**CAPTAIN PAUL HALLER**, the fighting leader of the All-Collegiates, is a former Herkimer (N. Y.) boy. He graduated from that City's High School in 1916, after having played for three years on the Varsity team at half-back.

Upon entering Cornell, he made a bid for the Freshman team and was immediately stationed at his old position. The next year found him playing regular for the Varsity and for his services was rewarded with the much sought for letter. In 1919 Haller transferred to the University of Michigan and played with that school's team for the next two years. Although most of his time was taken up by football he managed to make the Wrestling team, and from 1919 to 1922 was middleweight wrestling Champion of the Big Ten Conference and of the Middle West. Haller graduated there in 1921 but re-entered the same year and took an additional course. It was in this year that he was elected Captain of the Wrestling team. He finally graduated in 1922 with a Master of Science and Engineering degree.

When Haller came to Elizabeth he was signed to play with the All Collegiates last year by Jimmie Johnson, who was then manager. This present season he was appointed as Captain and Coach of the team, and up to going to press the Elizabeth boys have not lost a game in six starts, having run up a grand total of 147 points while their own goal line still remains to be crossed.

Much of this success and glory is due to Captain Haller's indomitable spirit and leadership, and also to the wonderful co-operation and fellowship on the part of his team as a whole.
