# EMOTION MAKES A DIFFERENCE

Paul Brown and the members of his coaching staff would be the first to admit they are in a pretty complicated business. The modern pro game calls forth a maze of moves and counter moves, a constant shifting of defensive and offensive alignments.

They can discuss its intricacies with the detachment of architects at the drawing board.

But the technical approach can offer a distorted picture—as Brown would be the first to admit. Football is still, as it always was, a game of emotions. It is decided on the field and not on the drawing board. Hot-eyed defensive linemen can still punch holes in man's best laid offensive plans.

There are numerous factors that can contribute to a team's mental attitude. Take today's clash between the Browns and the New York Giants.

#### **BROWNS-GIANTS SITUATION**

The Browns could be caught in an emotional downdraft after clinching their divisional title last week. Unconsciously, they could show a tendency to conserve their energies for the title game ahead.

On the other hand, they are facing their arch rival in the eastern division, a team that has held them even in eight games and handed them their only pro shutout. They have a winning streak of 10 games and they are proud men. Over the years, this team has written numerous "firsts." An undefeated season in the National Football League would add another—and their greatest—"first."

The Giants are involved with an entirely different situation. They come here with, for them, an undistinguished record. In the past, they have made virtually a crusade of beating the Browns. They scout the Browns more thoroughly than does any other team.

By beating the Browns, on top of their upset over the Eagles last week, the Giants could add some lustre to a drab season.

How will the teams react to their challenges?

The coaches don't know. Even the players can't tell. The answer will come on the field.

#### SPIRIT KEY TO UPSETS

The emotional intangibles are hard to measure but they are the only explanation for some of the scores in the NFL record book.

Last season a good Giants team took on a mediocre Steeler team in Pittsburgh. On the form chart it made no sense, but the Steelers won that one, 63-7. Then, on the final day of the season, the supposedly battered Giants bounced off the floor to beat the Browns, 37-34.

One of the most memorable contests in the team's history resulted when the Browns were caught with their emotions down against the New York Yanks back in 1947. They went into that game, just as they enter today's, with their division title wrapped up.

Led by the incomparable Spec Sanders, the Yanks caught fire. They smashed their way to a 28-7 halftime lead. Brown speaks of his "proud" players who "flare up when they get in trouble." They flared up that day, with nothing at stake but their pride, and battled to a 28-28 deadlock.

They are all there on the records, game after game in which inspired teams accomplished what they had no right to accomplish. In fact, you need look back no farther than last week when it took a 17-point rally in the final quarter for the unbeaten Browns to get past the victoryless Chicago Cardinals.

The Giants have been up and down this season but they still have plenty of equipment. They boast some great defensive stars in Tackle Arnie Weinmeister, Linebacker John Cannady, Backs Emlen Tunnell and Frank Gifford; some first-rate offensive weapons in Quarterback Charley Conerly, Halfbacks Kyle Rote and Sonny Grandelius and Fullback Eddie Price.

If the Browns are to win their 11th straight, it may well boil down to a matter of emotions.

#### HOWARD BRINKER

Brink is the newest member of the Brown coaching staff.

Brinker graduated from the Oxford, Ohio school in 1939. The next two football seasons he served at Massillon. In 1941 he moved to Steubenville as line coach, succeeding to the head coaching position the following year. He remained at Steubenville, winning 24 and losing 12 before his appointment to the Ohio University staff in 1949.

Brink joined the Browns last season after a 39 month stretch in the United States Infantry.

#### **BLANTON COLLIER**

A keen football student and diagnostician, Collier impressed head coach Paul Brown in 1945 while serving on Brown's staff at Great Lakes Naval Training Station. Starred at Georgetown (Ky.) College and coached with great success at Paris (Ky.) High School for 16 years before enlisting in Navy in 1943... Backfield Coach Cleveland Browns since 1946.

#### PAUL E. BROWN

Considered by most followers of modern football to be the foremost coach in the country. His overall record as a coach shows 213 victories, 9 ties and only 34 losses—and in professional football, starting with the Cleveland Browns in 1946, the record reads 83 wins, 3 ties and 13 defeats. He is not only the proud possessor of this amazing won-lost record but Paul Brown has captured the respect of the fans as a teacher and a tremendously good influence on the men he moulds into great football machines.

#### WILBUR "WEEB" EWBANK



Starred in football, basketball and baseball at Morton High, Richmond, Ind. Three sports star at Miami U. (Ohio)—1924-28... athletic director, head coach at Van Wert (Ohio) High School, 1928-29... member of Miami University coaching staff 1930-43... enlisted in Navy and later assisted Paul Brown at Great Lakes in football and coached basketball team, 1945-46. Assistant football, head basketball coach at Brown University, 1946. Head football coach at Washington University (St. Louis), 1947-48. Joined Browns as tackle coach in 1949.

#### FRITZ HEISLER

First came to attention of coach Paul Brown in autumn of '32, when, as a 135-lb. youngster, Heisler clinched regular job on Massillon High School team and starred in 1933 on one of school's super teams. Attended Miami University (Ohio), winning three football letters, starring as guard. Upon graduating, he returned to Massillon as assistant to Brown and moved to Ohio State with him in 1941.
