



COACH OF THE STORMERS



STEVE OWEN

STEVE OWEN, coacn of the Syracuse Stormers, is beginning his thirty-ninth year in pro football. He broke into the pro ranks with the New York Giants in 1925 and was captain of the champion Giant juggernaut of 1927.

Steve became coach of the Giants in 1930 and in the next 23 years his teams won over 60 per cent of their games. His Giants captured eight division titles and two world championships and Stout Steve was twice named NFL "coach of the year."

Owen left the Giants after the 1953 season, stayed out of the game a year and then went to Baylor as defensive coach. He spent two years on the coaching staff of the Philadelphia Eagles and has since coached in the Canadian League at Calgary, Toronto and Regina. Just last year he was named Canadian "coach of the year" for steering the Saskatchewan Roughriders into a playoff berth.

In trying to build up a new team at Syracuse, Steve is tackling one of his toughest assignments but there's no other person in the game today with more contacts than the head coach and general manager of the Stormers.







JOHN (JACK) JOSEPH MORTON

COACHES

John (Jack) Joseph Morton, the head coach of the Grand Rapids Blazers returns to this post after a one year's absence. In 1961 Morton coached the Blazers, then the Shamrocks, to the championship of the United Football league with a record of eight victories, three losses and a single tie.

Morton's football career has been long and successful. It began 27 years ago on the high school playing fields of East St. Louis, Mo. It continued through the University of Missouri, Purdue, Alabama's famous Gray game, a shift at Great Lakes, the Chicago Tribune Collegiate All Stars game, a turn with the Chicago Bears, Los Angeles Dons, and the Buffalo Bills. In coaching, Morton has had berths at DePaul University, Indiana, Toledo, 'J and Marquette up to the time this institution gave up football. Morton then turned to the pros again becoming the head coach at Grand Rapids in the UBL.

The Grand Rapids coach, a strong worker for youth activities, at present is a Grand Rapids resident and a teacher of the handicapped at the Kent County Occupational Training center.

A strong defense and fleet attack is the Morton philosophy for winning football. To that end he has accumulated a squad of big men, tall and sturdy and a backfield of the fleetest he can find.

Charles F. (Chuck) DeSHANE

Charles F. (Chuck) DeShane, the Grand Rapids Blazers line coach is a thorough Grand Rapids product. He was born in the Furniture City and when he became big enough to play football, that was in 1936, 37 and 38, he was a strong player for Creston High School under the tutelage of veteran coach Martin VanWingen.

DeShane went from Grand Rapids to the campus of the University of Alabama to play under the famous Frank Thomas. He earned letters and high commendation at Alabama so much so that the Detroit Lions looked him over, drafted him and then kept him on the payroll as an active player for five years. Then DeShane returned to Grand Rapids where he has been ever since.

When the United Football League came to Grand Rapids in 1961 DeShane immediately found himself a berth.

TED NICOLLETTE

Winning is the only aim of Ted Nicollette, the backfield coach of the Grand Rapids Blazers. At present Ted is the head basketball coach at Grand Rapids Union High where he succeeds the great Maynard (Doc) Ellingson, retired.

Ted's duties with the Blazers is coaching the backfield, a job that is particularly important to the 1963 pros. Ted broke into the pro

game in 1961 with Jack Morton.

Nicollette is a Grand Rapids product, having graduated from Central High school and attending Western Michigan university. Upon graduating there, Nicollette was engaged by Bronson High School where in the span of five years, he coached 18 teams to 14 championships, a record there.
