

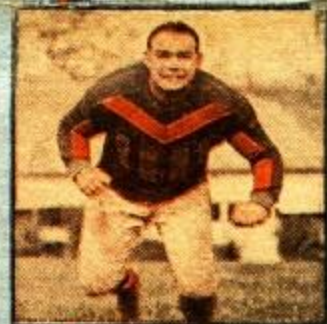
**MELVIN "MEL" HEIN**

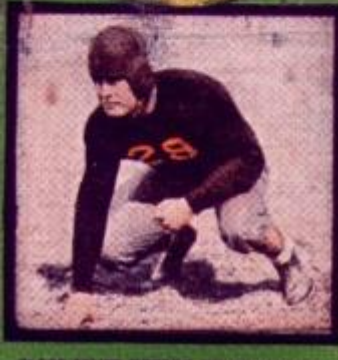

**JOHN (Shipwreck) KELLY**

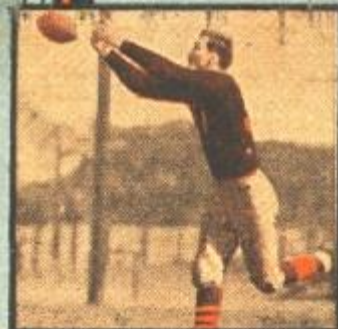
