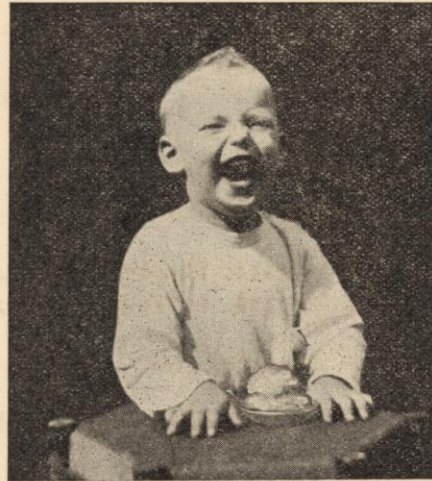

The New Haven, Conn., Club which plays here today is the first team representing the Down East section ever to play football in Philadelphia on an independent gridiron.

In booking Manager Marty Connor's squad, Manager Bowker, of Frankford, had in mind the settling of an argument which developed too late last season to allow it to be settled at that time. Frankford, by reason of its undefeated record against most of the big Eastern teams and the pick of the Western League of Professional Football Clubs claimed the professional championship.

The New Haven manager vehemently disputed these claims. His club was undefeated and generally recognized as the class of the New England district.

The game today was arranged too early in the season to suit either Bowker or Connor, but conflicting schedules prohibited a later engagement, so they decided to settle the question of this year's supremacy at once.

After making a fair catch, no player can be thrown to the ground.

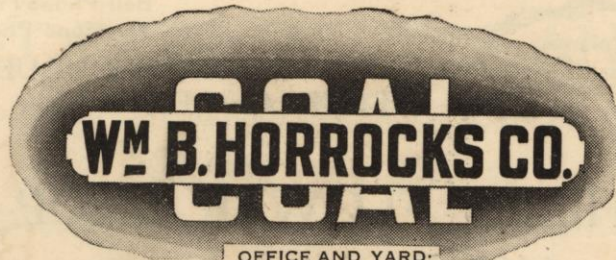
In making a forward pass, no player of the side attempting it who has crossed the scrimmage line can touch an opponent until the ball itself has been touched, except when he is trying to catch or bat the ball himself.

And no player of the opposing team, after the pass is made, can interfere with an eligible player who has crossed the scrimmage line until the ball is touched except when trying to bat or catch the ball himself.

The ball is not allowed to be passed or thrown towards the opponents' goal by a member of the team which did not put the ball in play.

Big Lou Kauffman, who played fullback for the Yellow Jackets a few years ago, is still playing exceptional football.

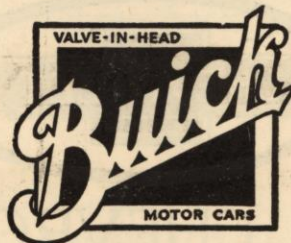

Boynton may be gone for a while, but Frankford fans won't soon forget the former Williams College luminary's work on the Yellow Jacket gridiron.

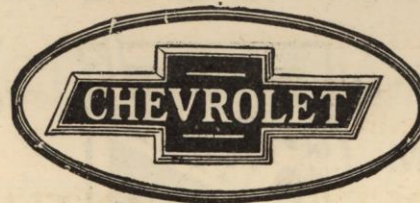


