

Giants of 1942 Good Amalgam of Veteran Skill and Rookie Fire

THE Giants of 1942 have had their vicissitudes. They lost a lot of key men to the service, and it has taken a little time to incorporate new men into the machine, and teach them the system under which Steve Owen operates. Owen is rated the greatest defense coach in the National League, and his record will bear out the contention that defense is not his only virtue. Steve knows football and his elevens year after year demonstrate his high skill and gridiron acumen.

On the cover of this programme you find a picture of Steve Blozis, one of Owen's rookies of the 1942 Giants. This Blozis man pretty well fills the cover, doesn't he? In fact, the engraver who made the cut complained that he had had trouble making Blozis fit.

Blozis is Owen's right tackle. Steve learned the football business at Georgetown. He weighs a mere 248 pounds. Give or take five on that. He stands a measly 6 feet 6 inches in height, and is 23.

In college, Blozis made himself an enviable reputation as an all-around athlete. He set all sorts of records for the shot put. Those metal pellets were like pills in the mighty fist of the great Blozis.

On this page you see a neat picture of one Hank Soar. The seasons come and the

seasons go, and Hank soars right on. He came to the Giants virtually unheralded and unsung six seasons back, from Providence College. While other coaches looked for more glamour, Owen grabbed Mr. Soar—and what a grab it turned out to be! Soar is 27 years of age, weighs 218 and stands 6 feet in height.

The veteran contingent on the New York club is headed by Mel Hein, the center, one of the greatest players seen in that position since football was devised. Hein is playing his twelfth year for Owen, is 33, weighs 232, stands 6 feet 4, and landed in New York from Washington State. He still is out there most of the afternoon.

Second in seniority among the Giants is Leland Shaffer, the back, who is in his eighth season with Owen. Then there is the seven-year-man Tuffy Leemans, now ready to return after a layoff with a head injury suffered in the game with the Chicago Bears.

There are three six-year veterans on the Giants—Ward Cuff, Soar and Jim Howell. Five-year men are Will Walls and Frank Cope. The threes are Al Owen, Dom Principe, Bill Edwards and Harry Kline.

There are no fewer than 19 first-year players. Look them over. They are an impressive lot.


The Giants indicate that they will bear close watching for the rest of the way. Here is what they have done to date:


