There's Much To Be Thankful For

THE REDSKINS HAVE A DATE WITH THAT BIG GAME

Thanksgiving Day has a special meaning in the world of football. Not that football players aren't as thankful as the rest of us for the past year and not that they won't join us in over-eating. But since the Boys who die for Dear Old Rutgers started kicking a football around Thanksgiving has meant two things in football:

The Big game.

The All-American teams.

The Redskins always have participated in the latter through the annual National Football League College Player Draft. This is professional football's own All-American team or selections. And it's been held annually just after Thanksgiving.

This year it will be held in Chicago on Dec. 3—eight days from today.

It's impossible to over-emphasize the importance of this selection meeting. It's the great equalizer in the NFL. It's the reason a team like the Redskins or even the mighty

Green Bay Packers can go from the bottom to the top in the NFL in a few short years.

Because at this selection meeting all 14 NFL teams get the same number of selections—20. But they pick in reverse order: that is the bottom teams pick first; the top teams last. The League standings of next Sunday will be used as the guide line.

It readily can be seen that this system puts a maximum on organization and coaching. If the bottom clubs select intelligently their stay at the bottom will be short-lived.

Also, this selection means that all teams over the span of a few seasons, are even, talentwise. This is the fact that makes play in the NFL so fascinating and so thrilling—the evenness of competition.

Needless to say teams these days are spending far more money and time than they did in other days on this selection meeting. And their selections, whether or not they agree

WARPATH

A look at

next week's game . . .



It's the Eagles here next Sunday. Only a short year ago the Eagles were in the thick of the Eastern Division title scrap. Now they are in last place.

But they still remain one of the most colorful teams in the National Football League. And they can still score from any spot on the field.

Two things have happened to the Eagles. The first everyone realizes—injuries. First, they lost a brilliant offensive end Pete Retzlaff for seven weeks with a broken arm. Now they have Hopalong Cassidy out for the year with a fractured leg and lost their other top end Bobby Walston with a severe arm injury.

This means that all season long the Eagles have had only super star Tommy McDonald in top playing condition. Under such conditions, McDonald has been his usual amazing self. And the simple fact that he's still around makes the Eagles dangerous.

If the injuries to their offensive end crew wasn't enough, Philadelphia also has played the entire season without its best running back, Ted Dean.

Point two about this Eagle team is as well known as point one—instead of being one of the most talked-about clubs in the NFL, the Eagles now rank as the most talkative. As a result of all this chatter the Eagles for the past month have been a forgotten football team while columns of space in the newspapers have been dedicated to

what the Eagle players have been saying and doing off the field.

What all this means is that the Eagles are mighty disgusted with last place. It's an understandable feeling. Particularly since we agree with the rest of the NFL that the Eagles aren't a last place club. If they hadn't fallen victim to that injury hex they wouldn't be, either.

Teams are born anew in adversity, however, and the Eagles are a much better team today than they were the first time the Redskins played them in Philadelphia in October.

