**H**ERE are Hub Barker, Len Calligaro and Chuck Avedisian, a lusty trio of Giant football battlers, two of them in their third seasons with Steve Owen, one in his freshman year.

The newcomer is Calligaro, a husky back from Wisconsin. Calligaro has worked right into the Owen scheme, and has done even better than Stout Steve had expected.

Barker is the young man from Arkansas, a 195 pounder who joined National League forces for the 1942 season, and has done mighty well.

Avedisian is a 205 pound guard who arrived in Harlem from Providence. Playing for a small college, Chuck got comparatively little notice in the public prints. But Steve had spied him out, and Avedisian certainly has lived up to all the high hopes held out for him by his coach.

Calligaro is one of ten new players among the Giants. The other nine are Bill Petrillas, back; Johnny Weiss, end; Arnie Herber, who was with the Packers for 11 years before coming here, Howie Livingston, the sensational back from California, Hap Sivell, former Brooklyn guard, Herb Kane, tackle, Keith Beebe, Occidental back, Frankie Damiani, Manhattan tackle, and Rollie Caranci, Colorado tackle.

Boxes are available, four seats to a box, in sections 18 to 25. Prices for box seats are \$4.00 each, \$16.00 per box, including tax.

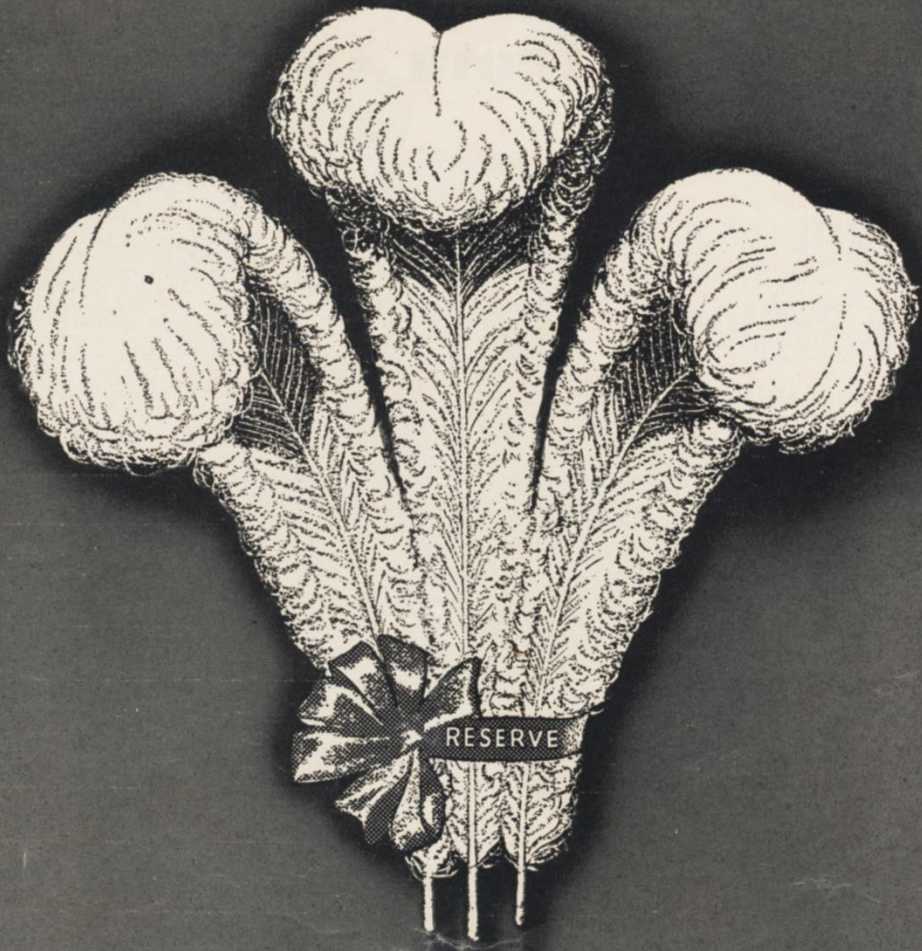

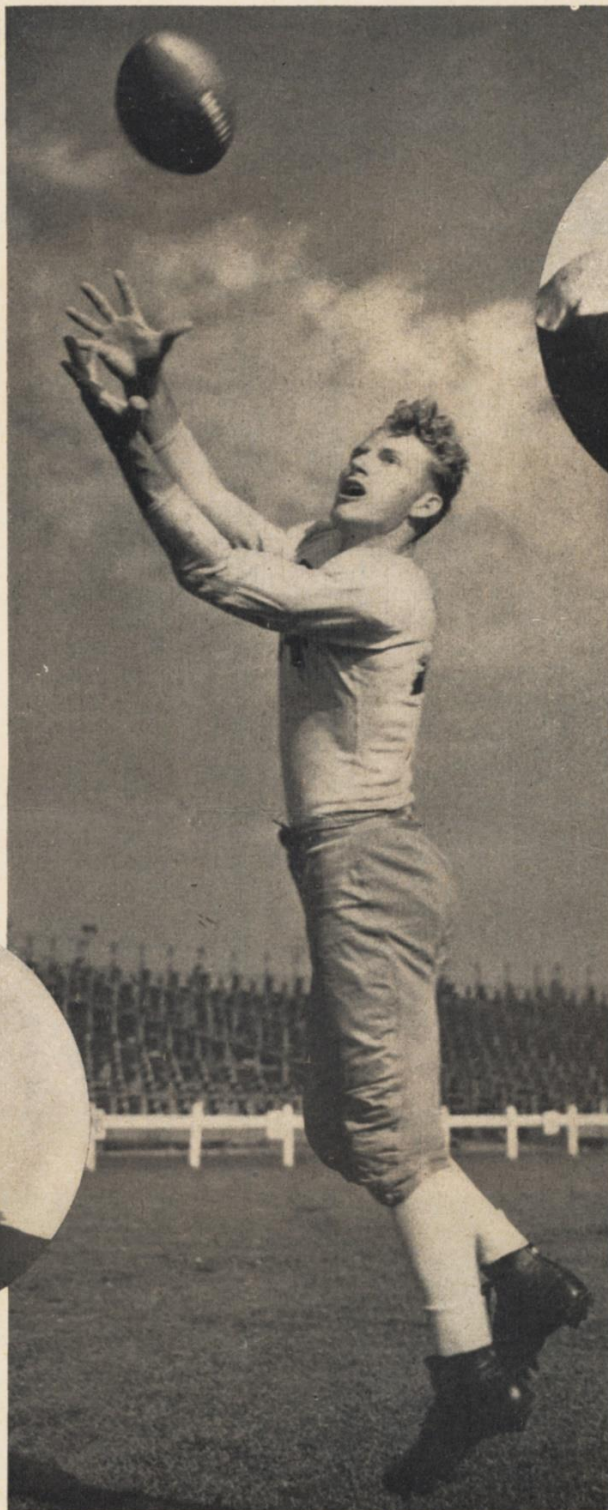


# Giants vs. Packers Classic

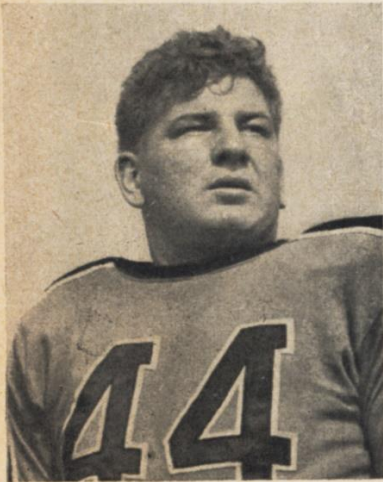

**T**HE Tigers from Brooklyn come into the Polo Grounds next Sunday. They will dash into Harlem howling for revenge. They will pile into that game all the determination born of so many heart breaking disappointments.

This is a fine Brooklyn team. A fine team, and very likely the most luckless one in the long history of the National League.

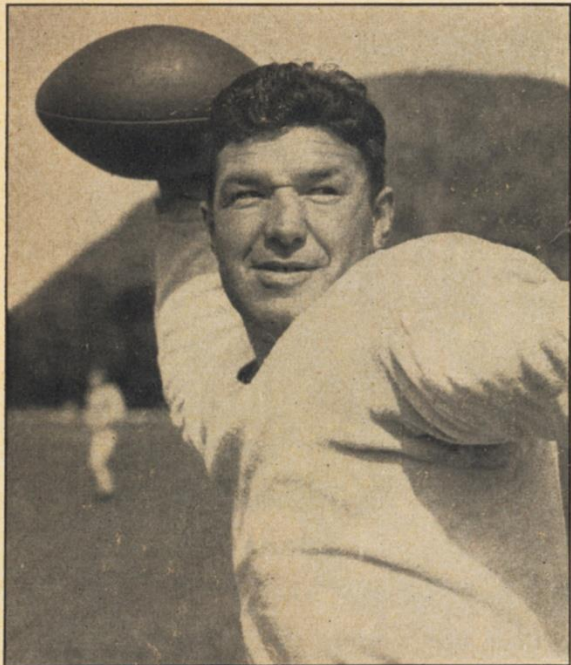
