## Giant title hopes at Stake

The hopes of the New York Giants for wresting the Eastern title from the Washington Redskins and gaining the right to meet the western division winner for the Ed Thorp Memorial Trophy will be at stake in the next two Giant games.

No matter how the Giants fare today against Green Bay the New York team must win from Brooklyn in Ebbets Field on Thanksgiving Day, next Thursday, and also beat the Washington Redskins in the final home game here two weeks from today, Sunday, Dec. 5, to be assured of the play-off berth.

The closing game here will mark the first time that Slingin' Sammy Baugh has made his appearance at the Polo Grounds in a Redskin uniform. The Redskins last year beat the Giants by a two touchdown margin to cop the Eastern crown and this season have Baugh in there flinging passes at a rate that threatens to eclipse even Arnold Herber's great mark of last fall when the Packer ace completed 77 tosses. He has completed 61 for 864 yards and still has three games left in which to complete the passes necessary to break Herber's mark.

Not only do the Redskins have Baugh as a threat but Cliff Battles, who accounted for many a touchdown

against the Giants in the past, is running wild again this season. The former West Virginia Wesleyan back is setting the pace among the ground gainers of the league with 553 yards and he missed the first game with the Giants in Washington.

In that game the Giants were beaten 13 to 3 and ever since that time the Owen outfit has been waiting for the second crack at Ray Flaherty's outfit. The meeting now looms as of extra importance for the two teams are locked in a tight race for the title, the Giants holding only a slim half game edge in the standings.

Before that game however the Giants must face the Dodgers in the annual Turkey Day struggle and this has always been a tough problem especially coming so close to the Green Bay struggle. Since the first Giant-Dodger clash the Brooklyn

outfit has been strengthened by the addition of Ace Parker and there is nothing the Brooklyn outfit would rather do than knock the Giants out of the title race.

Tickets for the Brooklyn game next Thursday and for the game with the Redskins two weeks from today will be on sale tomorrow morning in the office of the New York Football Giants, Room 1740, 11 West 42nd Street.

## PACKERS TOPS IN OFFENSE

The Green Bay Packers hold first place laurels in ground gaining and scoring and are now ahead of Washington for passing honors according to league records. The Packers scored 37 points, gained 453 yards and completed 11 out of 19 passes against Philadelphia.

In nine games, the Packers have scored 214 points, gained 2800 yards and have a passing efficiency of 44%. This is 50 points and 245 yards more than the nearest rival. Their 44% passing efficiency, which raises them from third to first in this department, is 3% better than their record breaking 41% set last season.

The New York Giants continue to monopolize defensive laurels. The Giants have held opponents to only 1285 yards and 47 points in eight games.

Detroit took second place from Pittsburgh in ground gaining, 2255 yards to 2193, and retained second place in scoring with 164 points. The Chicago Bears are third in scoring with 131 points.

**THE NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE**

Following are the major differences in rules between professional and college football games:

The goal posts are placed on the goal line.

The ball must be put in play at least 15 yards in from the sideline, being moved 15 yards in after any play that ends closer than 15 yards to the nearest sideline.

The penalty for clipping from behind is 25 yards.

The ball is NOT dead when a player slips or is thrown to the ground, the ball being in play until the whistle is blown.

Defensive linemen are allowed to use their hands on the head, face or bodies of offensive players.

Fumbles, except on punts or lateral passes, may be advanced. Punts and lateral pass fumbles may be advanced only after "possession and advance" has been established.

Substitutes may talk with teammates immediately upon entering the game.

A forward pass may be thrown from any spot behind the line of scrimmage.

On a forward pass followed by an illegal lateral pass (the second pass being forward instead of lateral or backward) the ball is put in play at a point 5 yards behind where the illegal pass was thrown.

On the kickoff the receiving team does NOT have to have five men within its 45 yard line.

The flying block and flying tackle are permitted.

Penalties within the ten-yard line are only half the distance to the goal line.