Going into today's game with

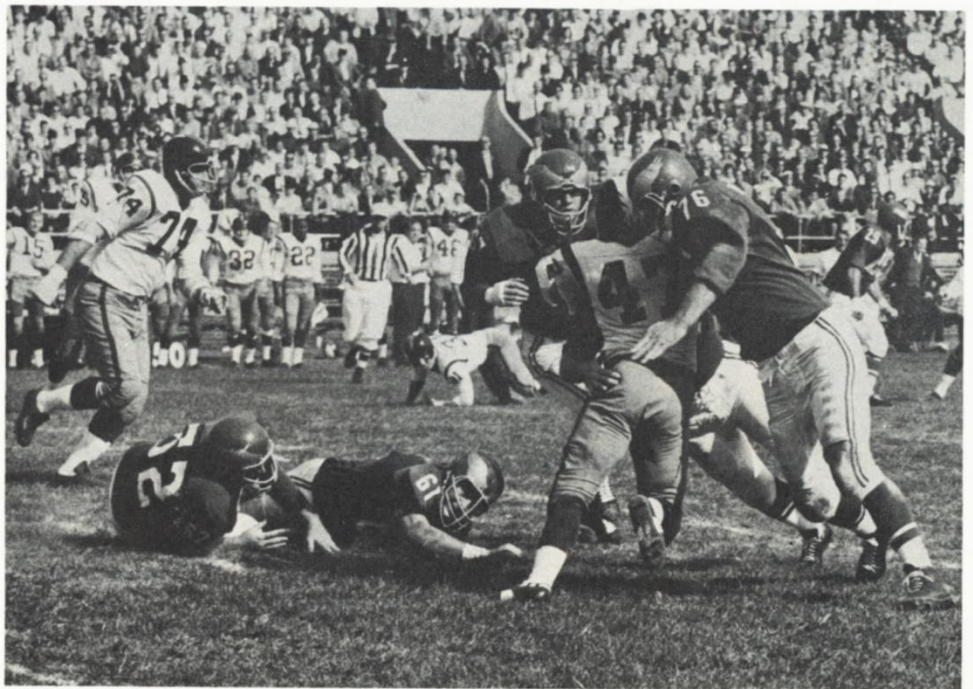
Dallas, despite their injuries, the Eagles had this to show for their last two games—a tie with Cleveland and a tough, five point loss to the Division-leading New Yorkers.

Any team that can play that well is in last place by misfortune, period.

If that isn't enough warning for the Redskins, this should be. Over the years the Redskins-Eagles series has been a nip-and-tuck affair. The Redskins built up a big lead in the early years, then the Eagles took over with their great team of the late 40's. Since then, things have been really give and take.

The overall record: The Redskins 23 victories; the Eagles 24 victories. Two games have ended in ties.

That's about as even as two teams can get after 26 years of play.

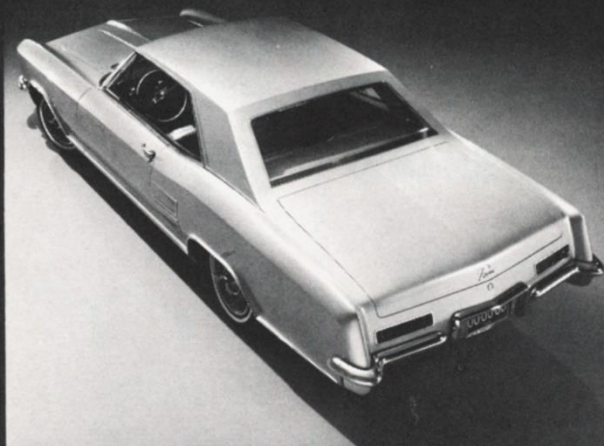
WRITERS HONOR ROOKIE

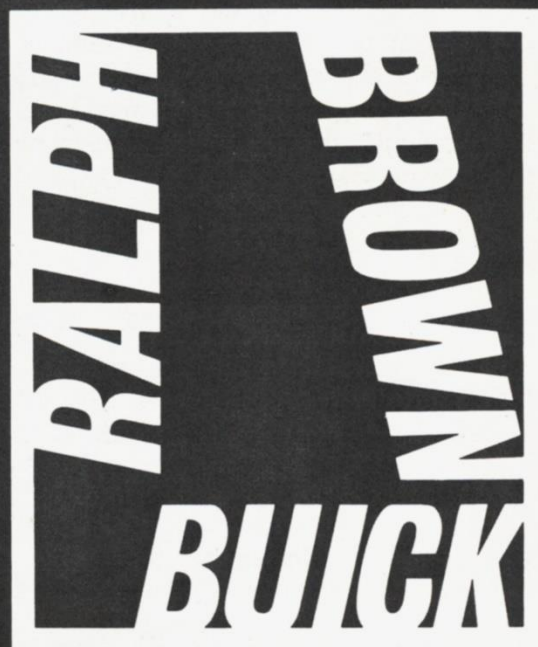
Allen also came up with a clutch fumble recovery. (See page 15.)

