Palmers was born in Edinburg, Scotland, October 19th, 1910. His parents came to this country when he was eight months old and settled in Medford, Mass. He attended Medford High School and starred in football, basketball and track. Entering Dean Academy upon graduating, it was here that Palmers high jumped to a record of 6 feet 3 inches. He would have made the 1926 Olympic team but principal would not let him travel. Played with N. Y. U., 1928-29-30. Played in East-West game in 1931 on Pacific coast. Was assistant coach, N. Y. U., 1931-32. Played profootball with New York Giants and Stapleton. He is 6 feet tall, weighs 210 pounds, has blue eyes and is single and lives in Medford, Mass.
