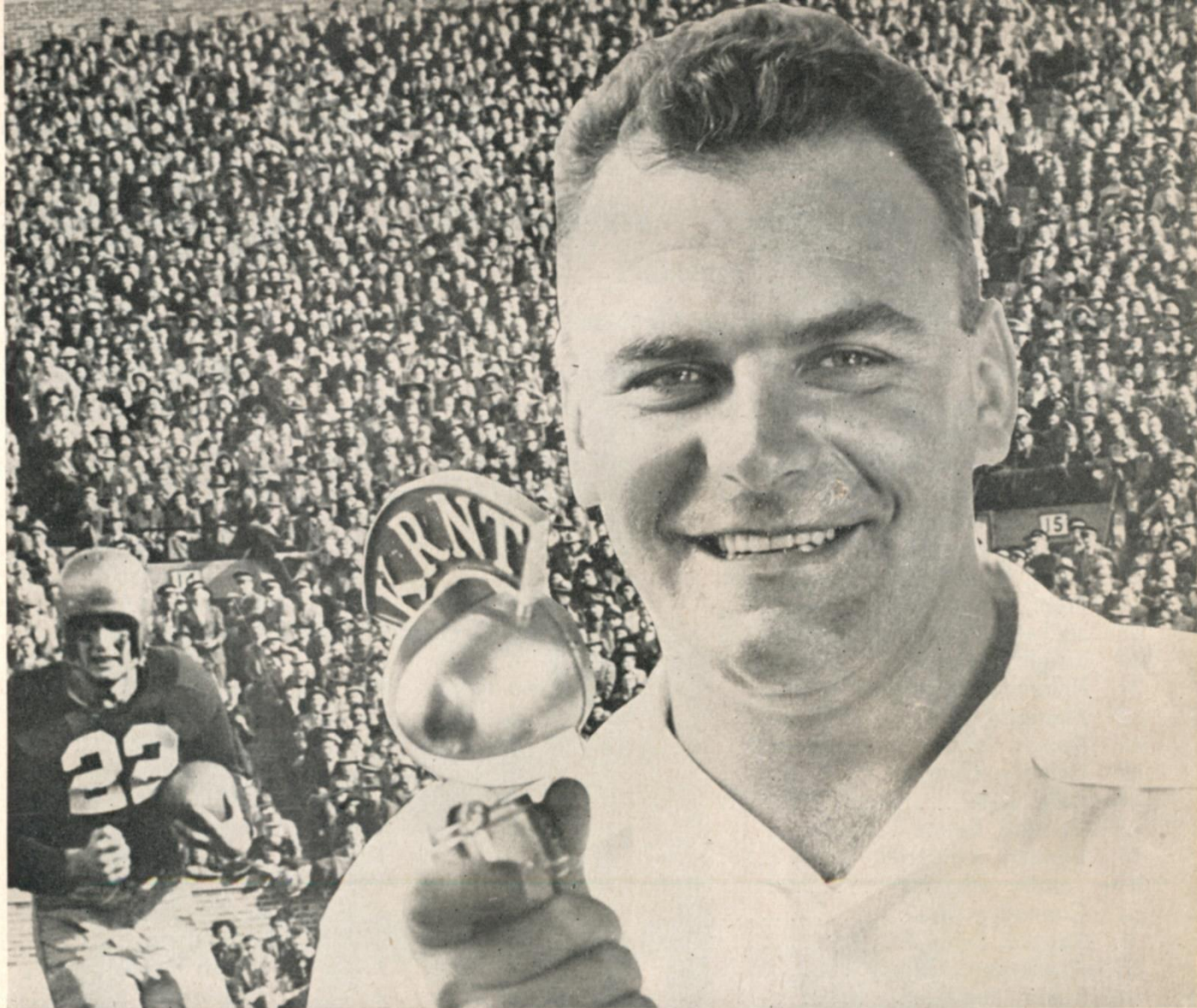

Steve Owen

HEAD COACH, GIANTS

He's been a Giant for 27 years — first as a tackle, and as coach since 1931. Since he first saw the sights of New York in 1926 as a member of the Kansas City Cowboys, Owen has lost none of the characteristic zest and humor he carried under a 10-gallon hat he wore from his native Oklahoma. Steve teaches the everlasting kind of football, based on hard block and tackle, quick-thinking, precision, and eagerness. He has demonstrated his resourcefulness with the highly effective "umbrella" pass defense and with startling high-scoring shifts from a basic T formation to his A-formation single wing. Born in 1898, he first played football at Phillips U. in Enid, Okla., in 1918. He was captain and tackle of the great Giant team of 1927 which allowed 13 opponents a total of 20 points for an all-time record.

Joe Bach

HEAD COACH, STEELERS

He's best remembered as one of Notre Dame's "Seven Mules." This broad-shouldered gentleman of 51 years signed to skipper the Steelers Dec. 18, 1951 — the second time in 17 years to win the Pittsburgh nomination. He served as headmaster in 1935 as the club started its third season. He stayed two seasons before returning to collegiate coaching, and that last season the team lost the title in the final game. He's starting his 28th year of coaching. He was head coach at St. Bonaventure the last two seasons. A native of Tower, Minn., Bach started his coaching career at Syracuse U. He succeeded an old teammate, Elmer Layden as coach at Duquesne U., Pittsburgh, in 1929. Joe gave the Dukes one of the two strongest teams in the school's history. From 1937 through 1941 Bach was head coach at Niagara U, and 1942 found him chief tutor of the Fort Knox Army eleven. In 1943 he returned to the pros, spending tours at Detroit, Boston and New York.
