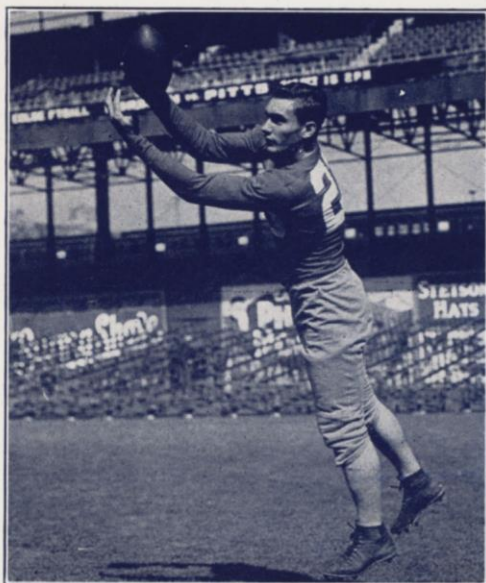

# Jim Poole Still All-League End in His Fifth Year

We sing today of Mr. James Poole, the gentleman from Mississippi. The seasons roll into professional football history, and Poole keeps telling Father Time to get away from him. For, like fine old vintage wine, Jim improves with age. This is his fifth year with the Giants, with whom he has spent his entire professional career—to date. He certainly has many another season before him.

Poole is 26 years of age and makes his home at Gloster, Miss. He tips the beam at a mere 235 pounds, stands 6 feet 3 in height, and landed at the Polo Grounds with the acclaim of Southern experts, who had picked him as all-America end.

Poole starred at Mississippi for three years, beginning with 1934, and after his graduation in 1936, came to Steve Owen. Jim's brother

is following in his footsteps in varsity competition, and is a hero at Mississippi.

Poole has been all-National League end for two years and is one of the greatest wings seen in professional football. In college, Jim was a basketball and baseball player as well as a gridiron Titan. Baseball still is one of his big loves, for during the Summer he plays it professionally. He is no big leaguer, but keeps busy, and in shape, down around his home country.

There is no chink in Poole's football armor. He is a great end on defense, and a marvel on attack. The scoring records show that he has turned in 18 points this season. That means he has scored three touchdowns. When it comes to snaring passes, James is par excellence.

## GIANTS, 19; DODGERS, 3; THREE TIES IN SERIES

**T**HE Dodgers will come into the Polo Grounds December 7 with the record of having beaten the Giants only thrice in a series of 26 contests dating back to 1926. However, Brooklyn has taken two straight from Owen's outfit, having won by 14 to 6 in the second meeting of 1940, and 16 to 13 early this year. 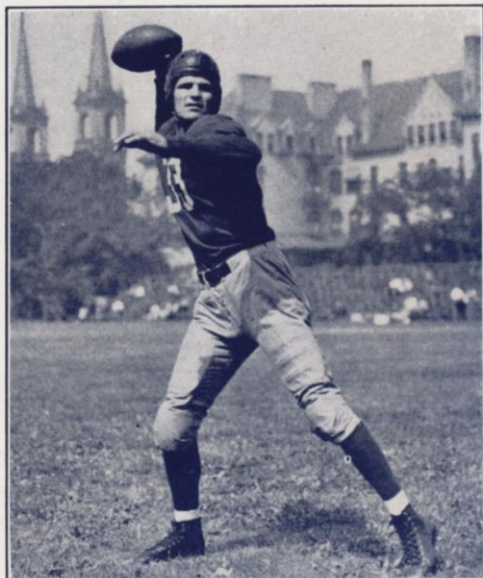

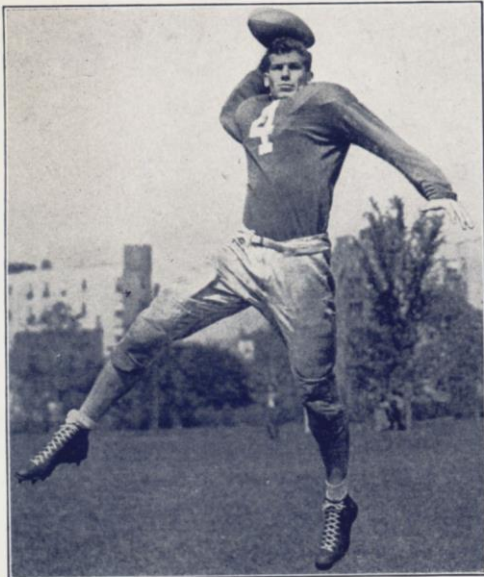

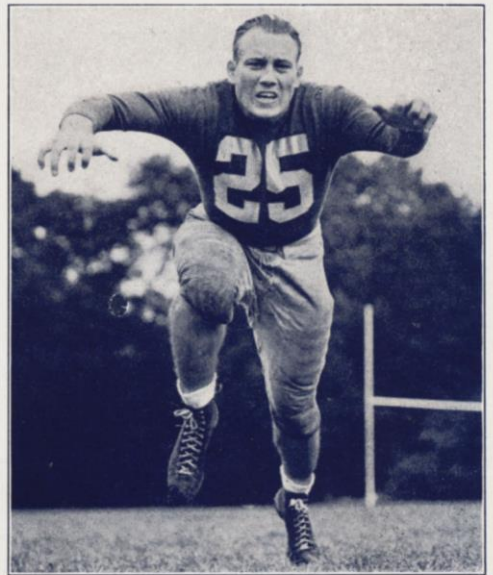


**ACE PARKER, Great Back**

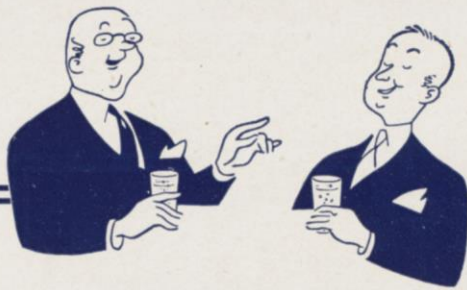
