



#### LAMBEAU'S STAFF

DON HUTSON, football's greatest stylist and holder of a dozen and a half major league records, more than any other man who ever played the game, has been identified with the Green Bay Packers for thirteen years, eleven as a player and two as assistant coach. As a player he is the only man to win the National League's most valuable player award twice, having been chosen by an overwhelming majority in 1941 and 1942, and barely missing the award in 1943 and 1944. He handles the ends, passers and pass defense.

WALTER KIESLING has been in the National league as a player and coach for 22 seasons. Coming up as a guard in 1926 from St. Thomas College (Minn.), Kiesling played with the Duluth Eskimos, Pottsville Maroons, Chicago Cardinals, the Chicago Bears and finally the Packers in 1936. Thereafter he served as assistant coach and later head coach of the Pittsburgh Steelers. His Steelers in 1942 came within a hair of winning the eastern division championship. In 1945 he returned to the Packers as line coach.

BO MOLENDA was a member of the Packers' world championship teams in 1929, 1930, and 1931 coming to Green Bay after a season of preparatory work with Red Grange's New York Yankees. At Michigan in 1925 and 1926, he was the varsity full-back on Michigan's Big Ten championship teams. From Green Bay, he went to New York to finish his playing career with the Giants and later became backfield coach for the Giants, a position he surrendered to enter the service. After 45 months in the Navy, he was signed by Coach Curly Lambeau as backfield assistant.





No. 82 - Left Guard - Indiana U.

Height, 6'6". Weight, 233. Born in Chicago, Ill., Sept. 20, 1921. First year with Packers. Jewish. Considered by Bo McMillen as one of his greatest players. Member of North-South team in 1945. Also member of 1945 and 1946 Chicago All-Star teams. In 1945 Chicago All-Star game he played 45 minutes against the Packers. Pi Lambda Phi fraternity man. Has B.S. degree in physical education. Served in Infantry as Corporal for 33 months during the war. Single.

#### CHARLES J. "Charlie" BROCK (Capt.) No. 29 — Center — U. of Nebraska

Height, 6'2½". Weight, 210. Born in Columbus, Neb., March 15, 1916. Ninth season with Packers. Charlie, one of the top centers of all time, is known throughout football as the game's cleverest "ball thief". This will be his fourth year as captain of the Packers. Of English descent. Hobby is golf. Off season, Charlie operates a sporting goods store in Columbus, Neb. All-American and All-Big Six in 1937 and 1938. Member of 1939 West shrine team and Chicago All-Star squad. Lettered twice in track. Captain of Nebraska, West team, and Chicago All-Stars in 1939. Phi Gamma Delta fraternity man. Has B.A. degree in physical education. Married and has three children.

#### ANTHONY R. "Tony" CANADEO No. 3 — Left Halfback — Gonzaga U.

Height, 5'11". Weight, 190. Born in Chicago, Ill., May 5, 1919. This will be Tony's sixth season with the Green Bay Packers ... Top runner, good passer, and good kicker, Tony has proven himself a valuable man ... achieved little All-American fame in 1940. Served in Central European theater for one year during the war ... Has B.S. degree in history ... Married and makes his home in Green Bay ... Has one son, Robert.

#### RAYMOND G. "Ray" CLEMONS

No. 46 — Left Guard — St. Mary's College (Cal.)

Height, 5'10". Weight, 200. Born in Roseville, Cal., April 2, 1921. First year with Packers. Captain of the St. Mary's College eleven last year. Led team in the Oil Bowl victory over Georgia Tech... Of Hungarian descent. Likes to fish and hunt. Member of 1947 Chicago All-Star squad. Has B.S. degree in physical education. Married and has two children.

#### EDWARD J. "Ed" CODY No. 17 — Fullback — Purdue U.

Height, 5'9". Weight, 190. Born in Newington, Conn., Feb. 27, 1923. First year up with the Packers after making quite a reputation in Big Ten circules. . Was a member of the East team in 1947 and started at fullback. . Also a member of the 1947 Chicago All-Star squad. . Achieved All-American and All-Big Ten recognition in 1945. . Member of Tulsa's Orange Bowl and Oil Bowl temas of 1945 and 1946, respectively... Made two letters in basketball and track... Has B.S. degree in mathematics... Served in Army Medical Corps for 16 months during the war... Single.

#### IRVING H. "Irv" COMP, JR. No. 51 — Left Halfback — St. Benedict's College

Height, 6'2½". Weight, 205. Born in Milwaukee, Wis., May 17, 1919. Fifth season with Packers... Of English descent... Besides being a good all-around football player, he excels in basketball, baseball, and is a track man... On first team Little All-American in 1942... Captain of football and basketball teams his senior year in college... Has B.S. degree in biology and physical education... Married and has two children.

#### LARRY G. "Superman" CRAIG No. 54 — Left End — U. of South Carolina

Height, 6'1". Weight, 218. Born in Six Mile, S.C., June 27, 1916. Ninth season with Packers. Considered tops as a blocking back, Craig will be playing his old college position of left end exclusively this season. Used as a left end on defense only in the past. Of Scotch-Irish descent. Achieved All-American recognition in 1936. Also three letters in track and boxing while in college. Has Bachelor of Philosophy degree from college. Married and has three children.

#### RALPH G. "Corby" DAVIS No. 66 — Right Guard — U. of Wisconsin

Height, 5'11". Weight, 205. Born in Seymour, Wis., May 30, 1922. First year with Packers. Played regular right guard for Wisconsin in 1946. Of German-Irish descent. Hobby is fishing and hunting. Delta Kappa Epsilon fraternity man. Has B.S. degree in physical education. Served in the Navy for three and a half years. Single.

#### ROBERT D. "Bob" FORTE No. 8 — Right Halfback — U. of Arkansas

Height, 6'. Weight, 195. Born in Lake Village, Ark., July 15, 1922. Second season with the Packers after a great first year ... Besides being a fine offensive back, Forte's defensive play matched that of any player in the league ... Also a good thind baseman in baseball... Hobby is fishing and hunting ... All Southwestern back in 1942... Also captain of Arkansas's football team in 1942... Has B.S. degree in physical education ... Lieutenant in the Army tank battalion during the war ... Served two years in European theater ... Has three battle stars ... Single.






