NEW COACH ...

NEW STYLE...

NEW YORK

Since the Cleveland Browns entered National Football League competition five years ago, they have found the New York Giants one of their most stubborn foes.

It was Steve Owen's team which handed Cleveland its first defeat in the initial season of 1950 and the Giants dished out another in the second meeting that fall. It wasn't until the playoff game for the Eastern Division title that the Browns finally came through with an 8-3 victory.

Now New York, which has a 4-4 record with Cleveland over regular season games for the past four years, comes into the stadium with a new coach, a new offense and somewhat changed personnel but still the same in the ruggedness department.

Jim Lee Howell, first new boss of the Giants since 1931, is no stranger to grid followers of the team from the Polo Grounds having been an outstanding end for the Giants before serving three years as assistant coach.

New York clubs of the past were more noted for stubborn defensive play than touchdown tendencies but Howell, product of the Southwestern Conference "aerial circus" days, already has made many changes.

"Where I come from we like to throw the ball around," Howell told reporters after his appointment last year. "We want to get the touchdowns."

To further step up the Giants' point production, Jim Lee got himself an attack-minded assistant in Vince Lombardi who gained renown as one of Fordham University's "Seven Blocks of Granite."

"He's on the style I like—daring," Howell explained in naming the former top assistant at Army as his first aide.

The pair have added some Split-T as adapted to professional football and have made some revolutionary changes in signal calling and blocking.

Howell has one of the most diversified backgrounds of any coach in professional football. In college he was both a basketball and football star and campus leader as well. Later he served as a state senator in his native Arkansas and as a Marine company commander and was branching out as a farming and ranching baron when the Giants called him back to football.

The 40-year-old coach played his collegiate football at Arkansas in the years when Sammy Baugh and Co. were putting the pass into the pigskin and the liking for the wide open style attack never left him. Standing six-four since his high school days, Howell has moved from "lanky" to "big" over the years, going from 167 pounds as a college freshman to his present 240.

In college, Jim was just as prominent in basketball as in football and developed superb coordination while practicing the cage sport, a talent which was to serve him so well as a pass receiver. The 1936 Razorbacks, captained by Howell, went to the Olympic finals before losing to an industrial team.

His collegiate football companions included such famed receivers as Jim Benton and Ray Hamilton and those fine pitchers of the pigskin—Dwight Sloan and Jack Robbins. Benton will be recalled by Cleveland fans for his pass receiving with the Cleveland Rams.

Along with a bumper crop of rookies, Howell came to the Giants in 1937. The following year that team won the championship in a 23-17 thriller with Green Bay and Howell had one of his brightest afternoons.

After his Pacific service, Howell came back to New York for three more seasons as a player and in 1949 was named end coach. That fall he also tutored the Wagner College squad on Staten Island to a 7-1 record, best in that small school's history.

Before the return to the Giants as head coach, Jim spent two years as a rice farmer and cattle raiser back in Arkansas. However, he is a full time football coach now with a home only a short drive from the Polo Grounds.

As the athletes and the politicians back in Arkansas and the Japs from Saipan to Okinawa found out previously, Howell is a worthy antagonist. National League coaches are in the process of making that discovery.




DICK **GALLAGHER**



COACHING STAFF

When Paul Brown returned to his native Massillon to become the high school's head football coach in 1932, one of his first-string ends was a 135-pounder named Fritz Heisler. Holding down the center position was Howard Brinker, while on the coaching staff of Canton McKinley High, Massillon's traditional rival, was Paul Bixler.

Today the quartet is together on the Cleveland Browns' staff, Brown as head coach and general manager, Heisler as guard coach and talent scout, Brinker as backfield and defensive coach and Bixler as end coach and scout.

A fifth member of the Browns' staff is Ed Ulinski, former Marshall College star, who played under Brown during the team's first four years in professional football competition, 1946 through 1949.

Brown has been one of the most successful coaches the game has ever known in all classes of competition. As he headed into this season, his 25th as a head mentor, Brown's amazing record revealed 224 victories against only 36 defeats and nine ties.


Brown's record in pro football has been fantastic. In eight seasons, playing in two leagues, his Browns have won 94, lost 15 and tied three, winning eight straight division championships and five league titles.

Heisler has been with Brown through much of his football career. He played for Paul in high school, then spent four years at Miami University of Ohio, after which he returned to Massillon as an assistant coach. He accompanied Brown to Ohio State, where he was named freshman coach. He has been separated from Paul for only three years, during the war years when he served as a lieutenant in the Navy's V-5 Cadet program.

Brinker also is a Miami graduate and served for two years as an assistant at Massillon High. But when Brown went to Ohio State, Brinker moved to Steubenville (O.) High School as line coach, taking over as head coach a year later. After spending four years in the Army, Brinker went to Ohio University, then joined the Browns three years ago as end coach and scout. He was shifted to backfield and defensive coach this season following the departure of Blanton Collier, now Kentucky's head mentor.

Bixler and Ulinski both are spending their first seasons with the Browns. Bixler brings a wealth of football experience into his assignment as end coach and scout. A native Ohioan, Bixler was an assistant to Brown at Ohio State, later became the Bucks' head coach, was head mentor at Colgate for five years and for the last two seasons was on the University of Pennsylvania staff.

Ulinski was an outstanding guard with the Browns, then went to Santa Clara University as line coach for three seasons. He was line coach at Purdue University last season and was called "home" by Brown last winter when Tackle Coach Weeb Ewbank moved to Baltimore as head coach of the Colts.
