Foreword

THE GIANTS' ELEVEN—1926 MODEL

The Giants—New York's first professional league eleven—starts its second home season confident of winning the National League title and also providing some of the best played and most exciting football the big town has ever seen.

In preparation to meet some of the strongest teams in the country the Giants have been materially strengthened by the addition of several of the greatest college stars in recent years.

Foremost in this group is Wally Koppisch, former three times captain of Columbia and one of the best known heroes in the history of Blue and White football. Koppisch, very fast and dangerous as a ball carrier and a veritable stone wall on defense, already has become a major part of the Giants' machine.

Another newcomer who is certain to be an instant hit with local fans is "Jack Rabbit" Haggerty, whose brilliant playing for Georgetown defeated Fordham in a memorable battle last season. When the Giants work within scoring range of their opponents' goal this year—watch Jack Haggerty.

"Tillie" Voss, out on end, is another valuable addition to the home squad. Voss comes from Detroit and has few equals as an end in the National League.

John Alexander, formerly of Rutgers, and "Steve" Owen, Oklahoma, are new tackles, who already have emblazoned their names on the football roll of honor.

And another new change is in the coaching system. Joe Alexander, former All-American at Syracuse and a New York boy, has assumed the assignment of coaching the Giants into the league championship.

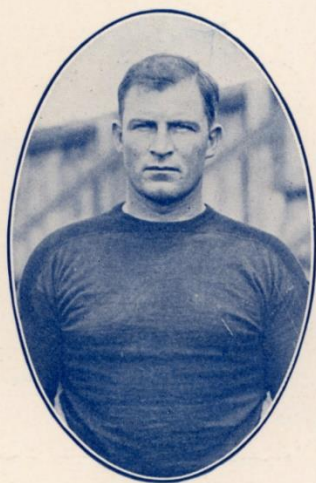
