

Come the Rams

ANOTHER Western invader comes to Brooklyn next Sunday. The Rams from Cleveland, who opened up the season demonstrating what promised to be the most colorful team in the League, present the sensational rookie of the year in Jack Jacobs, the Indian halfback from Oklahoma. Jacobs proved to be a coach's dream, a star passer, ball toter, and a kicker. So good was he that he took the team leadership away from Parker Hall, who wore not only Club but League leading honors as a passer and ball carrier. The career of Jacobs apparently has only begun, because he has continued in every game to star as a scorer and passer.

An indication of what the Cleveland Club can accomplish is found in last Sunday's score when the team registered four touchdowns against the strongly defensive Green Bay Packers. Only the Chicago Bears have scored that many points against the Green Bay Club, and thus it may be determined that Cleveland has a star offensive team. This sort of scoring certainly indicates exciting contests, and on that premise the Rams have been enjoying abundant favor.

On Brooklyn's part, though the team apparently has not been enjoying smiles from Dame Fortune, its play is steadily bettering and its fans may confidently expect to see a brilliant demonstration of post graduate football.

WHILE there is no need to enlarge upon the attractiveness of the game on the Sunday following, November 8th, when the Chicago Bears come to Brooklyn for their only visit to Greater New York this season, the importance of the visit is alive in the minds of metropolitan fans. The demand for seats has excelled anything ever revealed for Brooklyn football games.

Those planning to attend most certainly should procure their seats well in advance to have good locations. While it is a fact that every seat in this park is a good one, allowing splendid view of the game from any location, fans will have their preferences. To get any location near these preferences, it will be absolutely necessary to purchase tickets before the day of the game.

There is a force of ticket sellers at hand in the Baseball Ticket Offices at 215 Montague Street, who eliminate any delays at the windows. Out-of-town buyers should send in their remittances promptly. A force of mail order clerks is taking care of these orders so that they are in the mail within an hour of their receipt. There will be no change of prices for this game, the reserved seats selling for \$2.20 and \$1.65. There are plenty of good box seats available at \$3.30 and \$2.20.


