

### **Isbell to Hutson** Threatens Giants Again

THE New York Giants now are confronted with the game that the entire squad has been looking forward to all season. The Green Bay Packers come to the Polo Grounds next Sunday and Giant fans know what to expect from the gigantic Packers.

It was last fall that the Packers handed the Giants one of the toughest setbacks they ever encountered when the two collided in Milwaukee with the league championship at stake. There isn't a player among the current Giants, who participated in that game who hasn't been waiting for next Sunday to redeem the showing made in that clash when the Packers, sparked by Cecil Isbell's throwing arm and Don nutson's remarkable pass catching, rolled up a 27 to 0 Hutson's remarkable margin over the New York eleven.

Hutson is up to his old tricks in fact even surpassing his former feats as a pass snatcher. Trying to cover him will give the Giants a busy afternoon especially since Isbell and Arnold Herber are flinging with better aim than ever before. The Green Bay ace catcher who holds all league records for pass catching both lifetime and for a single season has snared 33 so far this season

and is well on his way to setting a new season's mark if he continues at the present pace. Hutson needs only two catches a game to beat his 1937 record of 41 for the season. Carl Mulleneaux, Packer flanker and former Utah end, is also among the leading pass catchers of the circuit.

CECIL ISBELL

Two former Fordham wingmen, Harry Jacunski and Ray Riddick, are also playing prominent roles in the Packers' struggle to retain western honors. Andy Uram, Larry Buhler, and Hal VanEvery, former Minnesota star backs, are also proving valuable ground gainers for the Pack-

ers this season.

Isbell with 48 completions and Herber with 29 give the Packers two of the top passers among the seven best aerial artists of the league. And these flingers are backed up by the fine running of Clarke Hinkle, veteran back who is also tied with Ward Cuff in field goal kicking at present, and Lou Brock, another former Purdue

The Packers boast a pair of formidable centers in Charles Brock, former Nebraska pivot man, and Tom Greenfield, husky Arizona product and former teammate of Walt Nielsen, Giants' newest powerhouse.

It is the usual big, tough, hard-hitting Packer eleven that Curley Lambeau is bringing into the Polo Grounds next Sunday. The Green Bay squad is just as determined as the Giants too, for a setback would eliminate them from the western race.

#### REDSKINS, PACKERS TOPS

Washington's offensive superiority in the National Football League is clearly indicated in this week's team statistics which show the Redskins ahead of Green Bay, its closest rival, 205 yards in ground gaining, and 60 points in scoring. The Redskins are traveling at a record-breaking pace in pass completions, pass efficiency and scoring.

Green Bay is second in all offensive departments with 2134 yards, 85 out of 199 passes for 42%, and 144 points. The Chicago Bears are third in ground gaining and scoring with 1911 yards and 143 points.

New York with 1338 yards for opponents, the Chicago Cardinals with 35% opponents' passes, and Brooklyn allowing only 77 points are the best defensive units in the circuit.

#### Cuff, Nielsen and Miller Near Top

Ward Cuff and Walter "Horse" Nielsen, two outstanding members of the New York Giants backfield, are among the top rank performers of the National Football League according to the latest statistics.

Nielsen has put on a terrific spurt in the race for ground gaining honors jumping from twelfth to fifth in the league standing during the past week. Nielsen, rookie back, has gained 253 yards despite the fact that he saw little service in the opening games. Nielsen is only 20 yards behind Dick Todd, Washington ball toter, in fourth place. Top honors are held by Whizzer White of Detroit with 366 yards, while Banks McFadden of Brooklyn has 326 yards and Parker Hall of the Cleveland Rams is third with 308 yards. John Drake, another Ram back, is just one yard behind Nielsen in sixth place.

Cuff is in the thick of the race to retain his field goal kicking honors and is also among the leaders in the struggle for individual scoring honors. Cuff has kicked five field goals, one less than Armand Nicolai of Pittsburgh, who has played two more games. Tied with Cuff however is Clarke Hinkle, Green Bay fullback star who will face the Giants here next week. In the scoring race Cuff has tallied 36 points, two behind Don Hutson, sensational Green Bay Packers pass snatcher, and only six behind the leaders Jimmy Johnston and Dick Todd of the Redskins, who have tallied 42 points.

Eddie Miller, starting Giant quarterback, is now rated second only to Sammy Baugh of the Redskins among the forward passing aces of the league. Miller with 34 completions in 65 attempts for a .523 efficiency mark has gained 499 yards. Baugh with the unbelievable mark of .708 in efficiency is tops having completed 68 in 96 attempts. Cecil Isbell, Green Bay flinger whose tosses to Hutson will give the Giants a tough problem next Sunday, is third to Miller in passing records having completed 48 out of 104 to gain 756 yards, which is a better record than Miller's in number attempted and yards gained but below the Giant ace in efficiency.




