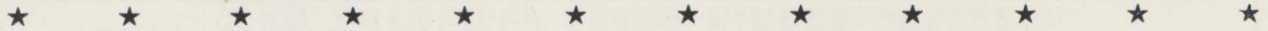

Nomadic Giants are NFL Title Threat

More than 10,000 miles of traveling—with 3,000 to go—will be behind the New York Giants when they take on the San Francisco 49ers here today.

The nomadic Giants, strong favorites to end Cleveland's six-year reign in the Eastern division of the National Football League, have been riding planes, trains and busses since leaving their training camp at St. Michael's College, Winooski, Vt., the first week of August.

Football adherents in such far-flung communities as Boston, Green Bay, Seattle, Portland, Dallas and Memphis have witnessed the power, speed and deception welded into this 1956 New York team by Coach Jim Lee Howell and his capable assistants. Despite the travel and unfamiliar surroundings week after week, the Giants won four out of six pre-season games, including a 21 to 14 decision over the 49ers at Portland.

This won-loss record, with such an itinerary, is unique in league annals for in football, as in baseball, a .500 record on the road is considered excellent.

All scouting reports come up with the same answers—the Giants have both passing and running strength offensively and a big, veteran defensive unit. Howell can summon three brilliant passers and signal-callers in Charley Conerly, Don Heinrich and Bobby Clatterbuck. Their aerials are caught by Ken MacAfee and Bob Schnelker, a pair of ends who can ably perform the added chore of blocking for the ground attack.

Few clubs in the league can boast of such ball-carriers as Frank Gifford, Kyle Rote, Mel Triplett and Alex Webster. Their way is

cleared by interior linemen like Roosevelt Brown, Dick Yelvington, Jack Stroud, Bill Austin and Ray Wietecha.

The defensive line is anchored by Dick Modzelewski, 260 pounds, and Roosevelt Grier, 275. An old 49er nemesis, Andy Robustelli, formerly of the Rams, is, without a doubt, the best defensive end in football.

Facing such an array of talent, it is evident that the 49ers will have to be the type of San Francisco club that humbled Cleveland and lost a thriller to Los Angeles. A showing similar to those against the Chicago Cardinals and Philadelphia would be catastrophic today.

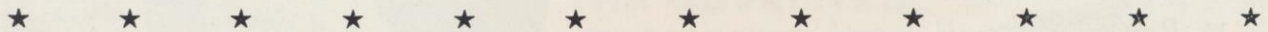
Perhaps the return of Bill Johnson, a real "old pro," and good health for Billy Wilson, Joe Perry and Hugh McElhenny will provide oxygen for 49er hopes.

The loyal fans who have established a new record for season tickets—18,000—may perceive a favorable omen in the 3-3 preseason record. It was even poorer in 1953—2-3-1—and that club went on to compile nine victories against only three losses during the regular season.

The record book shows that the Giants have dealt unkindly with San Francisco in four of the five previous meetings. The New Yorkers took the only league game, 23-14, at the Polo Grounds in 1952. They repeated with a 28-21 victory in a 1953 preseason game.

McElhenny sparked the 49ers to their only triumph, 43-35, at Kezar in 1954. The Giants won, 28-17, at Seattle last year, and added the lacing at Portland three weeks ago.

Head for the Hills! The Rams Are Next!

Win or lose today, the 49ers will have the nerve-shattering experience next Sunday of "welcoming" the Los Angeles Rams to Kezar Stadium. The record book shows that the San Franciscans' record against their Southland opponents is dismal—only three wins and one tie in 12 league engagements.

Sid Gillman is in his second year as head coach of the Rams. He was "Pro Coach of the Year" in 1955 in everybody's book except the eastern experts who believe civilization ends at the Mississippi river.

With fabulous veterans like Norm Van Brocklin, Tank Younger, Ron Waller, Elroy Hirsch, Les Richter and Skeet Quinlan, plus a flock of talented rookies, the Rams well deserve their preseason ranking as the favorites in the Western division.

Beginning in 1952, the 49ers and Rams have drawn almost 900,000 people in 13 preseason and league games. The paid attendance of 78,945 at Los Angeles for the 24-24 deadlock on October 3, 1954, is the largest in National Football League history.

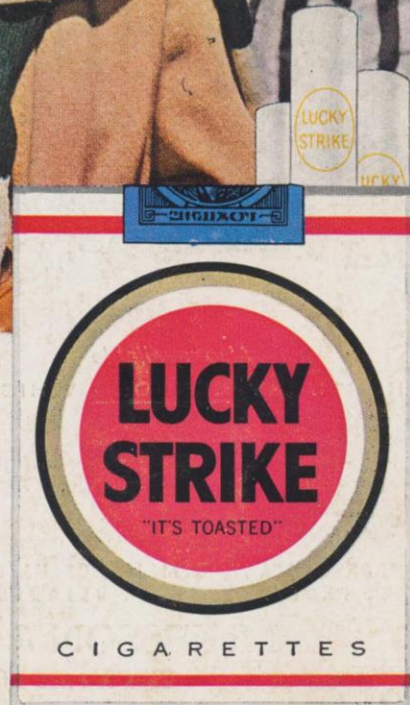
