## GIANTS SWING INTO STRETCH

The New York Giants today start the final stretch drive which will gain them the playoff for the title or cast them in the same role as National League champions of the past few years. No champion has yet been able to repeat and that is the thought which the Giants will carry into the game with the Pirates today, and against the Dodgers next Sunday.

It isn't necessary to remind the Giant players of the task confronting them when the Redskins come to the Polo Grounds on December 3. That scoreless tie in Washington early this season in which the Redskins pushed the Giants all over the field is still fresh in the minds of the Giant players.

For that matter Pittsburgh gave the Giants a tough battle out in the Smoky City, leading 7 to 0 at the half before Ward Cuff took two touchdown passes from Ed Danowski to sew up the game in the third period. Nor was Brooklyn any easy task for the Giants over at Ebbets Field three weeks ago when Ace Parker, Ralph Kercheval and Co. played the Giants to a 7 to 6 margin, Kercheval missing two field goal attempts in the

last period which would have sent the Giants to defeat and kept them from perching at the top of the eastern race tied with the Redskins.

Of almost equal interest to the Giant players is the fine race Ken Strong is making to defend his all-time scoring honors against the challenge of Jack Manders, the ace kicker of the Chicago Bears. Ken Strong has scored 331 points in National League warfare over a seven year span, while Manders has scored just three points less. Strong with 35 touchdowns has a wide margin in that respect but Manders has made up the difference in extra points. The record shows Strong with 35 touchdowns, 64 extra points and 19 field goals; Manders with 17 touchdowns, 112 extra points and 38 field goals.

Strong will be playing today without the brace on his injured back for the first time since he was injured in the Washington game more than seven weeks ago. Rid of this impediment the veteran from N. Y. U. should be able to take better aim on the uprights and also to carry the ball over if the opportunity presents itself in the next three games.

## O'BRIEN SETS RECORDS

Davey O'Brien, the country's outstanding college football player last season, wrote his name in the National Football League record books this week by completing 19 passes against the Green Bay Packers, four more than the previous standard in one game held by Pat Coffey, Cardinals, in 1937, and tied by Ace Parker, Brooklyn, this season.

Up to Sunday L'I Davey, weighing only 150 pounds, stood tenth in the League's list of completions, but today has the fourth highest number of completions and has the best efficiency among the four leaders. His season's record is now 43 out of 91 for 47 per cent.

Another League record was tied by Anvil Andy Farkas, Washington, when he boosted his season touchdown total to 9, equaling the mark made by Don Hutson in 1936 and again in 1938. His season's scoring record is 55 points.

Bill Osmanski, Chicago Bears rookie, finally overtook teammate Joe Masiaci for ground-gaining honors with 603 yards, a total which exceeds that made by Wuiszer White in winning the title last year.

Parker Hall, Cleveland rookie, continues to pace the forward passers with 60 out of 130 for 46 per cent. O'Brien has jumped into a tie for second with Ace Parker, Brooklyn, who has completed 58 out of 129 for 44 per cent. Frank Fitchcock and Sammy Baugh, Washington, though completing fewer passes than the four leaders, have notable efficiency marks with 63 per cent, and 50 per cent, respectively.

Farkas, in addition to gaining the scoring leadership, also rose from fifth to third in ground gaining with 476 yards, slightly behind Masiaci's total of 501. Perry Schwartz, Brooklyn, continues to lead Don Hutson, Green Bay, as a pass receiver, 25 receptions to 22, and the showing of these two when they play against each other this Sunday may well decide the individual championship in this department for the current season. Sam Boyd, Pittsburgh, is third with 19 catches.

## REDSKINS SET MARKS

The National Football League enters the championship home stretch with scoring at records high for its nineteen years existence according to team statistics for the ninth week of play. Four teams have exceeded their 1938 scoring totals, the Chicago Bears tied the team record for one season, and Washington became the first team to score over forty points three times in one season.

The Bears tied Green Bay's League record made last year by scoring 23 points against Detroit, bringing the season's total to 225 points. Washington's 42 points against Brooklyn marked the third time the Redskins have tallied over 40 points this season, previously registering 41 against Brooklyn and 44 against Pittsburgh.

Washington is first in ground gaining, with an average of 336 yards a game, compared with the Chicago Bears' 327 yards a game. Green Bay is third. The Redskins also have the best passing efficiency, 68 completions out of 122 tosses for 55 per cent. Cleveland has the most completions, 77, with Green Bay and Detroit right behind with 74 and 72, respectively. By completing 30 passes, Detroit tied the League mark for one game established by the Chicago Cardinals against the Bears in 1938.

## PRO RULES

There are differences in rules for games played in the National Football League and under intercollegiate rules. We would like to call your attention to these major differences:

1. The goal posts are on the goal line (not ten yards back).

2. Forward passes are permitted from any point to the line of scrimmage (not thrown from five yards behind line).

3. The penalty for a forward pass thrown beyond the line of scrimmage is loss of down and five yards from the spot such pass is made.

4. A forward pass on fourth down is not a touchback if it goes over the goal line providing the pass originated outside the 20-yard line. In other words if the pass was thrown from the 25-yard line on fourth down it reverts to the defending team at that point.

5. On a kickoff the receiving team is not required to have five players within five yards

of the restraining line. Kickers are permitted to use tees in making kickoffs.

6. The penalty for clipping is 25 yards (not 15).

7. The ball is not dead when the runner touches the ground unless definitely in the grasp of an opponent and all forward progress stopped.

8. Substitutes may talk to teammates immediately on entering game.

9. Any two players of either team may re-enter the game once in the fourth quarter.

10. When a penalty is inflicted inside the 10-yard line it shall be only half the distance to the goal line.

11. A fumbled ball which strikes the ground may be advanced by an opponent when he recovers it.

12. On out of bounds kickoffs the ball is put in play on the 45-yard line (not the 35-yard line).