The Upper Deck seats will sell for their regular \$38.50 price — a saving of \$3.50 per ticket over single game prices.

THESE SEASON TICKET DISCOUNTS WILL BE IN EFFECT FROM the opening of the ticket sale through JUNE 30. FROM JULY 1 until the opening of the home season, season tickets may be purchased but only at the regular single-game prices.

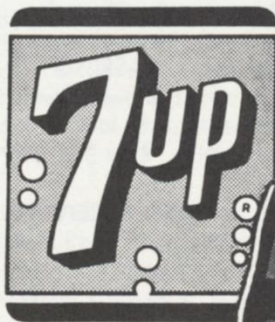

a quarterback's dream

When those linemen come charging through or those linebackers are on a rampaging red dog the quarterback's only out is one of the most interesting and deadly plays in football — the fullback swing pass.

Sometimes this play is called a check off because the fullback, after blocking one of the opponents, probably an end, checks off into the flat just in case the QB gets in trouble.

On the play shown on the opposite page, however, fullback Don Bosseler didn't fake the block but swung immediately into the flat and quarterback Norman Snead is shown throwing to him, just after completing a fake handoff to halfback Billy Barnes.

Many times the swing or check off is more accidental than anything else—a regular safety valve play. This is true because the minute a fullback realizes his quarterback is in trouble he, the fullback, will automatically start heading for the swing zone.

Against Cleveland two weeks ago Snead, while falling to the ground, saw Bosseler in the flat and tossed him an underhand pass that wound-up gaining 16 yards.

Whether it's planned or only partly-planned, the fullback swing pass is a thrilling play and one fans are certain to see a half dozen times in any game.

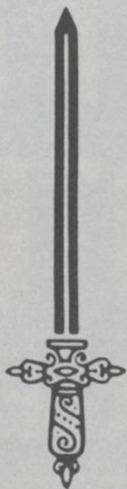

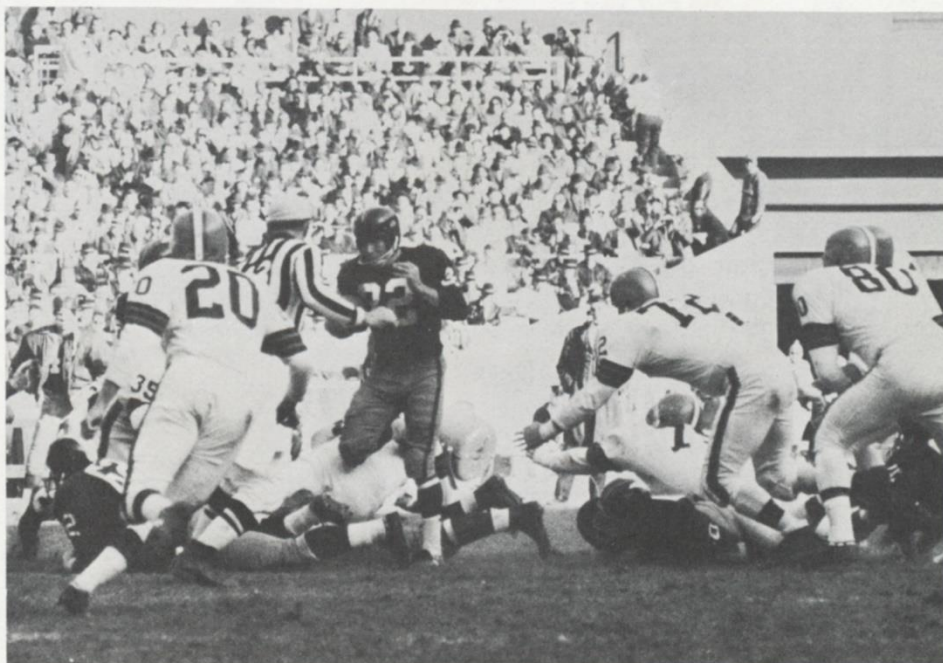
