TODAY'S GAME

THE famed New York Giants, world's professional football champions, have made a special trip from New York direct to San Francisco, to defend their laurels against Ernie Nevers' Pacific Coast All-Americans, in the fifth annual Knights of Columbus Charity Football Game. Winners of first place honors in the eastern division of the National Professional Football League, the major ranks of post-graduate football, the New Yorkers achieved the world's title by decisively defeating the former world's champions, the great Chicago Bears' squad, to the tune of 30 to 13, in a playoff game at the New York Polo Grounds a month ago.

Headed by "Football's Most Valuable Player of the Season," Ken Strong, All-American half-back star of New York University, and for the last five years all-pro backfield star of the National League, the Giants bring to California for their first visit some 15 out of the squad of 23 stars in the team's lineup. In addition to the newcomers to San Francisco, are some All-Americans who have attained success on former occasions, including Ed Danowski, the Fordham flash; captain Ray Flaherty; flashy Maxie Krause of Gonzaga fame; Bill Morgan, the Oregon tackle; Mel Hein, all-pro center, and Ike Frankian, St. Mary's great All-American end. Coached by capable Steve Owen, the team has been a leader in major pro ranks the past few years; and its present visit to the Pacific Coast is the reward for a sensationally successful season, climaxed by the remarkable victory the team scored over the Chicago Bears, in the world's title playoff game.

Can Ernie Nevers, hero of three K. of C. games, repeat his former successes with a victory over the formidable Giants? With the pick of graduating varsity football stars and a wall of reinforcing west coast collegiates who have made good in the major pro league. Nevers has turned out a splendidly-coordinated machine in the ten day of intensive training allotted his squad of Pacific Coast All-Stars for today's important contest. The Giants, well realizing the strength of their opponents, have fortified their squad with two new players; and are bound not to be caught napping. The game seems to be a toss-up.

A year ago, the world's champion Chicago Bears defeated the Pacific Coast All-Stars, co-coached by Ray Flaherty and Norman "Red" Strader, in a spectacular contest, by a final score of 20 to 7. Two years ago, Ernie Nevers headed a team of west coast varsity seniors and pro. stars, against the former national champions, the colorful Green Bay Packers' squad, and the Nevers' group smashed out a 13 to 6 victory. In January, 1932, K. of C. benefit classic, Nevers brought out his Chicago Cardinals' squad from the National Pro.

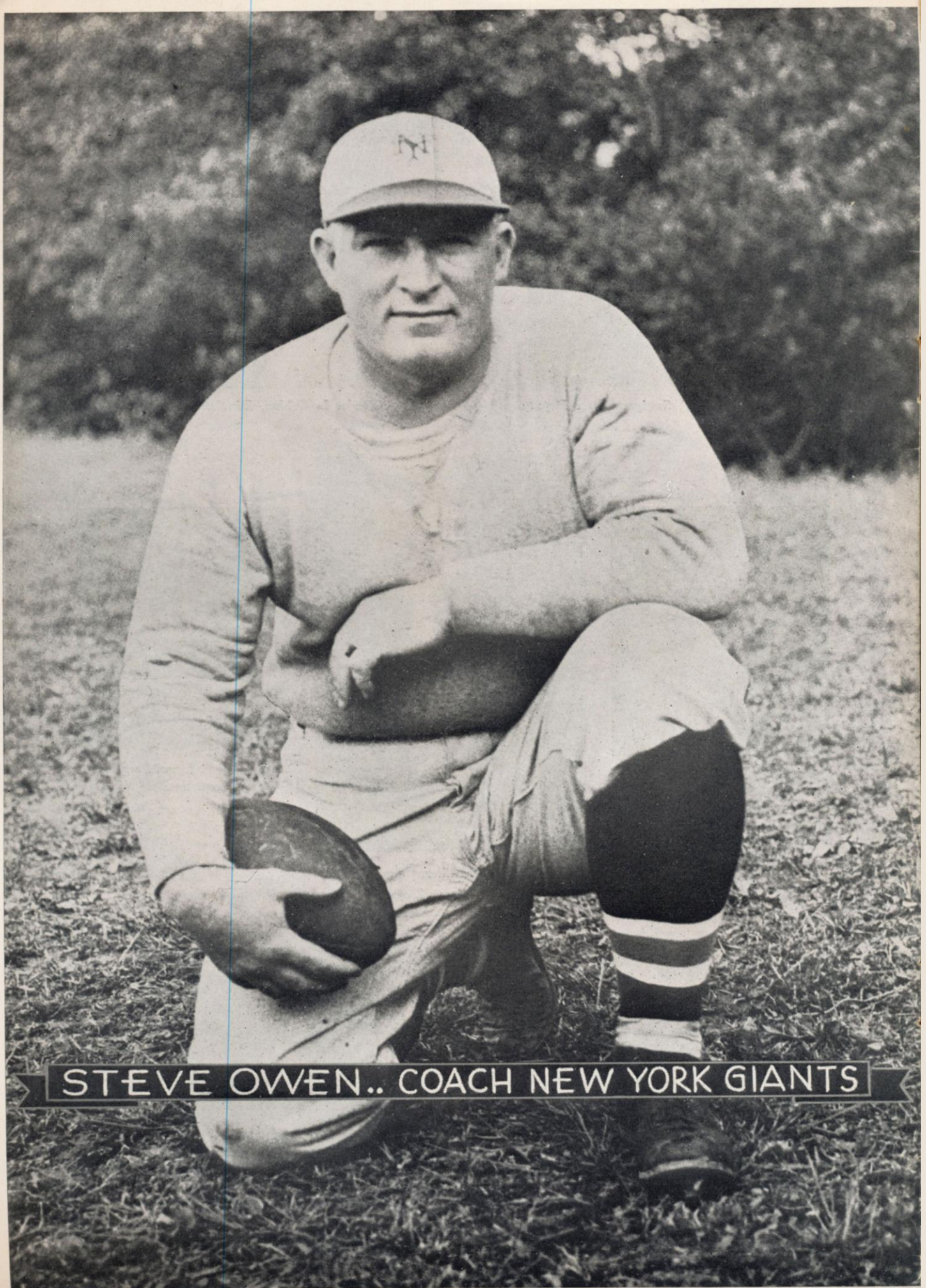
League, and as a fitting conclusion to his professional football career, drove his team to a 26 to 14 win over Frank Carideo's Notre Dame stars. In the starting game of the yearly series, January of 1931, "Jumping Joe" Savoldi, great Notre Dame star of the gridiron, whom the immortal Knute Rockne called "the greatest back I ever coached," captained an all-star southwestern and eastern squad to a 13 to 0 victory over the St. Mary's Stars.

