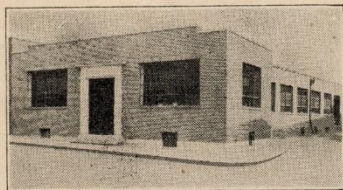

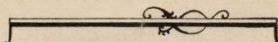

COMING GAMES WITH LEAGUE-LEADING TEAMS

The Frankford Yellow Jackets now lead the National Football League with six victories and no losses, the Chicago Bears follow, having won 5 and lost none, then the Chicago Cardinals have 5 and 1, Pottsville, 4 and 1, Providence also 4 and 1, while Duluth and Green Bay each have 3 and 1.

These are the leaders and it is interesting to note that the Yellow Jackets have games scheduled with five out of six of these leading clubs, namely Providence, Cardinals, Duluth, Green Bay and the Bears. A game is also scheduled with Detroit, another team in the first division. This shows that all the remaining games at the Yellow Jacket Stadium will be real contests and equal to the recent ones with Canton and New York.

The Yellow Jacket mascot is an Oklahoma burro, that came into Philadelphia with the American Legion and became the property of the Jackets recently. This coming Saturday, it will appear on the field with a new blanket and take its place in football annals with the Army Mule that travels around with the West Pointers.

Last Saturday the Canton team presented the heaviest line that has been on the Yellow Jacket field this season. The coming game with Providence presents a new angle. The Steam Rollers have a light team, but

fast. The New York Giants were only able to beat Providence seven to six and last week the Rollers defeated Pottsville, which was their first defeat of the season.

Bull Dogs Snarl From 17 - 0 Sting of Jackets

REED, CHAMBERLIN AND MORAN STAR FOR LOCALS. BUDD BOOTS
ANOTHER THREE-POINTER

After being held scoreless for the first two periods, although outplaying the Bulldogs, Frankford entered the fray in the second half determined to crash through to victory.

Roberts, who had been at the quarterback post during the first half, was replaced by Jones who was shifted from halfback. "Hap" Moran took Jones's place in the backfield and Chamberlin replaced Crowthers at right end. After an exchange of punts and a fumble, Frankford got possession of the ball on Canton's 21-yard line. Budd tried a placement goal which fell short on the 4-yard line. On the next play Reed, for the Jackets, rushed through and blocked Wallace's kick, falling on the oval for the first score. Budd kicked the extra point.

On the first play of the fourth period, after Stockton had intercepted a pass at midfield, he hurled the oval to Moran who dashed 35 yards for the second tally. Budd again scored the extra point.

After an exchange of punts Canton launched an aerial attack which carried the ball to the 1 yard line where Robb fumbled. A punting duel followed with Hamer kicking from behind his own goal line, finally driving the Bulldogs back to midfield. The Westerners again opened up an overhead offensive only to have Wilcox, who had replaced Hamer, intercept at the 40-yard line. On the first play Stockton hurled a forward to Chamberlin, who made a beautiful sprint of 50 yards being forced out of bounds on Canton's 5-yard line. Here the Bulldogs braced and forced Budd to send the ball soaring between the uprights for 3 points, the final score of the game, which ended shortly afterwards.

This is the first decisive victory the Yellow Jackets have ever chalked up against the Bulldogs since they have met on the gridiron. Tex Hamer displayed his ability as a punter when he outdistanced the famous Jim Thorpe.

