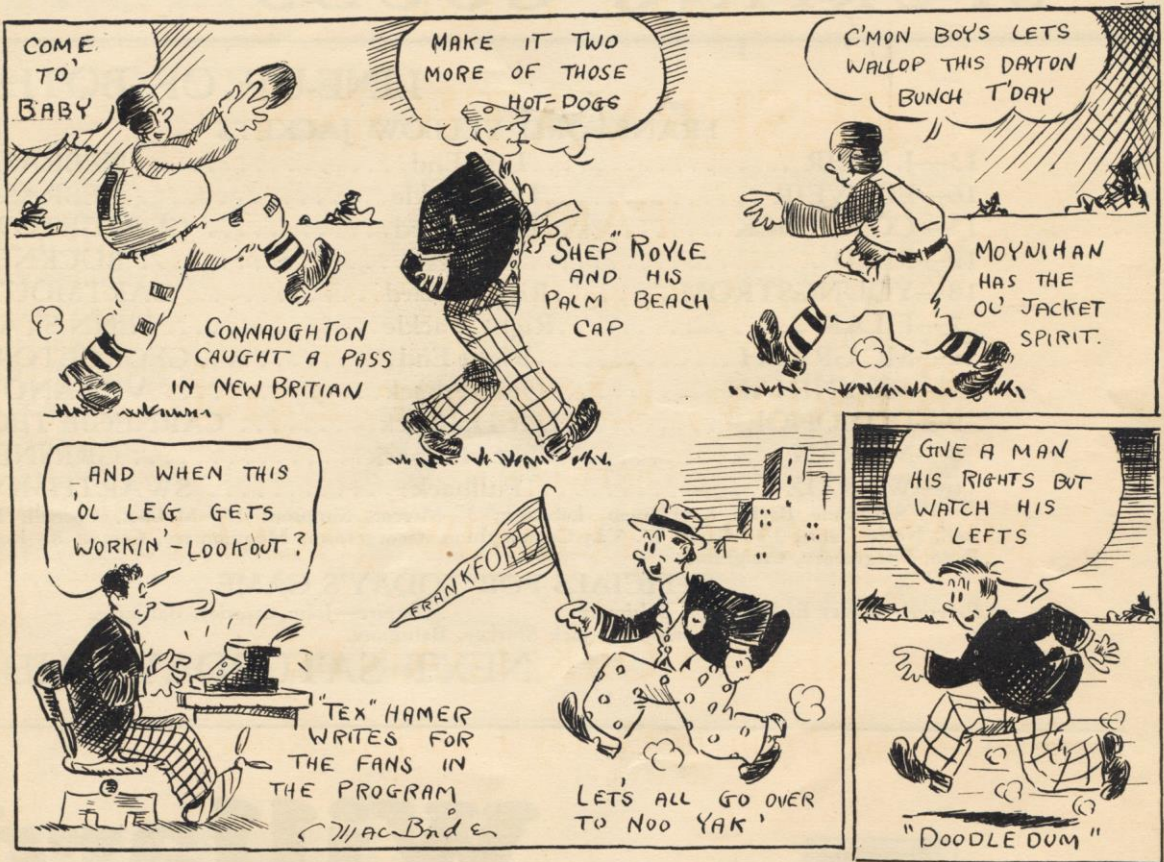

Coach Tom Moran, who is watching the physical condition of the players closely, is yearning for colder weather, although he admits that the weather has been a help to a certain extent in getting his players down to weight.

The members of the local eleven dropped a total of 225 pounds in their two games with New Britain on Saturday and Sunday. Pud Connaughton led with twenty-eight, but the big boy is not twenty-eight pounds lighter than he was when he started Saturday's fray, for over Saturday night and since Sunday he has gained nearly twenty pounds, but at that Connaughton is lighter than at any time since he has been playing football.

## Street Improvements Necessitate New Route to Grounds

CHARLES STREET DIRECT THOROUGHFARE TO STADIUM

The street conditions are very poor surrounding the stadium, as you have no doubt noticed. Frankford Avenue is torn up from Bridge Street north and is likely to be in this condition for some time. Automobiles coming from the west on the north and south streets like Frankford Avenue and Roosevelt Boulevard, should turn east on Pratt Street to Duffield, north on Duffield to Bridge, east on Bridge to Charles and north on Charles to the cinder driveway of the stadium. Traffic from the north and south streets, like

Tacony and Torresdale Avenue, should turn west on Comly and Bridge Streets to Charles and north on Charles to the grounds. Robbins Avenue may be used in good weather but there is a bad crossing at Frankford Avenue and there is no street cut in from Robbins Avenue to the grounds. At Devereaux Street there is no paving, consequently in wet weather there is likely to be mud in that locality. Trolley service on Frankford Avenue Line 66 will run as usual past the grounds.

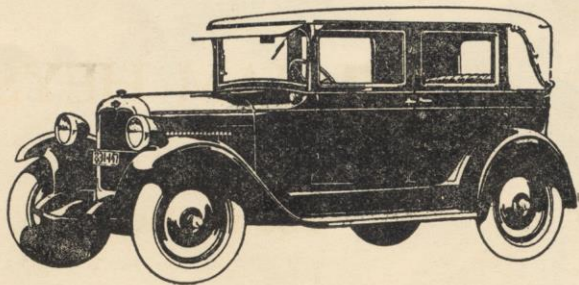
