

Chicago Bears On Way

THE Chicago Bears, currently tied for leadership in the western division and favored to dethrone Green Bay as champion of that section, invade the Polo Grounds next

Sunday in the first of three intersectional games which will test the titular hopes of the local eleven to its limit.

The Bears headed by such outstanding backfield men as Sid Luckman from Columbia: Bill Osmanski from Holy Cross, who led the league in ground gaining last fall; Ioe Maniaci of Fordham; George McAfee, sensational rookie from Duke; and Gary Famiglietti of Boston U. have been running roughshod over all opposition in the west. The Halas outfit also has

a definite grudge with the Giants to settle from the bruising contest of last fall when the Giants won out 16 to 13 and thus deprived the Bears of a place in the titular final.

It has been many years since the Giants were able to score two successive victories over the Bears. As a matter of fact the powerful Chicago eleven has won 14 times to 10 victories for the New York eleven and only once have the two played a tie.


The Bears have been greatly strengthened since last fall when it took a magnificent goal line stand by the Giants to win the game. Bob Nowaskey, George Washington end, who

starred against the Giants in the All-star clash: Ken Kavanaugh of L.S.U. sensational pass snaring end; Ed Kolman, powerful tackle from Temple; and Cylde "Bulldog" Turner, standout All-American center from Hardin-Simmons, are just a few of the newcomers added to the standout team the Bears had last fall.

REDSKINS STILL ROLLING

At least three new National Football League offensive records will be established by the Washington Redskins if they continue their torrid pace throughout the remainder of the season. Team statistics for the fifth week of play, shows that Washington is 2 completions a game superior and 1% more efficient in forward passing, and 1 point a game better in scoring than all-time league records in these departments made a year ago.

in scoring than all-time league records in these departments made a year ago.

Washington leads in scoring with 113 points and forward passing with 53 completions in 89 tosses for 59%. Even the Chicago Cardinals, boasting the best pass defense of only 32% completed against them, had 62% completed against them by the uncanny aerial wizardry of Sammy Baugh and Frank Filchock last Sunday.

The other three forward passing leaders—Philadelphia, Cleveland and Green Bay—are also in the running for possible shattering of the major league standard of 127 completions in an Eleven game schedule. Philadelphia and Green Bay are one completion a game above the average ard Clevelnd is even with its average which set the record las' season. Philadelphia and Cleveland are tied in passing efficiency with 43%. A total of 371 completions out of 897 tosses by the ten teams in the circuit brings the league passing efficiency up to 41%.

Green Bay has taken second place in scoring with 99 points, while Brooklyn moved up to third place with 78 points. Green Bay continues to lead in ground gaining with a 332 yard average. It is the first time in league history that Brooklyn has been among the first three in scoring.

Leemans Moves Up on Leaders

TUFFY LEEMANS, ace running back of the New York Giants, is now only a few yards behind Banks McFadden, Dodgers rookie ball carrier from Clemson, in the race for ground gaining honors in the National Football League. Leemans has gained 211 yards as against 239 yards for McFadden although Tuffy as you know only plays about half a game under the Giants two team system.

Whizzer White is not far behind either. In fact, only seven yards behind Leemans in third place but these three backs are the only ball carriers of the circuit who have piled up over 200 yards. Two other Giants backs, Eddie Miller and Walt Nielsen, are among the leaders however having gained over 100 yards apiece in four games.

Leemans in addition to his fine ground gaining record is setting a new standard in passing for himself. Tuffy has completed 11 in 20 for a 55% mark in efficiency, a mark surpassed only by Sammy Baugh who tops the league's passers. The Redskins ace is well on his way to a new aerial mark having completed 40 in four games out of 57 attempted to gain 556 yards. Baugh and Cecil Isbell of Green Bay have each completed five passes for touchdowns.

Ward Cuff is in the thick of the race for high scoring honors and is also among the leaders in his specialty of field goal kicking. The Giants back, who has led the league in place kicking the past two seasons, has kicked three field goals. Armand Niccolai of the Pittsburgh Steelers and Clarke Hinkle, Green Bay veteran, have each kicked four to top Cuff by one however. Niccolai's boot from the 48 yard line against the Giants in Pittsburgh is the longest of the season.

Cuff in addition to his field goal kicking has scored 20 points which gives him fifth place in point getting behind Jimmy Johnston of the Redskins, Don Looney of Philadelphia and Carl Mulleneaux, Green Bay end, all of them tied at 24 points from four touchdowns.






