For Your Convenience and Your Protection

There's a right way and a wrong way to do everything. Usually the right way is the easiest. Take leaving the stadium following the game for instance.

Thus far a kind Providence has prevented anyone from being trampled. But there has been just enough of the thoughtless "After me you come first" attitude, to displease many of our patrons, to say nothing of actually endangering their right to life, liberty and pursuit of happiness.

Maybe it's not as bad as that but the stadium management would be derelict in its duties if it did not caution against too much crowding after the games. We also would like to take occasion to point out a few fundamentals regarding exits—exits which after all are for your convenience and your protection.

You will find five exits handy. Car owners who park their cars on the high school lot to the west of the stadium will kindly leave by the west fence exit immediately north of the stadium. If you park your car east of the stadium leave by the east fence gate directly east of the north end of the bleachers. Any of three exits will be handy for you if you parked your car north of the stadium or on streets leading to the stadium. In these instances choose one of the three exits at the main entrance. And please don't push, shove or crowd your neighbor as you file out even if we win 50 to 0. Thank you.







With but a few seconds to go, the score 13 to 7 in favor of the Giants, "Press" shot a pass to Alford for the touchdown which won for Ironton. Officials give these signals when penalties are meted out:

- (1)—Military salute—roughing—15 yards.
- (2)—Hands on hips—offside—5 yards.
- (3)—Grasping one wrist—holding—(by offense) 15 yards (by defense) 15 yards.
- (4)—Pushing movement of hands to front with arms not swinging from shoulder-pushing-15 yards.
- (5)—Crossing hands and arms in horizontal plane, incomplete pass—5 yards on 2nd, 3rd or 4th incomplete forward pass in 4 downs. Also means missed goal or no play.
- (6)—Pushing hands forward from shoulders with hands vertical-interference with forward pass (also pass
- which touches ineligible player)-if defense interferes offense gets ball at point of foul.
- (7)-Making a horizontal arc of either hand-player illegally in motion-5 yards; in shift or huddle plays -15yards.
- (8)-Folded arms means side refuses to take penalty.
- (9)-Extending both arms above head-a score, touchtouchdown, 6 points or drop or place kick, 3 points except for single point after touchdown. If palm of hands are brought together the score is a safety,
- (10)—Waving one hand behind back—illegal forward pass.


