GIANTS TOPPLE DODGERS TO KEEP SECOND

Although Uncle Robbie and his Brooklyn Robins had things pretty nearly their own way on the diamond whenever they met their intercity rivals, McGraw's Giants, it took Tim Mara's football Giants to prove their worth over their Brooklyn rivals on the gridiron.

When the professional grid Dodgers opened their series with their neighboring rivals last Sunday, it appeared as though the Flock was going to continue to hold their jinx over the Giants, for they handed the New Yorkers a 7 to 6 plastering in the first game of the series.

However it was a tired Giant eleven they met, a team that had come through three tough games that week and were much the worse from the battering they received. The Giants knew inwardly they were the Flocks superior on the gridiron and this amply demonstrated, yesterday afternoon at Ebbetts Field, before a crowd of 20,000.

Good Old Benneh

By virtue of the victory the Giants retained second place in the National Professional Football League and the Dodgers remained just behind in third place.

Although Benny Friedman saw very little action in the game, it was he who was responsible for the first touchdown. Benneh sat on the sideline during most the game in the capacity of the coach except for a short spell in the second period. However, that was all that was necessary, for once he wound up that powerful throwing arm and heaved a 25-yard pass from midfield to Burnett, who caught it and tore to the ten stripe, it required three line bucks for Friedman to cross the goal line. Friedman then proceeded to kick the goal from a place kick.

That would have been enough for the Dodgers, who were finding the forwards of their opponents a difficult proposition, but late in the final period Sedbrooke flipped a 25-yard pass to Campbell, who sprinted three more before being dragged down.

Red Cagle entered the game at the beginning of the second quarter and remained in the game just long enough to allow the spectators to see what he looked like. Cagle caught a short pass from Hagerty and the Dodgers applied to much pressure when they tackled him to his ribs and he retired in favor of Moran.

A swell kicking duel was held between Mooney of the Dodgers and Burnett of the Giants, with the former holding a comfortable edge. Mooney was rushed by the Giants forwards, but never once had a kick blocked. However, the Giants ran back the Brooklyn's punts far better than the Dodgers ran back Burnett's so that evens matters up.

Late in the third period the Dodgers made their one serious attempt to score, when they marched the entire length of the field on spinner plays, with Stumpy Thomason lugging the ball most of the time, to the Giants one foot line. At this point, however, the Giants forwards braced and Wiberg, after three others had failed, tried his luck only to fall short of the distance by inches.
