

With Chuck, Ron and Tom, 'gainst Tobin and Bobby The Thrills Are a Cinch To Make Football Your Hobby!

Chuck Conerly . . . Bobby Layne . . . Tobin Rote . . . Don Heinrich . . . Tom Dublinski are passing specialists who figure to provide most of the fireworks in tonight's pre-season meeting between the Lions and the New York Giants.

Conerly, Layne, and Rote are all in the select circle of professional quarterbacks who have completed 100 or more touchdown passes during their respective careers. Conerly currently ranks as the third leading touchdown producer of all time with 134 in regular season play while Layne is only a step behind with 129 and Rote is closing in fast with 100. Take into account the record of Heinrich and Dublinski and you probably have the finest group of passers ever assembled on one field, outside of an all-star game.

But these "old pros" may have to turn the spotlight over to some eager rookie performers before the night is over. The Giants' Phil King of Vanderbilt and Don Maynard of Texas Western are sparkling runners who can provide a thrill a minute, and the Lions have a couple of exciting newcomes of their own in halfback Dan Lewis of Wisconsin and Ken Webb of Presbyterian

In other words, anything can happen . . . and it usually does . . . in pro football. Tonight's game, while listed as a pre-season game, could produce more action in 60-minutes than any other game on the schedule as approximately 88 players battle for 70 positions on two National Football League teams.

Both Jim Lee Howell of the Giants and George Wilson of the Lions want to win this game. In fact, they want to win them all. But, they also want to find out what new material they can look forward to having on their respective teams for 1958 so you'll see plenty of new names and faces in action tonight.

Both teams have won once and lost once before meeting here in Briggs Stadium. New York downed San Francisco, 19-10, then lost to Los Angeles, 38-10 Detroit was upset by the College All-Stars, and came back to defeat Cleveland last week, 17-7.

Last year, New York won a pre-season encounter 17-0 in the only meeting between the two teams. The Giants and Lions will be seeing each other again in '58, on Dec. 7 here in Detroit, in the home finale of the NFL season for the Lions.



MEET THE NEW LION ROOKIES

So. Carolina Aug. 20, 1931 CUNNINGHAM, LEON

Rugged eighth draft choice making second bid for spot with Lions . . . played part of 1955 season before going into service . . . has spent last two years in Army . . . All-Conference and All-American honors during 1954 season . . . member of college relay team in track . . . born in LaGrange, Ga. . . . resides in Atlanta, Ga. . . named player of the year in the Southern Conference in 1952 ... married, wife Margaret.

KOEPFER, KARL Bowling Green Oct. 7, 1934

Lions draft choice on the eighth round as part of trade with Pittsburgh . . . offensive guard prospect who scouts rate on par with veteran Ken Russell . . . two time All-American Conference choice . . . most valuable player at Bowling Green in '57 . . four year member of wrestling team . . . native of Swanton, Ohio . . . German descent . . . family includes wife, Bonnie Jean, and daughter Kristie.

Kentucky St. Aug. 26, 1932 MACKEY, HARRY D.

Free agent . . . earned All-Midwest Conference honors in 1955 . . . scored 14 touchdowns in one season and set school record for most yards gained on passes . . . born in Oklahoma City . . . resides now in Detroit . . . also competed in basketball and track . . . married, wife, Vivian.

MARAZZA, RICHARD Clemson 24 Yrs. Old

Back for his second shot with the Lions . . . drafted as a "redshirt" in 1956 and reported last year . . . one of the last players dropped before '57 season got underway . . . coaches feel he has potential to become fine offensive lineman . . . former All-Conference lineman.

Eastern Kentucky 25 Yrs. Old

Nineteenth draft choice who is making his second bid for spot with Lions . . . tabbed in 1955 . . . impressed coaches with his speed, desire, and hustle . . . outstanding tackler . . . has been in U. S. Army for past two years . . . played service football . . . recommended originally by Glenn

Presnell, former Lion star, and Muller's coach at Eastern Kentucky . . . native of Amityville, N. Y.

Kansas State Aug. 13, 1936 PFEIFER, RALPH

Another highly regarded halfback prospect . . obtained on seventh round of draft as part of previous trade with San Francisco 49ers . . . runs 100-yard dash in :10.1 . . . gained 468 yards on 100 tries last year . . . All-Big Seven choice . . . native of Hays, Kansas . . . played in 1957 Blue-Gray game . . . led Kansas State in pass receiving last year . . . will get real chance to show ability as Lions continue search for more running strength.

American Internat. Sept. 11, '34 RYCHLEC, THOMAS R.

Tough and rugged end brought back for second shot . . . coaches feel their No. 10 draft pick of '57 has fine chance of making grade . . . spent six months in service . . . led NCAA small college receivers with 40 catches for 353 yards in 1956 . . . caught 30 for 383 in '55 . . . good blocker and fine hands for "first down" type receiver . . . native of Meriden, Conn. . . . Polish descent . . . single.

Presbyterian Aug. 15, 1935 WEBB. KEN

May be the "sleeper" in camp . . . 14th draft choice after rushing for over 2,100 yards during college career . . . outstanding speed . . . Little All-American choice . . . native of Decatur, Ga. . . . caught ten passes in '57 and proved his allaround ability by kicking six of seven extra points . . . could help Lions if he can come through to bolster the rushing game.

WHITSELL, DAVID A. Indiana June 14, 1936

Selected as a "redshirt" on the 24th round but has decided to try for Lions team this year . . defensive prospect . . . has :09.8 clocking for hundred yard dash . . . earned three letters in football . . . native of Shelby, Mich. . . . German descent . . . competed in high school shot put and recorded 55' 6" mark . . . set high school basketball scoring mark of 45 points . . . single.