Annually the K. of C. post-season football game has gained momentum and importance, attracting world-wide attention. Today, the fifth annual classic offers probably the most important and imposing array in the history of this or any other grid event. The New York Giants must uphold the tradition that major pro. football is considerably ahead of the collegiate variety in color, class and ability of teams and players; while blonde Ernie Nevers, great Stanford and All-American hero, then a pro. sensation, and more recently the driving force as Assistant Head Coach of the splendid Stanford Varsity team, will strive to show that college players comprising the first-string lineup of his team, can more than hold their own after intensive coaching and precision, despite lack of experience that the professional players possess.

Proceeds of the contest will be divided between the Saint Vincent de Paul Society's Archdiocesan Charities under the patronage of His Excellency Most Reverend Edward J. Hanna, D.D., and the maintenance of the Knights of Columbus free employment-aid bureaus.

The Knights of Columbus are deeply indebted and most grateful to the athletic board of control, Mr. Richard W. Barrett, chairman, and to the faculty of Leland Stanford Jr. University, through Dr. Ray Lyman Wilbur, President, and Dr. Thomas A. Storey, Chairman of the Department of Physical Education, for their kind cooperation in permitting Mr. Nevers to coach and direct the team representing the Pacific Coast in today's benefit game. The Order and the committee is also highly appreciative of the splendid support and big attendance at all of the K. of C. charity contests; enabling the fulfillment of commendable charitable and relief activities. To various organizations and legions of friends, we extend our sincere thanks for their aid and cooperation; to the team and players every good wish for an interesting and close game, with the best team winning; and to the football fans of Northern California an expression of hope that we have again been able to satisfy our wish of bringing before you the finest teams and the greatest players of the year.

