Jackets Slip Providence Crushing Defeat on Snowy Field, 24 - 0

VISITORS FAIL TO MAKE A FIRST DOWN, WHILE LOCAL ELEVEN
PILE UP TWELVE BY STRAIGHT FOOTBALL

Ernie Nevers' Eskimos would have been a better attraction last Saturday on the snowy field, but it was a question as to the superiority of the Frankford Yellow Jackets over the Providence Steamrollers even though they were the only team to beat Frankford this season. It was the worst defeat suffered by the Providence eleven in several years. Even the score, 24-0, as one-sided as it was does not show the superiority of the local eleven over the New Englanders, because the Steamrollers did not get one first down, while the Jackets gained 12, and not once did Providence threaten to score.

The Jackets were hitting on all four and as a result the overwhelming defeat gives them a tighter grip on first place. The whole team played with machine-like precision, while the runs of Homan and Chamberlin were the features of the battle.

"Two-Bits" gave the greatest exhibition of running back punts ever seen in the local

stadium, his first run of 55 yards placing the pigskin in position to score.

Tex's toe sure was in A-1 condition, time and time again he drove the Steamrollers back, while his end runs throlled the fans more than once.

Chamberlin put the finishing touches to the overwhelming victory when he intercepted a pass and, behind beautiful interference, reversed his field and raced 38 yards to the 2-yard stripe.

Frankford scored in every period. The first touchdown was made by Stockton on a line buck after Homan's run of 50 yards. Ed Weir kicked the goal. Ed scored again when he place-kicked a field goal in the second period from the 30-yard line.

Youngstrum blocked Laird's punt behind the Providence goal line in the third period and fell on the ball for a touchdown. Hamer added the extra point.

The game in Providence on Sunday was called off on account of a snowy field.

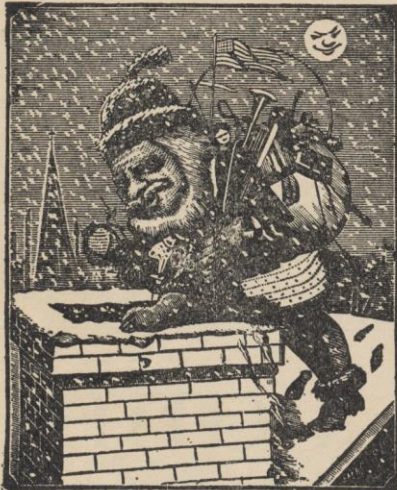

This Year's Yellow Jackets Greatest in History of A. A.

Today the curtain falls on the greatest grid season in the history of the Yellow Jackets, our eleven having compiled a record greater than any team ever to represent Frankford on the gridiron and surpassing any made by a National League team during the season of 1926. The schedule, one of the hardest ever played, was composed of the pick of the National League. Sixteen games have been played to date, fourteen of which were victories, one a tie and one defeat, inflicted by Providence. This defeat was erased when the Jackets defeated the Steamrollers in two other contests, one 6-3 and the other last Saturday when Frankford rolled up a 24 to 0 score. The scoring power of the Jackets is proven by the fact that a total of 236 points were scored by them as against 49 by the visiting elevens. Last year Frankford's total was 170 for 19 games to 153 for the visitors.

This year's total of 236 points was composed of thirty-two touchdowns, seven field goals and twenty-four placement kicks for the extra points.

This year's eleven scored a victory over the Chicago Bears, the first since the two teams have met on the gridiron, two games being played in 1924 and two in 1925.

Last year Frankford finished sixth in the National League race, losing 6 games, while the close of this season finds the Yellow Jackets in first place, with only one defeat to mar their great record.

Coach Chamberlin and the entire squad are worthy of the highest praise for displaying the highest brand of football and clean sportsmanship ever witnessed on the local stadium and for carrying the colors of Frankford to the top of the greatest professional football league in the United States.