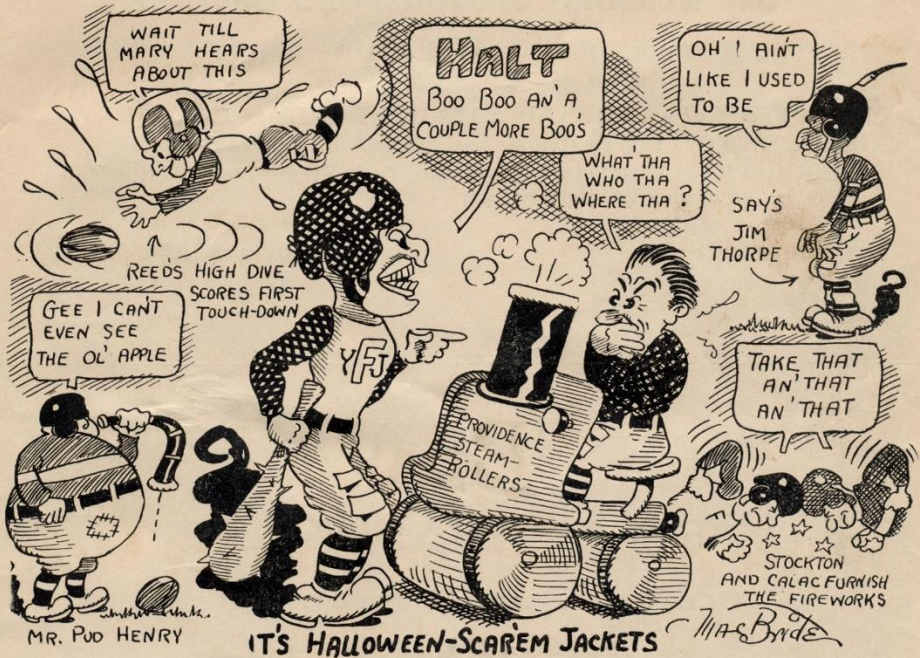

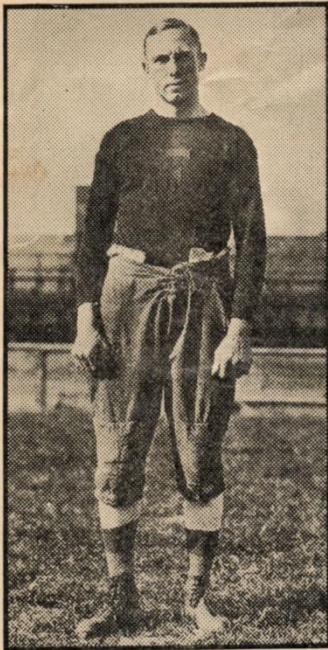

Steamrollers Here to Crush Jackets After Trouncing Pottsville

The Rollers defeated the champion Pottsville Maroons here Sunday, 14-0, the long runs of Curly Oden, Roller quarterback, being responsible for the score. Wentz made some good gains on line plunges for Pottsville but the Rollers invariably tightened up when the invaders threatened to score.

The Rollers have been defeated only once this year, losing 7-6 to the New York Giants. Its other League scores were Rollers, 13; Brooklyn Lions, 0. Rollers, 19; Columbus Tigers, 0. The Rollers have accordingly won three League games and lost one.

The Providence team is mostly of Brown University extraction, the majority of the players having been stars at the University. The Brown men on the team are Jackson Keefer, backfield ace of last year's Brown Team; Curly Oden, Brown quarterback of 1919 and 1920; Mike Gulian, tackle and Brown Captain; John Spellman, ex-Brown tackle and Olympic light-heavyweight champion wrestler, "Dolph" Ecksten, ex-Brown center, and Fred Sweet, ex-Brown halfback. Keefer, Gulian and Spellman received mention from many writers for All-American honors while in college.

The Rollers' two regular ends, "Archie" Golembeski and Francis Garvey, formerly starred at Holy Cross. Two of the Rollers' best linemen, ex-Captain Jack Donahue, guard and Joe Jozlowsky, tackle, are Boston College luminaries. Donahue weighs 230

pounds and is the heaviest man on the squad, the only other player weighing over 200 being Gulian, at 205.

Jim Liard, ex-Colgate fullback, is the most accurate punter playing football as well as one of the longest. His kicks usually travel just inside the side lines. Cy Wentworth, one of the leading point scorers of the country while playing with New Hampshire State, is an unusually elusive back, and is apt to score a touchdown anytime he gets into an open field. Oden is an exceptionally hard man to down and keep down, and his spectacular runs usually feature every game he plays in. He even outshines Keefer, whose knife-like thrust gave him college fame.

The Rollers have a great defensive back in Waddy McPhee, formerly of Princeton. A new man of the team, Dutch Forst, a line plunger from Villa Nova, has not yet had a real chance to show what he can do.

Other Roller players are "Bull" Wesley, Alabama center, who is used as guard on the Rollers; Sam Young, North Dakota guard, Bob Scott, Alabama guard; Braney, Syracuse guard and Pink Lester, a dusky end from the sand lots.

The Rollers gained National fame at Braves Field, Boston, last year by wrecking Red Grange's Chicago team. It has long been known as New England's strongest eleven.

Intercepted Pass Is Thrill Maker

GOOD RECEIVERS PRICELESS

Reprint from The Evening Bulletin

The forward pass is not altogether popular with some coaches and it is unpopular with a number of teams, but you can safely say that the forward pass is chiefly responsible for the present popularity of football.

This play has introduced more strategy into football than probably all the others combined. It has opened up the game and made it spectacular. It has provided a variety that football lacked before its introduction. It has, above everything else, given color to the offense and defense.

The forward pass was first introduced in 1906 by the rules committee in response to the many criticisms because of injuries in games.

So many restrictions accompanied the play when introduced that few coaches took advantage of it; most of them ignored it. Four years later further changes in the rules helped the forward pass, but not enough to popularize it.

Not until the spring of 1912 did the rules committee make the last important changes that elevated the forward pass into a major weapon of attack. It was from this day on that the popularity of the game really grew.

The forward pass can be used either as a means of scoring or as a threat. A team with a good passer and capable receivers is able to use any style of attack with more success because of them.

