"Dinty" Waleski was born on June 18th, 1912, in Avoca, Pa. He saw action as a backfield player for the Avoca, Pa. High School eleven in 1928-29-30-31, then enrolled at St. Thomas U. Played there 1932-33-34. During the 1934 campaign he turned in numerous classy feats of running. Ran 65 and 56 yards against Bucknell U. and scored only touchdown against St. Bonaventure College last year, running 74 yards. "Dinty" is 5 feet 10 inches tall, weighs 175 pounds, has chestnut hair and brown eyes and is of Polish descent. Hobbies are fishing, traveling. Ambition is to become a football coach.

Palmers was born in Edinburg, Scotland, October 19th, 1910. His parents came to this country when he was eight months old and settled in Medford, Mass. He attended Medford High School and starred in football, basketball and track. Entering Dean Academy upon graduating, it was here that Palmers high jumped to a record of 6 feet 3 inches. He would have made the 1926 Olympic team but principal would not let him travel. Played with N. Y. U., 1928-29-30. Played in East-West game in 1931 on Pacific coast. Was assistant coach, N. Y. U., 1931-32. Played pro-football with New York Giants and Stapleton. He is 6 feet tall, weighs 210 pounds, has blue eyes and is single and lives in Medford, Mass.
