No matter what the outcome of today's game no Giant fan will disagree with us in offering hearty congratulations to Coach Steve Owen and his assistant Bo Molenda. Starting off this year with but three veteran linemen and the remains of a squad that finished third in the Eastern Division last fall, the 1937 Giants have acquitted themselves remarkably well.

It is the seventh season as head tutor of the Giants for Steve, whose presence with Bo in front of the Giant bench each Sunday is familiar to all who attend Giant games.

During that time the Giants have been meeting increasingly tough opposition but most of the time staying on the right side of the scoring column. Since he took over the tutoring reins the New York eleven has won 53 games, while losing only 32 and tying 4, an average slightly better than .600, which compares favorably with that of any coach in pro football.

U. tackle, whose inspirational play has been a contributory factor in the success which has met the Giant cause this season. Along with Len in his eighth season as a Giant is Dale Burnett, the sensational wing back, whose speed and pass catching ability do not seem to slacken. The former Emporia Teachers athlete has been out of action since the Detroit game when he suffered a concussion, but he returns to duty today after every one had thought he would be out for the balance of the season.

Permit us too at this time to extend our hearty appreciation for the truly fine reception which the Giants of 1937 have received from you loyal supporters. We hope to be able to merit your continued support in the future and look forward to 1938 in hopes of being able to surpass this year.

#### NEW PASSING RECORD

A new National Football League team record for forward passing efficiency was established this season as two teams, the Green Bay Packers and Washington Redskins, both passed the old mark of 41% held jointly by Green Bay and Brooklyn. Green Bay, having completed its schedule, has completed 95 out of 216 passes for 43%, and Washington with 86 completions out of 204 tosses for 42% still has a chance to tie or overtake in its final game here.

If the tossers in the Washington-Giants and Bears-Cardinals games today can keep up the league average of the season, a new National League standard will be established in forward passing efficiency for the entire season by all teams. Last year 36.5% of all passes thrown were completed and with two games remaining a total of 638 aerials were completed out of 1703 thrown for 37.4%.

The Packers finished the season as the leading offensive team with 3229 yards gained and 220 points scored. Detroit is second in both divisions. Washing-ton is the third leading ground gainer and the Bears hold third place in scoring. The New York Giants have held opponents to 1740 yards and 60 points for defensive honors, while the Redskins are second in this respect.

#### THE NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE

Following are the major differences in rules between professional and college football games:

The goal posts are placed on the goal line.

The ball must be put in play at least 15 yards in from the sideline, being moved 15 yards in after any play that ends closer than 15 yards to the nearest sideline.

The penalty for clipping from behind is 25 yards.

The ball is NOT dead when a player slips or is thrown to the ground, the ball being in play until the whistle is blown.

Defensive linemen are allowed to use their hands on the head, face or bodies of offensive players.

Fumbles, except on punts or lateral passes, may be advanced. Punts and lateral pass fumbles may be advanced only after "possession and advance" has been established.

Substitutes may talk with teammates immediately upon entering the game. A forward pass may be thrown from any spot behind the line of scrimmage.

On a forward pass followed by an illegal lateral pass (the second pass being forward instead of lateral or backward) the ball is put in play at a point 5 yards behind where the illegal pass was thrown.

On the kickoff the receiving team does NOT have to have five men within its 45 yard line.

The flying block and flying tackle are permitted.

Penalties within the ten-yard line are only half the distance to the goal line.
