



HEAD COACH R. E. "DICK" HANLEY

When Richard E. ("Dick") Hanley came to Evanston, Illinois, in the Fall of 1927 to take over the coaching of Northwestern University's football team, he found a desolate picture confronting him. Prior to Hanley's advent on the campus they had defeated Minnesota only once in the 20th Century; they had not enjoyed a win over Zuppke of Illinois in fifteen seasons; they had never beaten Ohio and, worse still, had never scored a touchdown against the Buckeyes; the Evanstonian team had defeated Wisconsin but once in Big Ten (it was then, son) history; and they had won but one inter-sectional football game; that, against Missouri in 1915. The only bright thing on Hanley's horizon was the new Stadium. But it, too, had its dark side with a debt of \$1,650,000.00 yet to be paid off.

Then came Dick Hanley. In nine seasons Hanley won two Big Ten championships (1930-31); he signed a longterm contract with Notre Dame; he brought to Evanston Tulane from the South and Stanford from the West and Dartmouth from the East. He created six All-Americans of unchallenged distinction: Frank Baker, Dallas Marvel, Jack Riley, "Pug" Rentner, "Reb" Russell and "Red" Woodworth. In addition, Hanley found time to run eight coaching schools in as many seasons, and he originated the first "All-Star" game when he coached a team of Western Conference Stars which played a team coached by Howard Jones of Southern California and a group of Pacific Coast stars, at Soldier Field in 1933. The following year Hanley was made defensive coach of the Chicago Tribune's first All-Star team which held the mighty Chicago Bears, with "Red" Grange as captain, to no first downs. Prior to his debut in "Big Ten" circles Hanley had been winning national fame with his teams from the Haskell Indian Institute.

When World War II came along "Dick" went back to his favorite service, the Marines, in which he had served in the original World War. In 1944-45 Lt. Colonel "Dick" Hanley was given the responsibility of organizing and coaching the mighty El Toro Marine football teams which played thirty games, losing two and tieing one. Many of these fighting Marines are now members of Hanley's Chicago Rockets football squad.



COACH ERNIE NEVERS

Twenty-three years ago there came across the tips of the Rockies a shadow overcast upon the football world in such immensity that it nearly dwarfed all before it. Not until that shadow had reached eastward to the orange and blue sunsets around the campus of Illinois University did that shadow meet another burst of light that flew upwards and lit again the skies. Then the two became one, and together they dominated all of football for a trio of years.

The shadow from west of the Rockies was caused by football's greatest fullback, Ernie Nevers, of Stanford. The burst of brilliant light that met and merged with the shadow from the Pacific was Illinois' own immortal "Red" Grange. Today Ernie Nevers is Chief Assistant to Head Coach "Dick" Hanley of the Chicago Rockets.

Ernie Nevers was contemporary with Illinois' "Galloping Ghost." Both played during the 1923-24-25 seasons. Grange made the last Walter Camp "All-Time All-American Football team," and so did Nevers. Both were All-Conference selections in their trio of competing years. Nevers was an All-American selection in his senior year, 1925. He was also, like Grange, captain that year. Grange made All-American selections for his three years of college competition; but Nevers improved with the years and lasted longer in professional football than did Grange. Both made All-Time All-Professional All-American Teams—Grange for his work with the old Chicago Bears and Nevers for his playing with the Chicago Cardinals.

Nevers was a baseball pitcher and so good at the mound that he played two seasons with the St. Louis Browns in the American League. Football was his greatest love and his career saw him coaching the Duluth Esquimos (1926-27), Lafayette College, Iowa University, the University of Stanford. He also coached the Chicago Cardinals for several of their best seasons back in memory.

His acquisition by the Chicago Rockets rounded out Head Coach R. E. "Dick" Hanley's coaching staff to a completion unequalled anywhere else in professional football.

HIRSCH, ELROY LEON . . . 23 yrs. . . Halfback . . . 6 feet 2 . . 190 . . LEWIS, ERNEST CLAYTON . . . 22 yrs. . . . Fullback . . . 6 feet 1 . . . 215 . . Colorado University. Ernie, sometimes known as "Tiny," Lewis comes to the Rockets from Swink, Colorado, where he made his football debut. While in high school, where so few men enrolled that they had to play "touch," Tiny was lettered 4 years in football, basketball and track, and was captain of all three besides being class president in his senior year. It was at Colorado University that Lewis and teammate Walter Clay made history as the "Touchdown Twins." After his college career was interrupted by the War, Ernie's two years with the Marine Corps saw him as combat training instructor with a sergeant's rating at time of discharge. He also spent a season with the El Toro Marines as ace fullback often displaying his kicking prowess, especially one rainy day when he punted 88 yards with the ball going out-of-bounds on the 1-yard line. In addition Ernie has won countless honors in discus and shotput.

has won countless honors in discus and shotput.

MATHEWS, NED A. . . . 28 yrs. . . . 5 feet 10 . . . 192 . . . U.C.L.A. '41. With 10 years of gridiron experience back of him, Ned spells trouble for Rocket opponents. Starting at a Los Angeles High as full and quarterback, Ned and teammates were undefeated City Champs for 2 years. Then during 3 years on varsity teams at U.C.L.A., which won Pacific Coast championship in '39, Ned was lettered 3 yrs., was named captain and Most Valuable Player in 1940, made All-Coast, and was mentioned on several All-American teams. Switching to right half position New was signed up by the Detroit Lions for 3 years, playing stellar football, as evidenced by his returning a kickoff 98 yards against Phil-Pitt in '43, for the longest return in the National League. The following year Mathews entered the Army and served 15 months as a Sergeant with a Service Command Unit. During this time he starred on two teams; Fort MacArthur, and the Hollywood Rangers. 2nd highest scoring team in the nation, playing 25 games in 1944, two a week. With the Rangers Ned carried the ball 65 times in 6 games for 715 yards, and scored 10 touchdowns. After his discharge he rejojned the Lions in '45, but was traded to the Boston Yanks and fipished the season with them. Coaching is his life's ambition. Is married, has two daughters, lives in Inglewood, Calif.