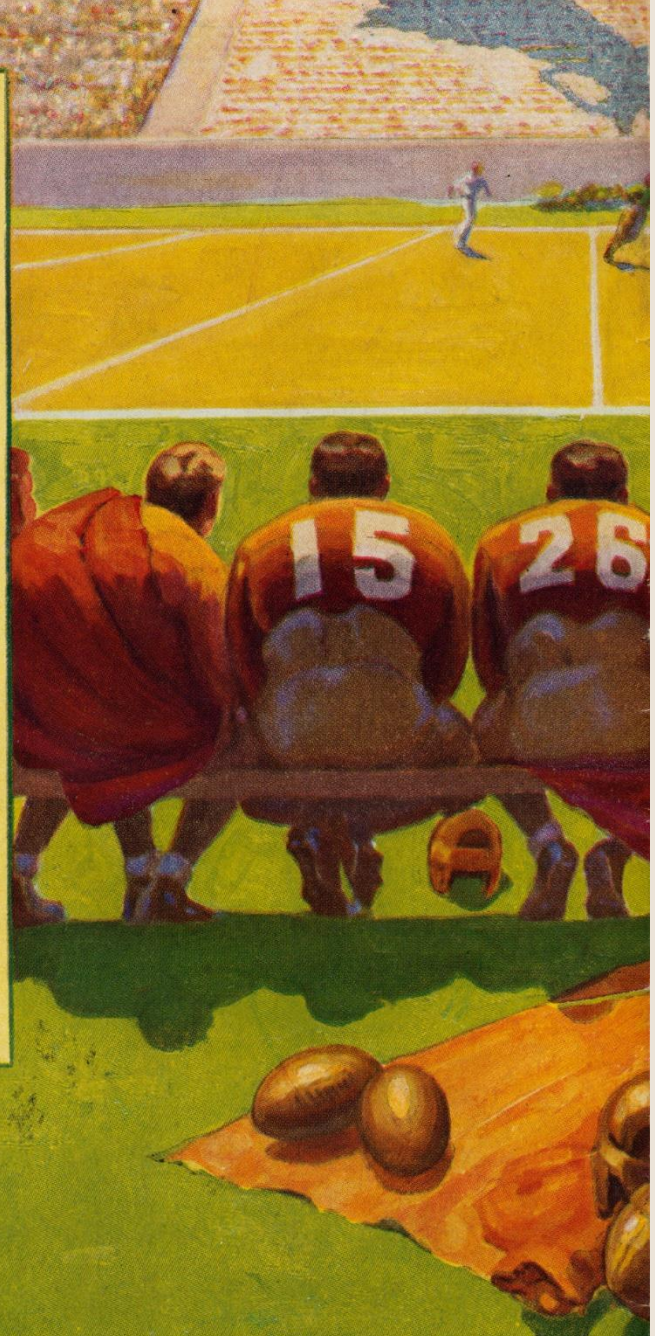

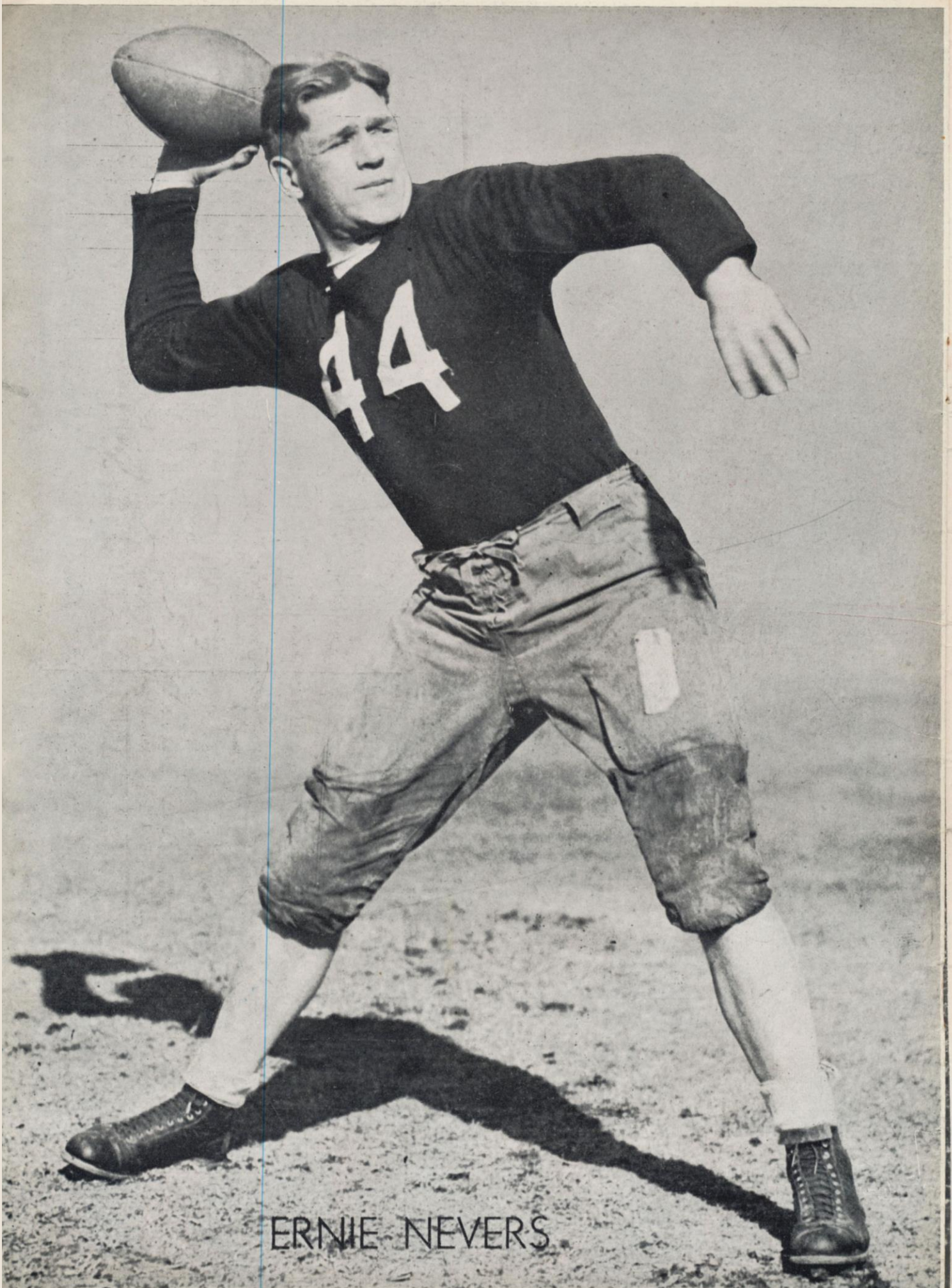