Consider the opportunities you have if your forward passer is also a good punter:

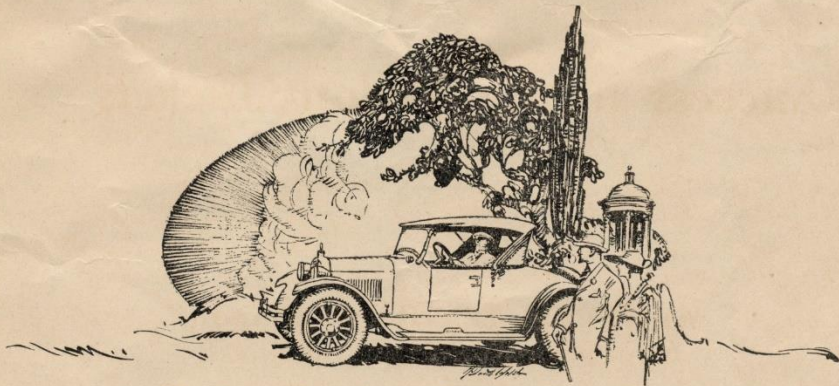
You line up in punt formation. This makes it possible to run with the ball to kick or pass it. The safety man of the opposing team is forced back. He cannot take a chance on a punt. If he does not go back, punt over him. The secondary defense moves out as protection against a pass. The liemen are undecided. You may punt, pass or kick. The confusion in their minds benefits you, no matter what you intend to do.

The pass is worked in two different ways. One is the mechanical pass, the other is often called the choice pass.

The mechanical pass is a set play. It calls for the pass to be made to a designated receiver at a designated spot. It is the best pass to use as a scoring play.

The choice pass names no definite receiver. Any eligible man may be the receiver. The eligible list consists of the two men at the end of the line and the backs. You can, therefore, have five men eligible to receive a pass.

It is up to the passer to pick the receiver on the choice pass. He will select, of course, a man whom the defense has not covered. To work this pass successfully a team must have an expert passer and good protection for the passer. He must also be able to pass accurately. It may be a short pass or a long pass.

Providence Hands Pottsville First Loss of Year, 14 - 0

ODEN SCORES BOTH TOUCHDOWNS FOR ROLLERS, DASHING 60 YARDS FOR THE SECOND

The Pottsville Maroons suffered their first defeat of the season last Sunday when they were defeated by the Providence Steam Roller eleven, 14 to 0.

The game, played before 7000 fans, who sat through a driving rainstorm, was the most bitterly contested professional football battle ever staged. The Rollers had the edge on the champions at all stages of the game and the goal line was threatened only once, that being in the second period when a forward pass made by Ernst from midfield to Flanagan, resulted in a gain of 40 yards. With the ball on the Rollers' 10-yard line, Pottsville worked four forward passes, completing the last one on the fourth down, but failing to gain the distance.

The Rollers scored their first touchdown early in the second period, when Pottsville, forced to kick on the fourth down, failed to get the kick away, Gulian blocking. Potts-

ville recovered the ball, but as it was fourth down the ball went to the Rollers on the 16-yard line. Oden, former Brown star, from a spread-eagle formation, made the touchdown on three successive tries.

Oden also scored the second touchdown for the Rollers, receiving a punt on his 40-yard line and making a brilliant run through the entire Pottsville team for a touchdown. Keefer kicked the goal after the first touchdown, while a forward, Keefer to Golembeski, accounted for the point after the second.

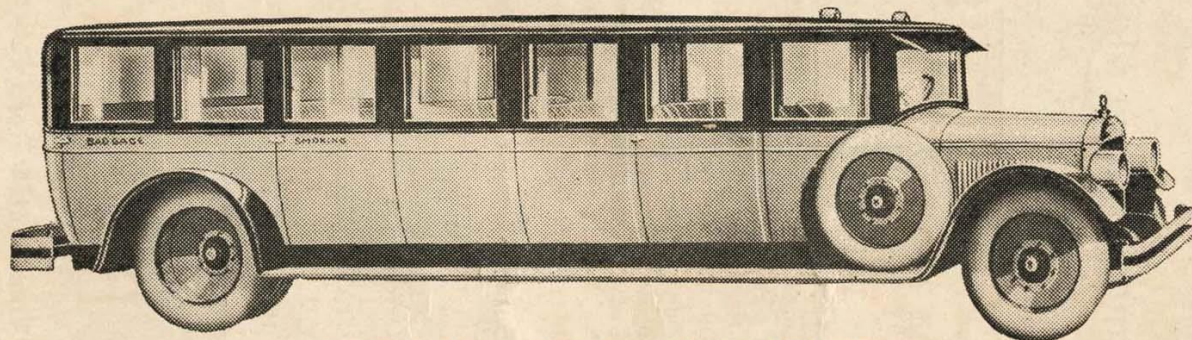
